



### REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The University's prospects for the year looked promising from the onset with nine blues oarsmen and six of the previous years Isis crew available.

The Blue Boats when finally selected demonstrated a class and pace seldom displayed by Oxford crews. Its potential was enforced with effortless victories over Leander and the University of London. Oxford arrived at Putney, two weeks prior to the Boat Race, undefeated. Success in fixtures against the National Lightweight and Heavyweight Squads led the press to acclaim the eight as 'the fastest Boat Race crew of all time'.

On April 4th Oxford, never behind, relentlessly extended their lead to leave Cambridge 8 lengths astray and so secure the largest Dark Blue winning margin this century. Isis, the University second crew, likewise demonstrated their pace in a number of fixtures, notably the Head of the River. On Boat Race day having rowed level for eight minutes, they eased away from Cambridge to win by 4½ lengths. The nature of their victory said much for the crews spirit and determination.

Under the guidance of Ann Spillsbury the OUWBC produced two exceptionally strong eights. In the Varsity Match Osiris won by an impressive margin and the Blue Boat snatched victory by one second. The Lightweight eight's encounter was similarly hard fought. With equipment problems and a last minute substitution Oxford were unfortunate to lose by a bare third of a length.

The successes achieved by the Senior Squad were largely the product of an immensely talented coaching team. Steve Royle, the chief coach, deserves special thanks for his tireless efforts in the face of undergraduate inefficiency. I should also like to express my gratitude to Richard Yonge, Nick Conington and Dr J. M. Barry for their support during a memorable year.

### OXFORD UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BOAT CLUB

### President's Address

By all accounts 1981 has been a remarkably successful year for Oxford University Women's Boat Club, with victory for both the Blue Boat and Osiris at Henley on March 29th. Squad training began back in October with a large number of enthusiastic oarswomen competing for a place in the Blue Boat or Osiris. The standard of trialists was the highest we have ever had, which gave the coaches a few headaches when trying to select the crews.

We were very fortunate this year to have as our chief coach Rosie Clugston, who rowed for Great Britain at the 1980 Olympics. Rosie arrived on the scene shortly before the end of Michaelmas term, just in time to compose a suitably strenuous training scheme for the whole of the Christmas break, which, incidentally, was fairly short as we began rowing again early in the new year. Around this time virtually the entire O.U.W.B.C. Squad made a rapid rise to stardom when we appeared on 'Blue Peter'.

The first few weeks of Hilary term were spent training at Godstow, followed by several weeks on the Radley stretch and then two weeks on the Isis.

During this period we entered various Head Races in order to gain some experience of racing, albeit not of the side-by-side variety. At Abingdon small boats head, Rachel Amherst and Ros Roden won the women's pairs. At Burway Head, the Blue Boat won the women's VIIIs and Osiris came second. At Reading head the Blue Boat won the women's section and Osiris came third (only four seconds behind the Cambridge Blue Boat).

For the final ten days leading up to the women's boat race on 29th March we all stayed in Henley-on-Thames where we "graced the lawns of Leander" (I quote Radio 4) and rowed twice a day, accompanied by our coaches, Rosie and Mike, plus a customary entourage of Cambridge coaches and "spies". We received a fair amount of media coverage during the final week, including an appearance on Thames Television, a "spot" on Radio Four and a rather unexpected article in the Daily Express. It was unfortunate that our races were not televised, apparently because the London marathon was on the same day.

Osiris rowed a tremendous race against Blondie, finishing eight seconds ahead, and going down in history as the first Osiris crew ever to beat a Blondie crew.

The Oxford Blue Boat pulled clear of Cambridge in the first part of the race, and then Cambridge drew back almost level, to be beaten by one second by a powerful and determined Oxford crew.

So ended another successful season with the Oxford women's squad continuing and improving upon the achievements of last year.

On behalf of O.U.W.B.C. I should like to thank the following: - The OUBC President, Chris Mahoney for his invaluable cooperation and assistance, and also the OUBC Trust Fund for financial support; Collar's Blades for sponsorship with a set of blades.


St. Edward's School and Radley College for their goodwill and hospitality during our training.



### 1927 - 1981 PROFILE OF CHANGE



"By Christ lads, that's a varsity crew"; when a freshman Oxford Blue first hears the dulcet tones of George Harris, he finds it hard to believe that the man is capable of pushing an oarsman to his limits. George whispers "I'm not sure whether you're very fit or very clever, reassure me. I want to see you feeling so tired, so terrible . . . ." The freshman's doubts are rapidly dispelled.

George Harris has been a vital cog in the Oxford coaching team for many years. Having been a professional sculler, he sympathised with, and understands the agonies of rowing. His coaching methods are based on an unrivalled "feeling for the water" and a knowledge of what makes a boat move fast. While others rely on decibels to drive their crews, George is content to whisper, confident that the belief they have in him will be encouragement enough.

His resignation this year due to illness came as a tremendous blow to the O.U.B.C. He has been in part responsible for Oxford's successor of recent years and will be respected as long as the O.U.B.C. exists.

I first became involved with college rowing in 1927 and by 1930 a good deal of discussion was going on about the condition of the barges and the possibility of replacing them with boathouses. It was generally agreed that although picturesque they had become outdated as far as rowing men were concerned. The cost of saving them or bringing them up to necessary standards was estimated to be more than that of building boathouses. Lack of space necessitated boats having to be stored at the O.U.B.C. Changing room was very limited and hot water for showers etc had to be heated by a boiler behind a coal fire. Crews had to be ferried over to collect their boats. During Eights Week large crowds of visitors collected on top of the barges and when rushing forward to see the crews it often happened that the barges shipped water just above the normal water-line. To counter this it was found necessary to fit baulks of timber to prevent the barge tilting, and a number of men were employed to stand by ready to pump if needed.

Pleasure punts and small boats were far more numerous in the thirties and forties and earlier than this it was often possible to cross the river after the last race of the day by walking from punt to punt.

By 1937 Christ Church occupied the first boathouse — others were to follow at intervals. The approximate cost of the first was, I believe £3,500 (rather less than the cost of an "eight" today). About this time changes were taking place to rowing equipment. Slides were getting longer, fixed pins were giving way to swivels and more attention was given to reducing the weight of boats. In recent years with the more scientific approach to physical fitness and advanced technology the introduction of longer oars has resulted. In the 1930's the average length of oar was 12' or 12'1" with a blade width of 6" — today the majority of crews use 12'5" to 12'6" oars with a correspondingly larger blade area. Up until just after the last war various methods to reduce the drag were tried such as rubbing down the skin of the boat with pumice dust and linseed oil. Boats were often French polished by a local firm at a cost of thirty shillings (1.50p) per boat. Balliol College black-leaded their boats.

Nineteen fifty four saw the reduction of six days racing to four days and this was generally welcomed by oarsmen who felt that the break at the weekend did more harm than good.

Some idea of the growth in numbers of people rowing may be gauged from the fact that in 1933 there were five divisions – in 1948 six divisions and last year there were seven men's divisions and three women's. Owing to the increase in numbers taking part, many crews have their outing in the early morning thus relieving congestion on the river later in the day. In the earlier days it was unheard of for more than one crew to use the same boat. Nowadays the same boat is often used by two or more crews – making maintenance of boats and equipment more difficult. However, despite these difficulties women's rowing has shown great improvement in the last two or three years and the Blue Boat and Isis must be congratulated on their performance at Putney. This years Blue Boat must surely be ranked among the best crews ever.

### Reflections on Moscow

The Olympic Village stood on the outskirts of Moscow in a 'no-mans' land of half completed constructions and earthworks. The village itself was far from welcoming. Grass, shrubs and trees had been planted too late and were consequently, like many of the preparations, well behind schedule. With the arrival of the British team luggage checks, bomb sniffing dogs and rain thickened the gloom. For a time I regretted having decided to attend the XXII Olympiad. Fortunately our first impressions were false ones.

The British press were quick to report the abundance of firearms, machine gun turrets, barbed wire and anti-Afghanistan demonstrations. On returning home I read with interest their vivid reports and can only conclude that there were two Olympic Villages, one of them fictional. The security was tight, it had to be, but not overbearing. Few Russians speak English and even fewer Englishmen Russian, conversation with the people of Moscow and the Russian athletes was consequently limited. They were clearly wary of Westerners, but nevertheless friendly and approachable.

Being a newcomer to international competition I was most impressed with the array of facilities, though an Olympic veteran informed me they did not match the standards set in Montreal. All the restaurants were 'self-service' with no restriction upon the amounts that could be taken, which was fortunate. Life in the Olympic Village consisted of eating, sleeping and rowing.

The rowing course appeared to have been strategically placed within a wind belt and persistent cross winds rendered some lanes more favourable than others, fortunately on finals day the conditions were somewhat fairer. The stifling heat was a major worry during racing, particularly so in the semi-finals as we drew the sun-loving Australians and had to win to be sure of a place in the final. With temperatures soaring, even the Cubans, who appeared to be there to make up numbers, performed well. We failed to beat the Australians, but nevertheless made the six lane final.

On finals day the weather took a turn for the worst, the sky became overcast and the heat problem evaporated. Dreary looking Russians filed to the course in their thousands, whether they came by choice or otherwise is open to debate. The rowing pundits predicted fourth place at the best for the British Eight. Apparently the East Germans and Russians were never beaten, and we had lost to the Australians two days earlier. It is not easy to recall the pattern of any race, Olympic finals are no exception. We led initially,

dropped back to fourth and eventually overhauled the Czechoslovakians and Russians to take the Silver Medal, the Australians were 4th. Nobody believed the result, not even the crew. Most of us were in no fit state for jubilation, exhaustion can reduce the moment to one of anti-climax. It takes days to recover by which time the immediate elation is lost.

The Russian spectators filed away from the course, the British team drove back to the Olympic Village and a tired British Eight, at last released from the clutch of nerves, went straight to bed.

### **JAPAN 1981**



"Row for the O.U.B.C. and see the world" so said the man at the first trials meeting in October in a despairing attempt to persuade the poor deluded fools who had attended, to put their names to paper and sign away their souls to the O.U.B.C. For once as the Japan Airways 747 took off at Amsterdam bound for Tokyo, it seemed he had spoken the truth.

Channel 12, a Tokyo broadcasting company had offered to pay for the Oxford and Cambridge Blue boats (crews and equipment) to come to Japan and hold a second "Boat Race" on the Sumida river in honour of the 50th anniversary of the Japanese

University Boat Race. What could be better we thought, than a weeks holiday in Japan marred only by one little race? The first hint of our mistake came when we discovered that the two Universities themselves:— Keio and Waseda, did not train on the river at all but on a nearby 2000m rowing course. Why we asked in our innocence was this? Suddenly no one seemed to understand English and we didn't discover the answer until the day of the race. The next discovery was that the race was to be 4000m not the 2000m for which we had fondly hoped. Well anyone who could cope with 6000m on the Tideway in April could manage 4000m on the Sumida — couldn't they?

The banks were jam-packed on race day with thousands of Japanese anxious to see the monstrous British freaks – some of whom, it was rumoured, were almost 12 feet tall!! Boating was quite an adventure – no Putney style barriers here – it was a question of desperate manoeuvres to avoid removing vital parts of Japanese anatomies from several hundred people who seemed intent on committing harikari on our riggers.

We rescued our cox from the bottom of a small pile of Japanese bodies who were clutching pens and muttering "sign here please Missee Brown", and pushed off from the raft. At first it was relatively pleasant; but as we came down towards the start we met a flotilla of boats seemingly specially employed to produce waves worthy of the North Sea. Thus as job satisfaction is important in Japan, we arrived at the start having done no warm up and full of water.

After a spot of bailing, we were off into scenes reminiscent of the beach attack in "Apocalypse Now". Up to ten helicopters were counted hovering over us causing huge downdraughts from their low altitude and making it almost impossible to row. Nevertheless we avoided the napalm and managed to crash through the waves (which were quite large enough to surf on). After the first 2000m we did succeed in arriving at some calmer water and leaving behind Cambridge who up until then had been unnoticed in our desperate attempts to survive.

Undoubtedly though, the highlight of the trip was not the rowing but the social events — both organised and unofficial. The receptions were very impressive with huge ice Pagodas, pleasant food and several hundred gallons of sake. The Japanese were, we all agreed the most generous hosts we had ever had the pleasure of staying with. They showered gifts and hospitality upon us and ensured that wherever we went, we enjoyed ourselves by their warmth and enthusiasm; (and by an interesting line in cabaret acts — ask Nick Conington about "women" in Tokyo stage shows!)

In eight days we had little opportunity to see much of Japan, but most did get out of Tokyo on the final day of our stay. What we saw then - including magnificent shrines and temples - coupled with our experiences in Tokyo has I am sure whetted all our appetites for a return visit someday.
