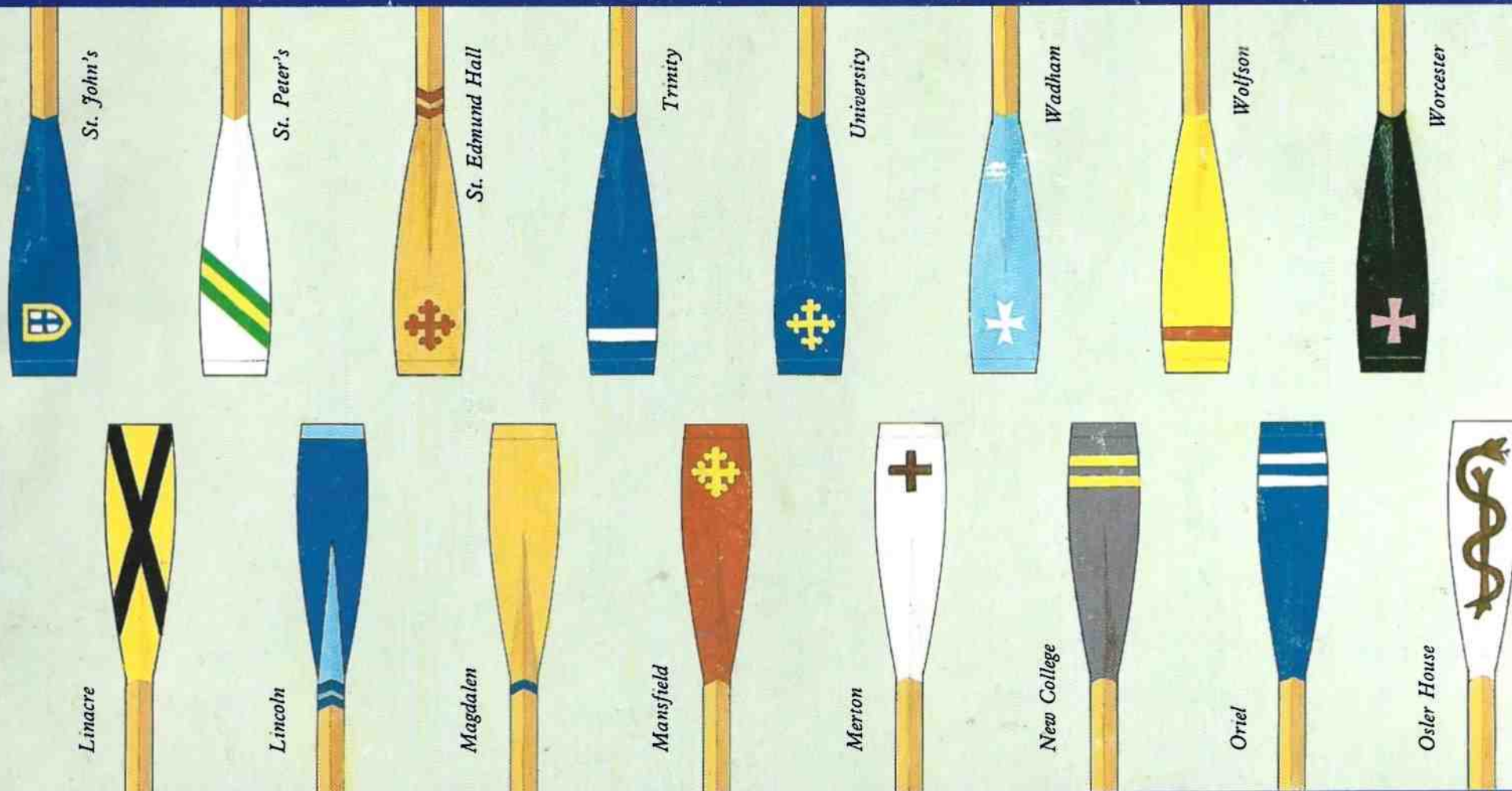

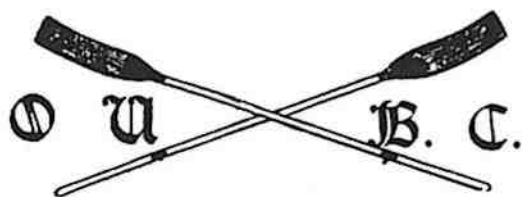

President's Report 1986

OXFORD UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BOAT CLUB

Oxford were out to defend the Boat Race trophy for the first time since 1981, so preparations for squad selection, and the resulting training programme, were understandably tough. The group of 18 that were chosen was strong, the Blue Boat being an experienced crew containing 2 internationals, a Blue & OSIRIS 85 members. In Michaelmas term the senior squad showed promise, winning Reading IV's H.O.R., 2nd in Tideways IV's H.O.R. & winning SEN. B and winning the elite, SEN. A and SEN. B sections at Kingston IV's H.O.R. Before having the Christmas break the Blue Boat went to Hereford for a gruelling weeks training camp. Coming back in Hilary term the crews stayed in VIII's, and gained racing experience of Burway by winning the women's open, and the WHOR where the Blue Boat came 3rd overall and won the University pennant. The crews worked hard and long, culminating in a week's preparation at Henley. The Blue Boat arrived as favourites for the Sunday's race, and the Henley week's paddling certainly showed we deserved the recognition.

On race day conditions were blowy, but with the help of stakeboats, for the first time in many years, and the strong umpiring from M. Sweeney, all 4 races went off without mishap. The Blue Boats went off very fast, and at Revenham there was nothing in it. From there to the Barrier the lead changed several times, with Cambridge slightly in the lead coming to the final stretch. With 30 strokes to go Oxford upped the rating and took $\frac{3}{4}$ length to cross the line $2\frac{1}{2}$ seconds in front.

In the previous race OSIRIS and BLONDIE were out for a close race, and from the start BLONDIE held a slight lead, but with OSIRIS poised to fight back. However a dodgy seat nipped the challenge in the bud, although once recovered OSIRIS fought bravely, eventually only to lose by 4 secs.

The Oxford Women's lightweight crew turned the table's conclusively on the crew from Cambridge. Leading from the start the Oxford women took a length every minute, to win by a handsome margin of 21 secs.

Ouwbc is showing that it can produce international calibre oarswomen, last year Ali Bonner and Tish Reid represented GB at the World Championships, having been National Champions coxed IV, and this year there are at present 3 of the Oxford Blue Boat in the National Squad going for places in the Commonwealth and World Championship teams.

I must thank all the people who have been instrumental in helping Ouwbc this year: Nigel Mayglothling Head Coach, Bill Parry Treasurer, Mike Rosewell and Jeff Beesley, Albert Andrews, Oxford

Nutrition and Dr. Hardy, all the colleges who lent us equipment and Collar blades. Thanks also to OUBC – better luck next year – to my committee, especially to Za Horne, My Vice President, who has done a brilliant job on the media side, and taken a lot of weight off my shoulders.

I wish OUWBC all the best next year under Ali Gill – let's keep the trophy where it belongs – and to all Eight's crews good luck and enjoy it. Oarswomen don't forget about Windrush trials – ask your captains about them.

US TOUR 1986

When the Blue Boat embarked on its 2 week long U.S. tour it set new standards in disorganization and inefficiency. Admittedly this was no easy feat! After much scrambling and squabbling at the ticket counter involving name-changing, rescheduling and hunting for passports, the tone of the trip was set when, after the team had settled in for the lengthy flight, one surprised oarsman remarked: "Topolski's not on the plane!" In a frantic rush to leave the country and escape the humiliation and embarrassment surrounding the Boat Race, the team had apparently forgotten its fearless leader. Imagine the surprise and wonderment on the part of the welcoming committee when a group of wide-eyed, coach-less oarsmen dressed in attire ranging from blue blazers and levis to shorts and flip-flops strolled into the airport in Georgia. Our innocent hosts were further confused when their generous "southern hospitality" was met with questions like: "hey now, which way to the beach?" and when can we meet some "southern belles?" After being settled in beautiful refurbished mansions straight out of the "Gone with The Wind" set, and escorted around Augusta Georgia to the likes of various press-conferences, open-houses and ceremonies in the team's honour, the time had come to design a strategy of preparation for the weekend's regatta. After examining the four-lane course and some of the local competition, the crew, now back under the guidance of Topolski, adopted a strenuous daily – nightly training schedule which included some long rows followed by afternoon sun-bathing and nightly corousing in local "hot-spots." Such excursions were occasionally topped-off with the ever-popular hot-tub bash, until some enebriated team members decided to spice up the party by emptying two boxes of washing powder in the jacuzzi. If that wasn't enough to wash-out the crowd, the arrival of local police certainly was.

As time went by, it became increasingly apparent that the Blue Boat's visit to Georgia was the equivalent of the Beatles first in America. Groups of excited teenagers tailed the crew in pursuit of autographs and other special favours, and under the encouragement of the ever-pleasing and diplomatic Topolski, the crew was encouraged to accommodate these demands. After finishing a respectable second to Temple University in the regatta final, the crew were ushered off to Los Angeles California and the "hollywood hype" it's known for. The generous and first-class treatment we had become accustomed to was eagerly extended, and after being met at the airport by the UCLA cheerleaders, it became clear that many trends would continue. Being entertained nightly by British and American film stars and politicians including Dudley Moore, Susan George, Gregory Peck and Tom Bradley placed serious demands on our endurance. However, given the general competitive nature of team members, and the presence of sun-laiden beaches dripping with beauty, new fields of endeavour were eagerly explored. Despite galant and

determined efforts on the part of the coach to lead the team into these uncharted territories or as Captain Kirk stated, "to boldly go where no man has gone before," his presence was over-shadowed by the success and popularity of the unlikely star, Andy "he's so cute" Lobbenberg. However rewarding the social and cultural experiences of the California visit proved to be, the high-standard of racing yielded less fruitful results. The crew had to settle for a highly controversial third place, photo-finish to UCLA and Cal.

ISIS

Two weeks before the Boat Race, Isis went to Kingston Head. The previous week we had started to go very well indeed. On the Thursday however, we lost our No 7 permanently after discovering that he was ineligible to row, but an order change seemed to work and we went almost as well in a light Friday outing. Saturday at Kingston was a disaster. Goldie beat us by 46 secs and our winning the Sen. A pennant only made it worse. Clearly a new, more settled order might go faster on the day, but a 15½ length's deficit meant that humiliation bulked large.

On the day of the Race we were all suitably scared. Jeff Jacobs our finishing coach had made sure that we would be. Time and again in that fortnight he told us we were going to lose. When the UL coach had asked if he was finishing Isis, he had replied that it wouldn't take much doing. Only one oarsman was still in the seat he had occupied two weeks earlier.

We were prepared for sinking conditions which didn't materialise although it remained quite rough, especially after St. Paul's (7½ mins). Our race-plan boiled down to the necessity of our overlapping Goldie at Hammersmith. In the event, we arrived there a man up, and stayed slightly ahead all the way round the outside of the Surrey bend before going away to win by 7 secs. Almost uniquely the two crews had overlapped for ¾ of the course.

In a fortnight we had somehow managed to pick up three hundred yards of speed. Our debt to Jeff Jacobs goes without saying, but I don't think any of us really knows where we found quite so much extra pace. In many ways we were an incongruous crew – seldom if ever did we look pretty. In some crucial technical aspect we were probably superior, but the bottom line was probably the fear that made us pull harder. On no other occasion could we have gone so fast.

Only Eight Oars? Try One Hundred and Seventy!

Those readers who were at Henley Royal Regatta last year will have seen a strange contraption moored near the boat tents, floating on oil drums and with fifteen oars arranged in three banks one above the other extending from one side. This device was in fact the trial section for a full-scale reconstruction of a Greek trireme.

The trireme was the main warship of most of the navies of the ancient world and in particular was the basis of Athenian sea-power in the 5th century B.C., its crews forming the backbone of the city's radical democracy. As such, this type of ship has always been of considerable interest to scholars, but its precise form and construction have long been the subject of scholarly debate. In particular, armchair-based historians have been very sceptical of the theory which suggested that it had three superimposed banks of oars, all effectively of the same length, as the evidence suggested. In 1982, the latest of many books on the subject was being written by Professor John Morrison of the University of Cambridge and John Coates, an expert on ancient shipping and adviser on the Mary Rose project, and also former Chief Naval Architect at the Ministry of Defence. It was suggested to them that the best way of testing the viability of the above theory, to which they adhered, was to build a full scale replica.

The Trireme Trust was thus set up to do just that, and, when the possibility was investigated, the Greek government came forward and offered to build the ship once the Trust had carried out the research and development and had provided them with a full specification. Construction is now under way at a boatyard in the Piraeus near Athens and will be launched in the late autumn of this year. The ship will then be commissioned into the Greek Navy and will eventually become a central working exhibit at a new National Maritime Museum of Greece.

In the meantime, sea trials will be carried out to determine how the ship handled under oar and sail, how fast it went – it ought to be faster than an eight, how effective the ram, its main weapon, might have been, and so on. As I write, it is not yet clear whether these will be held in April or in summer of 1987, but this will be determined by July of this year. At least 170 oarspersons will be required and the trials will be arranged as a two-week holiday with daily outings in the trireme. EXCERPT FROM THE O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR BUMPING RACES

57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.

58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.

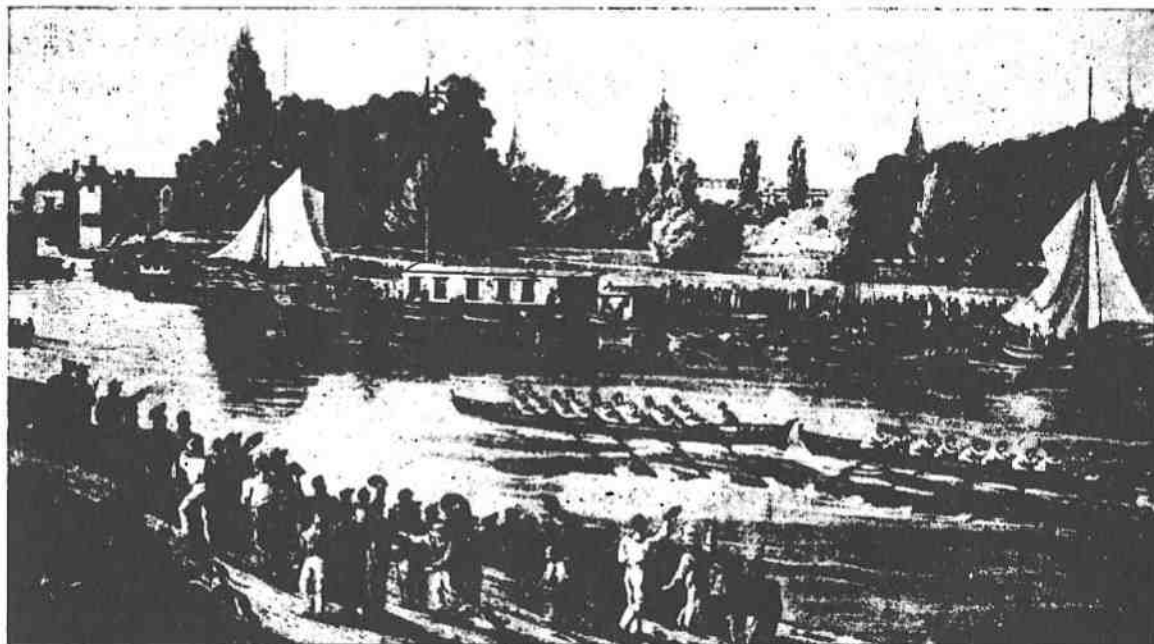
65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .

67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.

69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.
