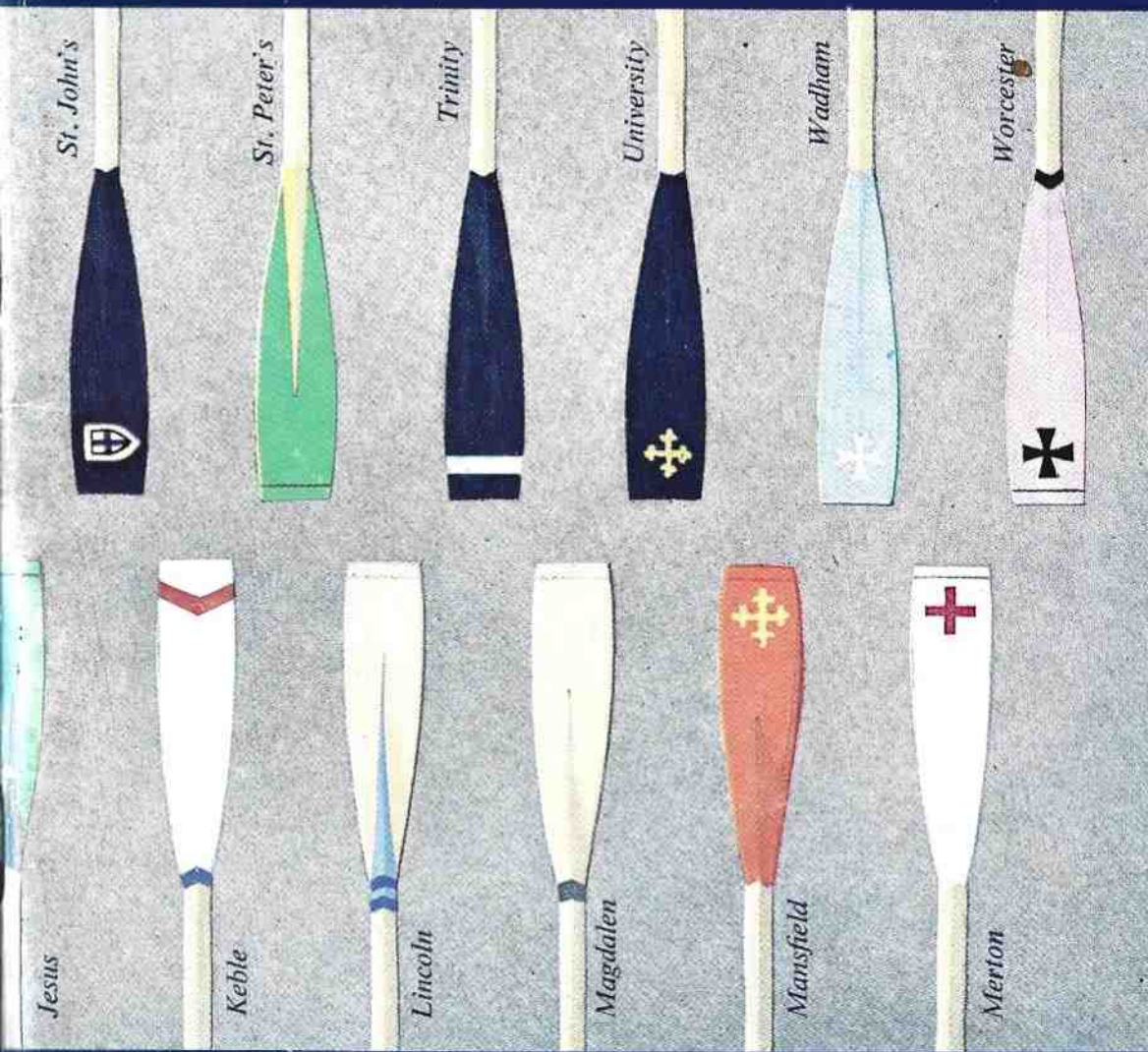

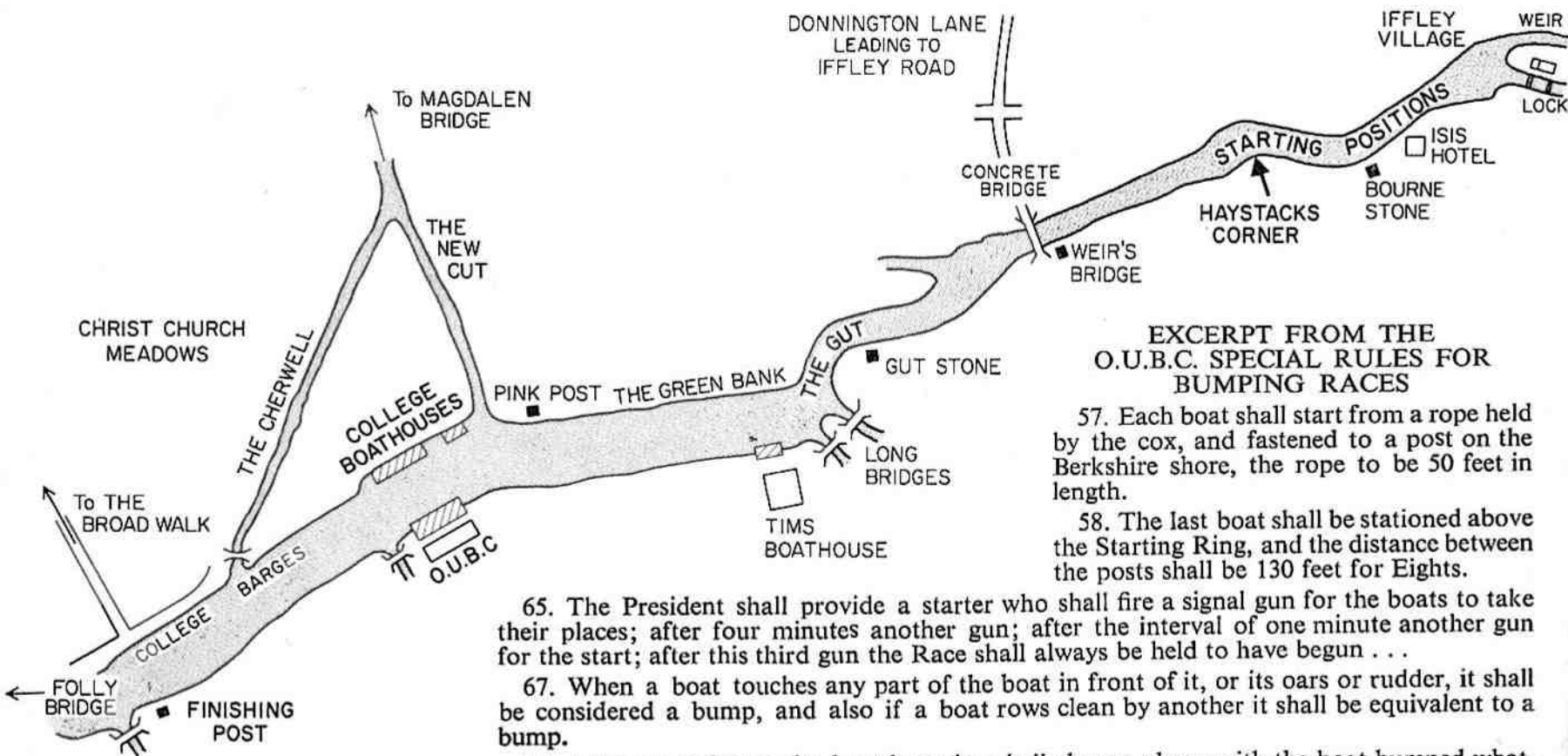

EXCERPT FROM THE O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR BUMPING RACES

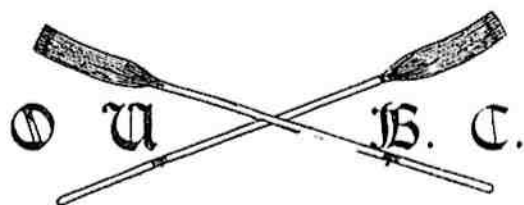
57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.

58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.

65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .

67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.

69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.

ROWING JARGON

There are many strange cries that can be heard from coxes and coaches as they harangue their crews. I shall endeavour to explain some of them for the benefit of those not acquainted with rowing jargon and ordeal, for the many oarsmen who by their lack of response, evidently are in doubt as to their meaning. I have omitted giving details of many expressions involving four letter words and services' slang since it is both undesirable for those not familiar with them and unnecessary for those who are.

"Catch a crab"—a favourite phrase in the popular conception of rowing. It occurs when the blade is not correctly squared and becomes caught in the water. It seldom results in the man being ejected from the boat.

"Bum-shoving" or *"shooting the slide"*—a common fault even in the highest levels—consists of shooting the slide backwards at the beginning of the stroke before the blade is properly in the water, thus wasting the power in the legs.

"Washing out"—allowing the blade to pop out of the water before the stroke is completed, again wasting effort. It is usually accompanied by varying degrees of spray.

"Give her ten" shouted by the cox, denoting ten strokes of special effort. Can often be interpreted "we are about to be bumped".

"Back her down"—heard from the cox before or after the race when turning round. One side of the boat will turn their blades round 180 degrees and push through the water instead of pulling. The other side will paddle on normally and, given a little luck and a reasonably adept cox, the boat will turn.

"Leaning out"—as implied means an oarsman leaning out to the side of the boat thus causing it to become unbalanced and run unevenly.

"Chaining"—this occurs when the stroke's puddle from one stroke follows Two's from the previous stroke to form a regular pattern or chain. If this happens at a racing rating it usually means the crew is going well. When stroke's blade starts to drop into two's puddle it indicates that the rating is too high for the work put it.

The Restoration of the Hertford College Barge

In 1966 Hertford College decided to donate their barge to the Trust for the Preservation of Oxford College Barges. It seemed to characterise an age when many beautiful objects are cast aside simply because they are a financial burden. Fortunately this case also showed how long the efforts of our predecessors can survive. The barge was designed by Sir Thomas Jackson, whose monumental work in stone in Hertford College itself at the end of the last century now seem so far away from our possibilities and conceptions. The barge was in fact built as late as 1911 but shows the studious care for detail and proportion that is characteristic of Thomas Jackson's work. We recognize it as something belonging to the Georgian era in spirit. The Hertford barge is one of the finest survivors of the long tradition of ceremonial barges, dating back even before the Egyptian era. By an accident of fate it was taken up for long term preservation as a work of art.

The task of restoration has been a long and difficult one, not least because of the slow rate of return from the appeal for funds. Initially there was six months of study of the condition of the barge, ways and means of repair and probable cost. It was clear that immediate action was needed to prevent the barge from becoming a heavy liability, since the state of the hull was very poor. A second hand steel barge hull was therefore bought to be adapted for the purpose, costing less than a new steel hull and being of very sturdy construction. In fact because the hull is deeper than required, when a new bottom is needed in about 50 years this will be able to be fitted inside the barge. There is already concrete inside the bottom of the hull acting as ballast so that the hull lies at the correct water level. When it is necessary to replace the bottom, the barge will be put in a channel which will then be drained. The new bottom can then be welded above the old steel and concrete ballast, and then the old bottom cut away and the barge floated off, leaving it behind. This would give the hull a life of 100 years, or even more if maintenance is given a serious approach.

The superstructure was thus transferred to its new hull in the New Cut in 1967-68. The major operation was that two narrow boats, donated to the Trust by Mr. John Smith, were placed on either side. The superstructure was then supported by timbers passed through the windows of the barge and resting on the two long boats, which thus supported the superstructure as the hull was cut away and floated away. The new

hull was inserted underneath the superstructure the same day (*see* photo inside cover). The narrow barges will be kept for this task, since existing worthwhile college barges all need new bottoms.

A major setback was received in 1969 however, a fire destroyed most of the wooden superstructure and the project was almost abandoned. However, photographs of the original design and detail survived and complete rebuilding of the superstructure on the steel hull was undertaken at the Teddington yard of Tough Brothers. So in 1971, the operation finished, we have an all new superstructure on the steel hull which survived the fire. The stairway, railings and interior still have to be replaced, however, and the Trust will need £5,000 to do this. The funds are at present exhausted. Those who give to help the completion of the restoration will have the satisfaction of having rescued a great work of art, and one which will survive much longer than the original could possibly, since the new timber has been specially treated and the construction improved.

Future plans for the barge are that it will start a museum of rowing and river history, to which three other preserved barges will, it is hoped, be added. Four decorative college barges on the river will at least give some idea of the scene on the Isis when no fewer than 27 barges lined the bank.

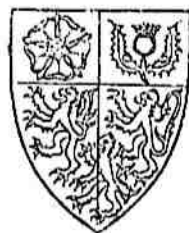

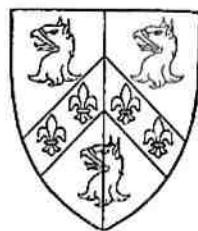

It is apparent to most people that Oxford's rowing has hit the doldrums, yet judging by the number of people rowing on the Isis today, it is hard to see why this should be so.

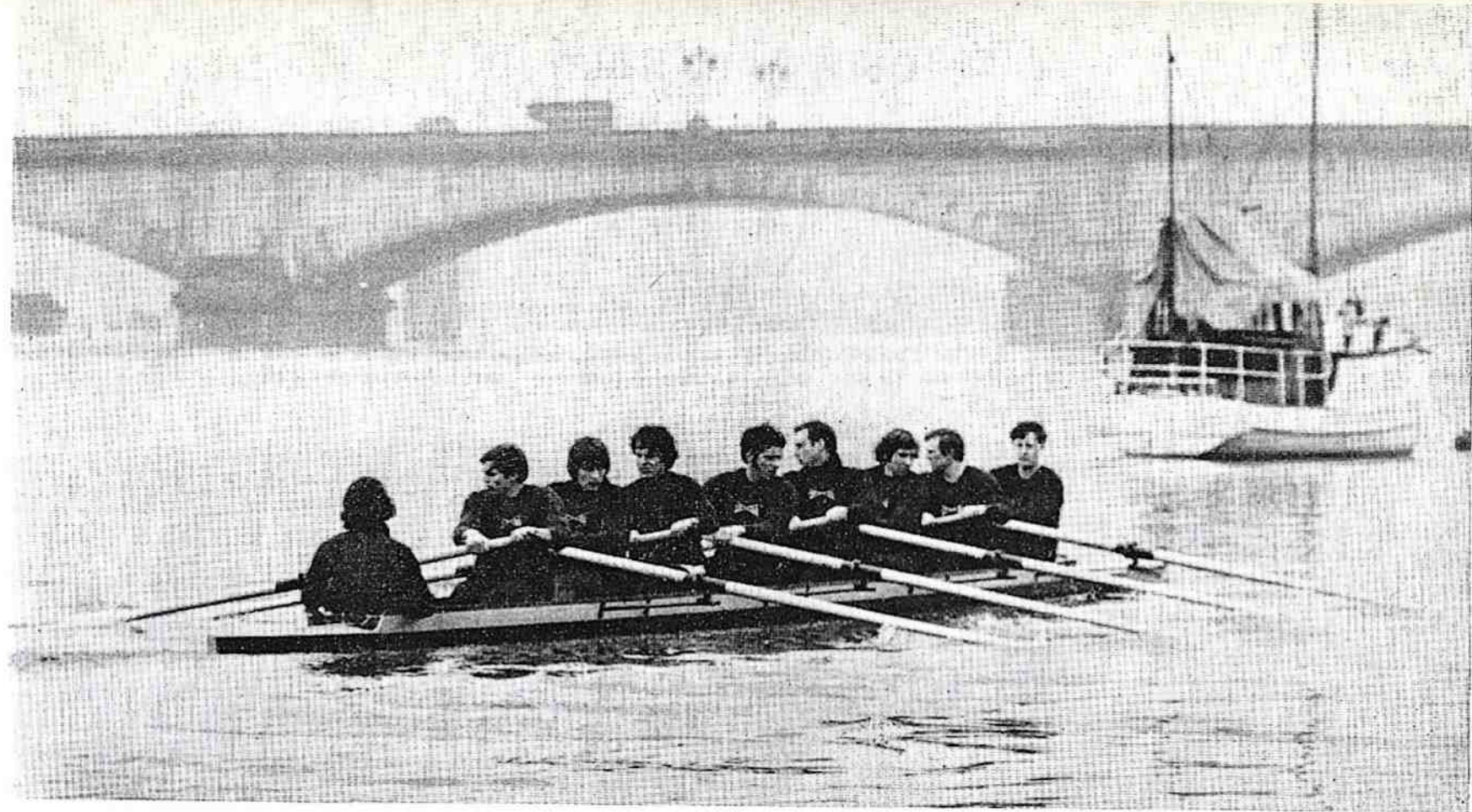
