





President's Report

OXFORD UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BOAT CLUB

This year the O.U.W.B.C. had no blues and only four from the 1983 Osiris crew on which to build its squad to face an exceptionally strong challenge from the Fens, which included four blues and several Olympic hopefuls. The President, Jo Armstrong, did a superb job in turning a relatively inexperienced squad into two highly competitive crews. But when Jo Treweek had to drop out with an injury, to be replaced at three by Claire Richens, our high hopes of becoming giant killers were dashed. In the race at Henley on March 25th, Cambridge pulled away right from the start and won by $4\frac{1}{2}$ lengths.

The depth of the squad reaped its benefits, though, when Osiris scored a resounding victory over Blondie. Blondie, like their Blue Boat, had a good start moving out to a 3/4 length lead. Then Osiris put in a determined push and rowed their opposition down over the middle part of the course, pulling away to

win by 3½ lengths.

1984 saw the inaugural Women's Lightweight Boat Race. The weight limit of 9 stone average (9 st 4 lbs max) produced two well matched crews. The lightweights raced neck and neck for much of the course but

Cambridge proved to be the stronger crew. In the latter stages, winning by 1 1/4 lengths.

Next year we need to build on the ground work done this year. We are already looking for oarswomen and coxes for the 1985 Boat Race crews. With few women having rowed before coming to Oxford we rely on good College rowers to form the basis of the squad. Many of you rowing in Summer Eights this week have the potential to be University rowers. The 'Windrush' crews, selected in 6th week are aimed at new trialists, and provide a good opportunity for extra coaching and racing experience. Details of 'Windrush' trials will be announced over the tannoy. If you are interested in representing O.U.W.B.C. please contact any of the committee members.

Of course you do not have to row to be part of O.U.W.B.C. A successful squad needs a team of dedicated coaches. We want to increase our coaching staff next season, particularly for technique work in Michaelmas term. O.U.W.B.C. would like to hear from anyone in the Oxford area interested in coaching

the squad next year.

Finally I would like to thank O.U.B.C. and all the College clubs who have helped us this year, particularly in lending equipment. We are most grateful.

VIENNA 1983

Touchdown. We were all there. The oldest, most foreign (until this year that is) best qualified blue boat in a long time. We had a girl called Lazer with us too. No-one really knew who she was but she spoke with a foreign accent (which seemed appropriate) and was pretty (and) small to boot. Rumour had it she might even be able to steer. A girl cox who could steer? Unbelievable! Bound to be good for publicity though.

So we shambled off the plane with vague notions of a long race to publicize a forest, and more concrete ideas of nightclubs, beer, and schnitzel. We were greeted by a few pressmen and an interpreter called Karl whose resemblance to John Lennon was startling. When under duress (or was it when under the influence and undressed) he did admit to being John Lennon and having staged the shooting. Then it happened. They spotted Lazer. "Oh . . . gooody gum dropsiz. Vot haf vee hear. Eine Madchen . . . click . . . whirr . . . click . . . Please to be smiling. Waifing please . . . Get zose dumm oarsmen out off ze vay."

We had been sponsored by the Austrian equivalent of "The Sun" in conjunction with the World Wild life Fund to show that The Danube was used by a multitude of people and should not therefore be dammed/damned. "All you have to is 36 km of exhibition paddling and then an 18 km race against Cambridge and three other Austrian crews" Karl explained on our way to the hotel at the spa town of Bad Deutsch, Altenburg. Ideas of sipping the therapeutic water however was quickly scotched. Several miles from the town noxious smells were detected and while most were blaming Bazza Karl told us that it was the spa itself which people bathed. A pleasant mixture of sulphur and iodine our "shaky" chemist informed us.

The rest of the day was spent on a sightseeing tour. The crew's old timer, 55 year old archeology don Boron was in his element surrounded by Roman ruins. This is when they raced chariots he told us pointing at the river. His sight isn't what it used to be.

The Magdalen element were still highly concerned about being able to remember how to row, let alone do 35 miles of it. Our first outing soon helped allay their worries. All of the eights in Austria had been brought to Vienna. We could choose any one of the five. The reason only 5 crews were to take part in the race was because only 5 eights exist in the country. We chose our weapon and set off. After rowing upstream for 1 hour we turned and 10 minutes later were back at the starting point. The stream has to be seen to be believed.

Further outings were uneventful. We were invariably followed by super-coach Stan McPolski but having hidden his megaphone no-one could hear what he was saying. Cambridge were having much more

fun. On their first outing they were spotted by a fleet of power boats who were fascinated by the sight. So they came over to have a look and promptly sank the Tabs with their washes, wrecking the boat in the process. This was to reduce the number of eights in the race to four. On their next outing they ran their new boat aground and were swimming again.

In between times the Austrians had organized visits to the Opera and also a river trip round the city.

The whole of the latter was accompanied by the strains of the Blue Danube Waltz.

The race turned out to be quite a civilized affair. After the exhibition paddling through Vienna we stopped at a riverside hostelry for lunch. Then the race proper of 18 km was over quite quickly. Having snatched a couple of lengths over the first couple of kilometres we were able to watch and wash the other crews. We were presented with an inordinate number of medals and cups for having won, whilst Cambridge who came last left empty handed. Its always difficult to get these things back through customs though!

JOLLY BOATING WEATHER

Rowing brings out the best in one, or does it? In defence of the proposition a good oarsman (oarswoman) has to do two things simultaneously: concentrate on improving individual technique while synchronising one's effort with others. Thereby avoiding the self-centredness of cricket (pace the landlubbers) where personal averages matter so much. Nor does the obsession with rowing ever quite desert one. When Lord Desborough, one of the greatest all-round athletes and Oxford Rowing Blues of all time, was talking to one he used to flick his wrist at the end of a sentence as if he was finishing a stroke, clean, crisp and strong. Involuntary movements gave away his pastime.

A good stroke must not only have leadership, drive and inspiration, but a sound reliable rhythm, the very prerequisite of cohesion and togetherness in a crew. Musicians and poets have rhythm, and have sometimes made excellent strokes. Dick Holdsworth (First in Law, and Dean of 'Univ') was as compelling on the piano as stroking a crew. David Winser of Corpus, who stroked Oxford in the Boat Race, also won the University Prize for poetry, the Newdigate prize for English verse. Yehudi Menuhin may not have rowed, but would have imparted rhythm, if nothing else.

One of the most famous strokes, R.C. Bourne, not content with stroking Oxford to victory against Cambridge in four successive years, went on to become Deputy Speaker in the House of Commons, virtually stroking members into submission or surrender by a dexterous authority derived from . . . no, I must not exaggerate. But he knew how to control.

As for coxes, they steer all sorts of courses. One married the sister of the Queen. A recent cox, C. Moynihan, is now an M.P., and could well cox the British national VIII in the Los Angeles Olympics during the Summer recess. One pocket-edition of a cox, H.P.V. Massey, of Balliol, was so light at 5 stone 2 lbs, that his weight in the stern sometimes failed to keep the rudder in the water sufficiently to execute a turn. On one occasion he failed to get through Barnes Bridge, heading straight for the bank, but that is another story.

Of course, times have changed in other respects. Outings no longer end with stowing a boat away in the O.U.B.C., walking all the way up the towpath to one's College barge, waiting for the boatman to bring the punt across, pulling a chain to release cold, cold water over yourself while you stand in a tin tub, and emerge tingling with rude health. Mr. Best, the much respected, white-bearded ferryman, allowed no slipshod language in his punt and expected personal behaviour of a high order in his presence.

Gone are the days when Bishops were recruited, seemingly, from the ranks of Rowing Blues, and the

Welsh Marches were protected by the Rowing Blue Bishops of Chester, Lichfield and Gloucester. The entire Oxford crew of the first Boat Race took Holy Orders, and ended up as Bishops, Deans, Prebendaries, and the like — no nepotism, just merit!

As for today, prowess on the river is not divorced from academic expectation. Many an oarsman (oarswoman), 'I like to take my exercise sitting down,' sets his sights on post-graduate work, a D.Phil.,

lecturing or research, and a goodly number succeed.

Far be it from me to extol the virtues of oarsmen too far, but a recent memory justifies it all. Danuta Shanzer of Corpus, who rowed for Oxford against Cambridge in 1979, is now Assistant Professor of Classics in the University of California in Berkeley. But at the Ninth International Conference on Patristic Studies in Oxford last September, dressed overall with dignity in episcopal purple, she mesmerised her audience with a brilliant paper on 'The death of Boethius and the Consolation of Philosophy'. The Chairman, Dean of Christ Church and Regius Professor of Divinity, whipped out his pen and made copious notes in honour of an outstanding piece of work.

The case is proved. Rowing can do no lasting harm. Individual progress, put to the benefit of the community, owes something to early training on the river. 'So we'll all swing together . . .'

LOOK, NO LEGS!

It is all too easy for those of us who are concerned with the pursuit of excellence in rowing or in any other sport to think that is the most or even the only important aspect of the sport. We see novice rowing as the first stage to college rowing then University rowing and finally International honours and we tend to look down on paddling on the Serpentine or the Cherwell as though those who indulged in it were lesser mortals. Even less serious College rowing is frowned on. But when you have seen the great joy that rowing can bring both as a recreation and a competitive sport to even the most severely disabled people you will change your point of view, as I have done.

Two years ago I had the good fortune to be travelling in the United States on a Churchill Fellowship which took me for a few weeks to Philadelphia. While I was there Chris Blackwall, a Keble rowing blue and now the executive director of the United States Rowing Association, invited me to help out with the running of the second annual All-Disabled Regatta. I had no idea what to expect. What I found, though, was a group of about 30 very enthusiastic rowers ranging in age from 13 to 65 with an enormous variety of disabilities from single and double leg amputees and the partially sighted to athletes with cerebral palsy, paraplegia and even tetraplegia. They all sculled with confidence and really seemed to enjoy the freedom that rowing gave them. Also there were their friends and families helping out and enjoying the afternoon's racing, and running the regatta were officials from the U.S.R.A. in full international umpiring kit, flags and all, showing that this was no joke event but a serious and important part of U.S. rowing.

Abilities and boat speeds varied widely and some were more serious about winning than others but heats and finals were held over the 400 metre course in different events and everyone enjoyed the races. Between races there were demonstration rows in different boats including double sculls to show that ablebodied and disabled athletes can row together. The lightweight sculling World Champion went out with an amputee and one of the greatest sights of the afternoon was an 18 year old lad, who rows at one of the big U.S. rowing schools, sculling with his younger brother, who had been disabled since birth with cerebral palsy.

As one of the disabled athletes put it "The great thing about rowing is that on land we are so ungainly when we try to get about but on the water you just glide along like a swan. Nobody knows you are disabled. In fact, you sometimes forget it yourself".

Now, Rowing for the Disabled has come to Britain and it has started here in Oxford. With the help of the Amateur Rowing Association, OXSRAD (Oxford and District Sport and Recreation Association for

the Disabled) has set up a rowing group which held its first coaching session as recently as May 13th at the swimming pool of Westminster College and using a "playboat" single scull. There is now a group of a dozen athletes with as many enthusiastic helpers and coaches, including two ex-Presidents of the O.U.B.C., a British Olympic Athletics Team physiotherapist and even the Captain of the Oxford University Amateur Boxing Club!

Initial training is held at a swimming pool for reasons of safety and confidence but once the athletes have mastered the basic skills, the venue will be moved to the river, where sculling can be undertaken with greater freedom and sweep-oar rowing can be learned in tub pairs. Perhaps by later in the summer there will be enough athletes with sufficient skills to hold Oxford's first all-disabled regatta.

So, as you watch the college oarsmen and oarswomen striving to climb the ladder of excellence in rowing, perhaps you will spare a thought for the wider potential of the sport to bring a degree of freedom to many people who long ago gave up all hope of indulging in any such active sport or who never would have thought it possible to experience the joys of simply messing about in boats.
