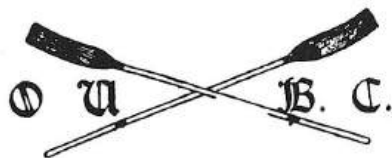

ROWING JARGON

There are many strange cries that can be heard from coxes and coaches as they harangue their crews. I shall endeavour to explain some of them for the benefit of those not acquainted with rowing jargon and also, for the many oarsmen who by their lack of response, evidently are in doubt as to their meaning. I have omitted giving details of many expressions involving four letter words and services' slang since it is both undesirable for those not familiar with them and unnecessary for those who are.

"Catch a crab" – a favourite phrase in the popular conception of rowing. It occurs when the blade is not correctly squared and becomes caught in the water. It seldom results in the man being ejected from the boat.

"Bum-shoving" or *"shooting the slide"* – a common fault even in the highest levels – consists of shooting the slide backwards at the beginning of the stroke before the blade is properly in the water, thus wasting the power in the legs.

"Washing out" – allowing the blade to pop out of the water before the stroke is completed, again wasting effort. It is usually accompanied by varying degrees of spray.

"Give her ten" shouted by the cox, denoting ten strokes of special effort. Can often be interpreted "we are about to be bumped".

"Back her down" – heard from the cox before or after the race when turning round. One side of the boat will turn their blades round 180 degrees and push through the water instead of pulling. The other side will paddle on normally and, given a little luck and a reasonably adept cox, the boat will turn.

"Leaning out" – as implied means an oarsman leaning out to the side of the boat thus causing it to become unbalanced and run unevenly.

"Chaining" – this occurs when the stroke's puddle from one stroke follows Two's from the previous stroke to form a regular pattern or chain. If this happens at a racing rating it usually means the crew is going well. When stroke's blade starts to drop into two's puddle it indicates that the rating is too high for the work put it.

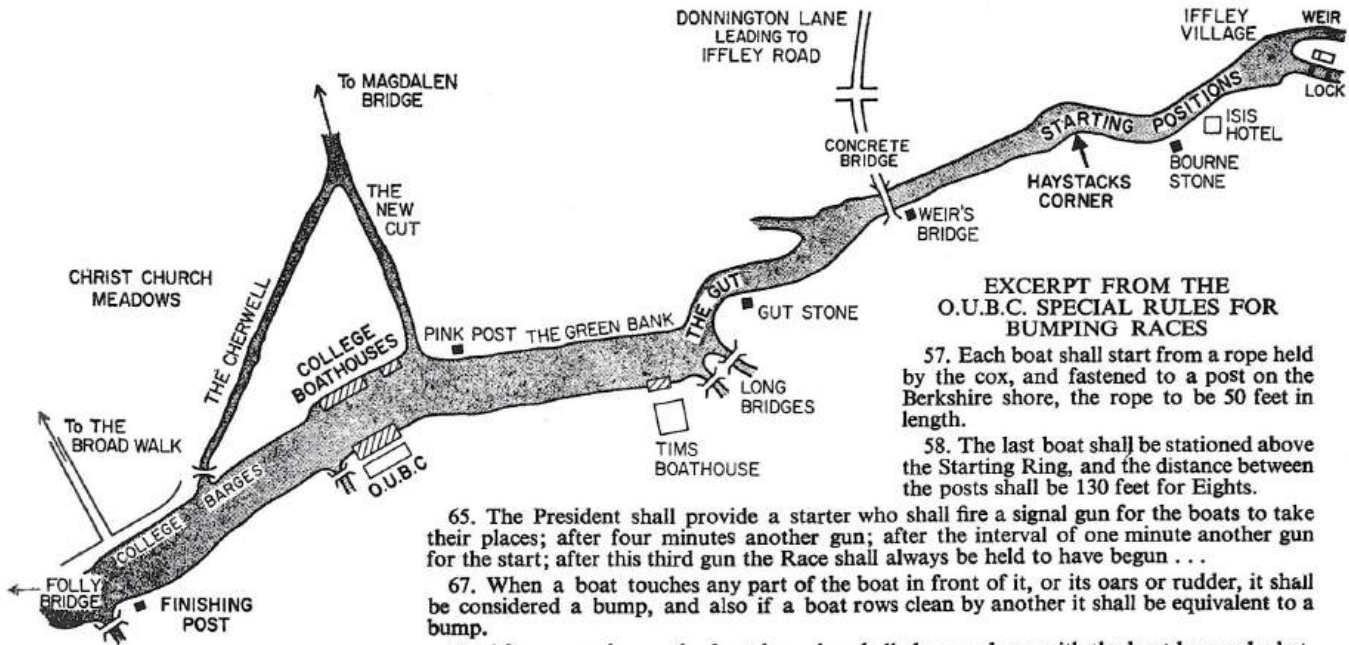

EXCERPT FROM THE
O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR
BUMPING RACES

57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.

58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.

65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .

67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.

69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.

President's Address

The racing which many thousands will be watching here on the Isis this week is something quite unique (though, I gather, a rather pale imitation does take place somewhere in the Fenlands). The attractions of bumping races are manifold and obvious, and the continuing popularity of Summer Viii's over the last century and a half with both spectators and competitors had made it one of the high spots of the Oxford year. Competing this week will be oarsmen of all standards from complete novice to international, but almost all of them will have put a considerable amount of hard work into preparation for the racing and will now be finding out whether their training is going to pay off. But whether you are here for the rowing, or just for the Pimm's, Summer Viii's is, above all, meant to be enjoyed.

The last year has been one of mixed fortunes for University rowing. Under the leadership of Leo Sharpston the OUWBC has made a determined step in the right direction towards breaking Cambridge domination of the Women's Boat Race, the Blue Boat pushing Cambridge all the way, whilst Osiris produced a superbly aggressive row only to surrender a bar length to Blondie over the last few hundred metres. The Lightweight's race was yet another neck and neck struggle which Oxford were unlucky to lose. Isis too lost to a very good and much heavier Goldie crew. On the 150th anniversary of the Boat Race, however, the Blue Boat, with no real stars, crystallized under the intelligent leadership of John Wiggins into a tight-knit and very happy crew to win a hard race against the best opposition put up by Cambridge in recent years. Next year the opposition will be tougher still and, with this in mind, for the first time in many years half the Blue Boat will be staying together throughout the summer to try for international selection. But without a constant flow of fresh blood from the Colleges our chances in all of next year's contests against Cambridge are slim.

Almost all the oarsmen who took part in these races this year will be competing this week and several will have spent a lot of time passing on what they have learnt rowing for the University by coaching both their own and other colleges. If College Captains encourage their members, including those who perhaps do not believe that they are of University standard, to enter for the Cherwell scheme this summer, and for winter trials, they cannot fail to get back better oarsmen and coaches for next summer, whilst the University crews will win more of their races because they will have a larger selection of people to choose from.

Looking to this year's Summer Viii's, however, I must here express my thanks to the many people who make the whole operation possible: the OUBC Committee and all those who have shared in the thankless task of umpiring the races, the hard-working producers of this programme, the OTC for its perennial help with communications, The Queen's College and Mr Beasley, its groundsman, for allowing access to the OUBC across its grounds, and, of course, to all the boatmen for keeping us all afloat and making sure that we set off straight.

It remains to wish the spectators, the would-be rowers turned spectator who unfortunately missed 'Getting On' last Thursday, and those actually competing, a very enjoyable four days and happy (but not too destructive) bumping.

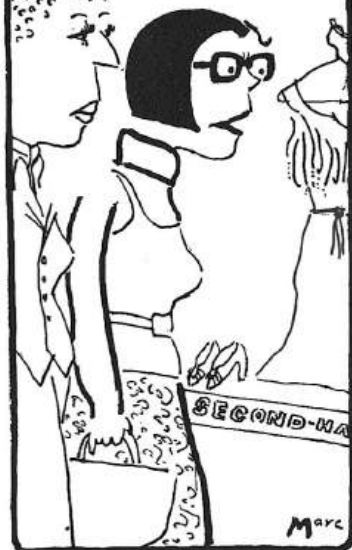

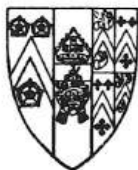

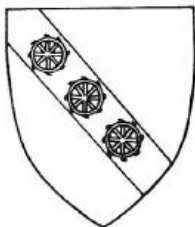
