

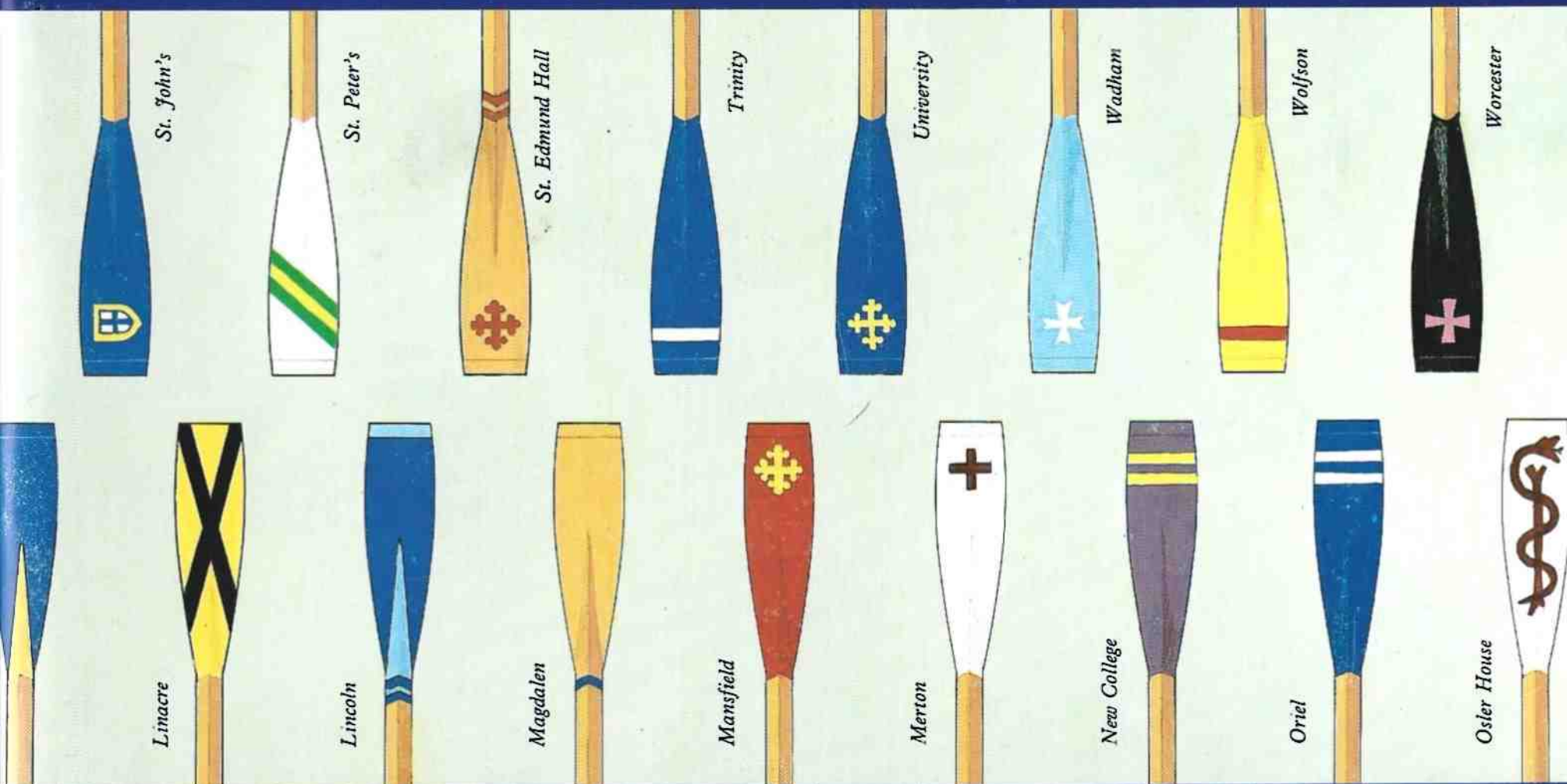

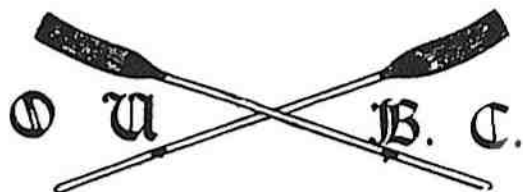

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Following the well published traumas earlier in the year, the Oxford crew arrived at Putney as underdogs to a very confident Cambridge boat. After a series of indifferent performances against other crews, morale was at a low ebb and Dan Topolski decided on a series of gambles. With one week to go, he removed the crew from the spotlight of the Tideway to the quiet reaches of the upper Thames at Walton. The plastic oars were exchanged for a wooden set, the rig considerably stiffened, and the middle four of the crew moved to the stern. Morale and performance improved immediately, and we returned to the Tideway sensing that events might be turning our way. We had proved ourselves to be fast in rough water, we had the best oars for bad conditions, and on Race day, the weather turned from bad to worse. We won the toss and chose Middlesex, gambling that the wind would shift as forecast. As those who saw the race will know, Oxford won in great style: a triumph of tactics, opportunism, superbly judged coxing and very fine rowing.

Isis traditionally eclipse the Blue Boat in the closeness and excitement of their contest with Goldie. This year was no exception. Isis lead Goldie off the start, in even rougher conditions than those we experienced later, but by halfway Goldie had drawn level. As the crews passed under Barnes Bridge, Goldie had almost a length and Isis gambled on a dramatic switch of station for the calmer water and the inside of the final bend. They were unable to make up the distance and lost by just one length. In doing so, Isis had reduced their deficit of 19 seconds to Goldie at Kingston a week earlier to 3 seconds.

The retirement of Dan Topolski as Chief Coach at Oxford is truly the end of an era. Topolski, often described in the press as a renaissance man, was the architect of the renaissance in Oxford rowing after years of Cambridge dominance. Under his guidance, Oxford have won twelve of the last fourteen Boat Races, ten of them consecutively.

Topolski will never ask his crew to do anything he has not done himself, and usually done better. He rowed in two Boat Races, winning the first and losing the second; was a World Champion in 1977; and has been among the nation's fastest scullers. He still out-sculls all but two or three in the squad, and always finishes in the top half of training runs. In 1984 he was coach with the Olympic Team.

As a coach, Topolski is a uniquely eloquent, articulate and vivid communicator, and an inspirational motivator. His approach is always flexible and undogmatic, his judgements a nice balance of the rational and the intuitive. His understanding of the Tideway and the tactics of the Boat Race is unrivalled.

Dan is a paradoxical blend of non-conformist and traditionalist, with an intense loyalty to Oxford and Oxford rowing. He is clearly one of the great Boat Race coaches, and, as the second shows, the greatest ever Oxford coach. Everyone who loves rowing at Oxford has much to thank him for.

President's Report 1987

OXFORD UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BOAT CLUB

SUMMER EIGHTS 1986

Eights' Week last year was not blessed by outstanding weather: none of the days was entirely free from rain, and Saturday was a little spoilt by constant drizzle. This combined with the controversy surrounding the Headship to produce a rather strange atmosphere.

It was indeed sad that spectators were denied the chance to see what had promised to be a splendid race between **Oriel** and **New College**; these two were far and away the fastest crews out, the Head crew, **Christ Church**, having been convincingly beaten by Oriel at a regatta some weeks previously. They were quickly bumped by New College on the first day: on the second day, however, they were having a hard job holding off Oriel when they discovered that they had themselves bumped New College, whom an equipment failure had forced to stop in the Gut. So close indeed had Oriel been to the House that they had for a moment thought they had bumped them, and missed a couple of strokes before powering off again. The third day was a repeat of the first, and on the last day, Oriel rowed past Christ Church to take over second place.

Though not quite in the same class as the top three, **University** had little trouble in maintaining fourth place, and showed their worth at Henley where they pushed Marlow RC to record the fastest time of the day, in a very good race. Elsewhere in the First Division, **Worcester** won their blades: their third bump, **Magdalen**, were unlucky to go down again on the last day when their rudder gave out and they careered into the bank. New arrivals were **Wadham**, who also won their blades.

In the Women's First Division, **Somerville** rose, as their legend under Donnington Bridge states, from fifth position to Head in two days: this was achieved by an overbump on **St. Hugh's** on the first day and a bump on the Head crew, **Osler House**, on the second. St. Hugh's then found themselves behind their own second crew, **St. Hugh's II**, but did not catch them until the last day, after they had both been bumped by **St. Anne's**. In this division too the new arrivals were blade-winners, namely **Pembroke**, gaining their college a bump supper.

TORPIDS 1987

Though the term started off with some amazingly low temperatures, and the Isis was frozen for the first week or so, the weather during Torpids was decidedly less inclement than last year, when the third day of racing was lost due to ice. None of the days was, however, entirely free from rain.

The Headship was held, as expected, by **Oriel**, with a very fast crew – not perhaps quite as fast as last year's, though – which had lately been reshuffled to accommodate Dan Lyons, the World Champion from America; he declared himself to reporters as "honoured" to row in the crew. **Keble** again held on to second place, perhaps more decisively than last year, despite keeping everyone guessing in training by staying in fours for most of the term. The third spot was taken over by **Pembroke**, who had also reshuffled their crew, due to illness, and had received O.U.B.C. dispensation to include a female member of another college, namely Miss ZaZa Horne of St. Antony's, a member of the Women's National Squad.

Elsewhere in the First Division, **Oriel II** fell on the last day as **Worcester's** third victims: the next highest second boat is now eighteen places below. **Hertford** gained their blades and moved up into the First Division, while **Exeter** underwent a spectacular drop. Colleges moving up at the top of the Second Division were **Balliol** (three places), **Trinity** (two places) and **Magdalen**, who reversed last year's drop and climbed two. At the bottom of the division, **Jesus** began their long climb after last year's drop of fourteen places, which was mainly due to their foundering when they struck a submerged lump of ice which split the shell of their boat. This year, they climbed three places.

The top of the Third Division was impressive this year, especially on the Friday; **Christ Church II** just managed to stave off **Oriel III**, who fell on the last day to **L.M.H.**, a first boat which has been climbing steadily ever since the college first admitted men, gaining in most years, as this year, their blades. Another Third Division first boat, **Merton**, rose three places, as they did last year. Among the new arrivals in the division was **Hertford II**, whose rise of seven places was commendable.

A thrilling chase along the Greenbank on the Saturday resulted in **Somerville**, with two bumps already under their belts, deposing **Osler House** from the Women's Headship. They then rowed back to their boathouse with their cox at stroke. Lower down in the same division, **Brasenose** and **St. Hugh's II** won their blades, as did **New College**, **Hertford** and **Christ Church** in the Women's Second Division. An even more unfortunate drop than that of the Exeter men was undergone by **St. Hilda's**, who fell fifteen places.

OXFORD ROWING

In Eights Week, Oxford rowing reaches the zenith of its appeal. The harsh and cold days of early Hilary and the sterner test of Torpids are only a distant memory, though they are largely responsible for Summer Eights attaining any decent standard at all; the attractions of Trinity term are too many and too delightful to allow serious crews to restrict their training to the five weeks before Eights Week. The sport itself assumes a more pleasant nature in the summer, and one begins to see why one spends two or more hours a day on the river; spectators, friends and parents, accumulate, often combining a visit to the Isis with one to a college summer show.

Despite all this, though, college rowing becomes more serious and relevant to the sport as a whole in the summer. Those who rowed for the Blue Boat, Isis or the University Lightweights in the preceding term have returned to boost the standard of their college boats. Among the thronging crowds there are not a few correspondents for the national press, and some of the best coaches and oarsmen in the country will have helped to train the first division crews. The college that holds or wins the headship of Summer Eights is regarded as Head of the River, a higher status in theory than Head of Torpids.

The Eights differ from the Torpids in several ways, some connected with factors already mentioned, others not. The name "Torpids" has caused a certain amount of discussion; torpor is a commodity hard to find on the Isis in early March, descending more frequently on the lazy afternoon punting sessions of high summer. But the name seems to refer to the sluggish quality of the crews – who were originally obliged to row in heavy, clinker boats – in comparison with the summer crews. A happy etymological connexion with the torpedo – named after the torpedo fish or electric ray, which traps its prey by casting a torpor over it – conjures up a more reliable picture of the speed of the top Torpids crew.

Crews in both Torpids and Eights are set off with one and a half lengths of clear water between them, twelve boats to a division. But whereas the present system of Torpids decrees that a crew when bumped must continue (and be bumped again and again, if necessary), in Summer Eights both bumping and bumped crews stop. This tends to a much greater "do-or-die" attitude among oarsmen and coxes, since if they concede to a bump, that is the end of their rowing for the day; whereas in Torpids they may yet carry on and get a bump themselves.

The same system applies in each competition to the crew at the head of a division: they must row again as the thirteenth or "sandwich" boat in the next division up, and try to bump up into it. If they fail in this, they remain at the head of their original division.

Whereas Torpids has seven divisions for men and four for women, in the summer these numbers are increased to nine and five. Of these, the top six and three respectively are "fixed", that is to say that the starting position for a crew in them is determined by its finishing position last year. The bottom divisions are "rowing-on" divisions, as to gain a place in them, a crew has to qualify by "rowing on" or "getting on". This entails rowing over a set distance – usually from Tims Boathouse to the top – within a certain time. If this is achieved, the crew takes up the place finished in by last year's equivalent crew, or a place at the very bottom if no such crew existed.

Though other competitions exist, Torpids and Eights are the highlights of college rowing, and nowhere else – even at Eton and the University of London, where it also exists – does bumps racing assume such importance (except, possibly, at a little-known Fenland academy.) Some very good crews have rowed Head of Eights: the 1980 Oriel VIII would have been made up entirely of University and Isis oarsmen had not Chris Mahoney, President of OUBC that year been unable to row as he was in Moscow as part of the British Olympic VIII. This was considered a good enough reason for absence, especially as he brought back a silver medal.

But the tide turns and the pendulum swings, and different colleges hold sway over Oxford rowing at different times, always to the frustration and the perplexity of others. The supremacy of Christ Church when organized rowing was in its youth was almost total; the numbers of Etonians rowing successfully for Magdalen just before the turn of the century must have been daunting; and Keble and St. Edmund Hall operated a no doubt very annoying exclusive double act all through the Sixties. The rôles of colleges change; if Anthony Powell described Brasenose in the Twenties as a "pre-eminently 'hearty' college," in those days of sharp distinction between hearties and aesthetes, this must be so. It may not be true that every dog has his day in Oxford rowing, but every dog that works hard for it may be rewarded with a decade (or two) at the top.

O.U.B.C. TRIALS

The emphasis within O.U.B.C. this year is to develop the talent within the colleges. To this end the new President Chris Penney would like to invite *anyone* interested in either the heavyweight or lightweight squad to trial in 6th week. Further information is available from your college captain.

HISTORY OF EIGHTS WEEK

When you watch Eights Week at Oxford you are witnessing a little bit of England's social history. This method of racing, unique to Oxford and Cambridge – where similar races started some twelve years later than on the Isis – began in a peculiarly British way, without any planning or particular intent. At Oxford University there were young men seeking agreeable recreation; at Nuneham and Sandford there were popular hostelries; and at Iffley there was a lock on the river. Boats were hired and crews rowed down river on summer evenings to dine or picnic. On the return journey, when the gates opened at Iffley, they set off in pursuit, of one another.

The first recorded 'Head of the River' crew was Brasenose, in 1815. By 1825 there were too many crews to be accommodated all together in Iffley lock, so the races were started from posts on the bank above the lock – but crews continued to go down to the Sandford reach, and to return through Iffley until 1839. At the conclusion of each day's racing the flags of the competing crews were run up at Mr. King's boathouse, below Folly Bridge, and all the crews processed past them in salute.

The earliest surviving Rules date from 1840, when the boats were started at 100 feet intervals, and there was "a night for every boat". The theory of this was that even the last crew could reach the top if it scored a bump every night. Racing did not necessarily take place on consecutive nights, nor did every crew appear every day. In 1840, for example, Balliol started 2nd, "took off" on the third night after being bumped by Wadham, "put on" again at the bottom of the river and made two bumps to finish 8th, six days later. In all, 14 started racing on June 2nd and 11 finished on the final day, June 19th.

The weaker rowing colleges were permitted to combine to produce crews and occasionally did so. Twenty years later there were complaints that too many of the stronger colleges were "getting up old men" to strengthen their crews at times of crisis. Brasenose, Exeter, Magdalen and Christ Church all did this in 1864. The Exeter captain's book reports in 1869 that "Non-appearance in Chapel was held tantamount to ejection from the crew" – which perhaps offers a clue as to why so many rowing men in the Victorian era became Bishops.

A second Division was introduced for the first time in 1874, and in 1878 the racing was reduced to six days. Racing remained at 6 days, starting on Thursday and finishing on Wednesday until 1954 when the present arrangement of four days was introduced.

Bumping races have their critics, mainly on the grounds that they encourage crews to concentrate on speed

off the mark without cruising pace or staying power. There is some truth in this, but it is not so much the system of racing as the geography of the river at Oxford which must be blamed. And Bumping Races do have considerable merits. They cater for all standards from the deadly serious and dedicated crews at the top of the First Division, to the 'fun' crews, often made up of rugger players, cricketers and scholars at the other end of the scale. And they provide a fine spectacle which has become a major social occasion in the University year.

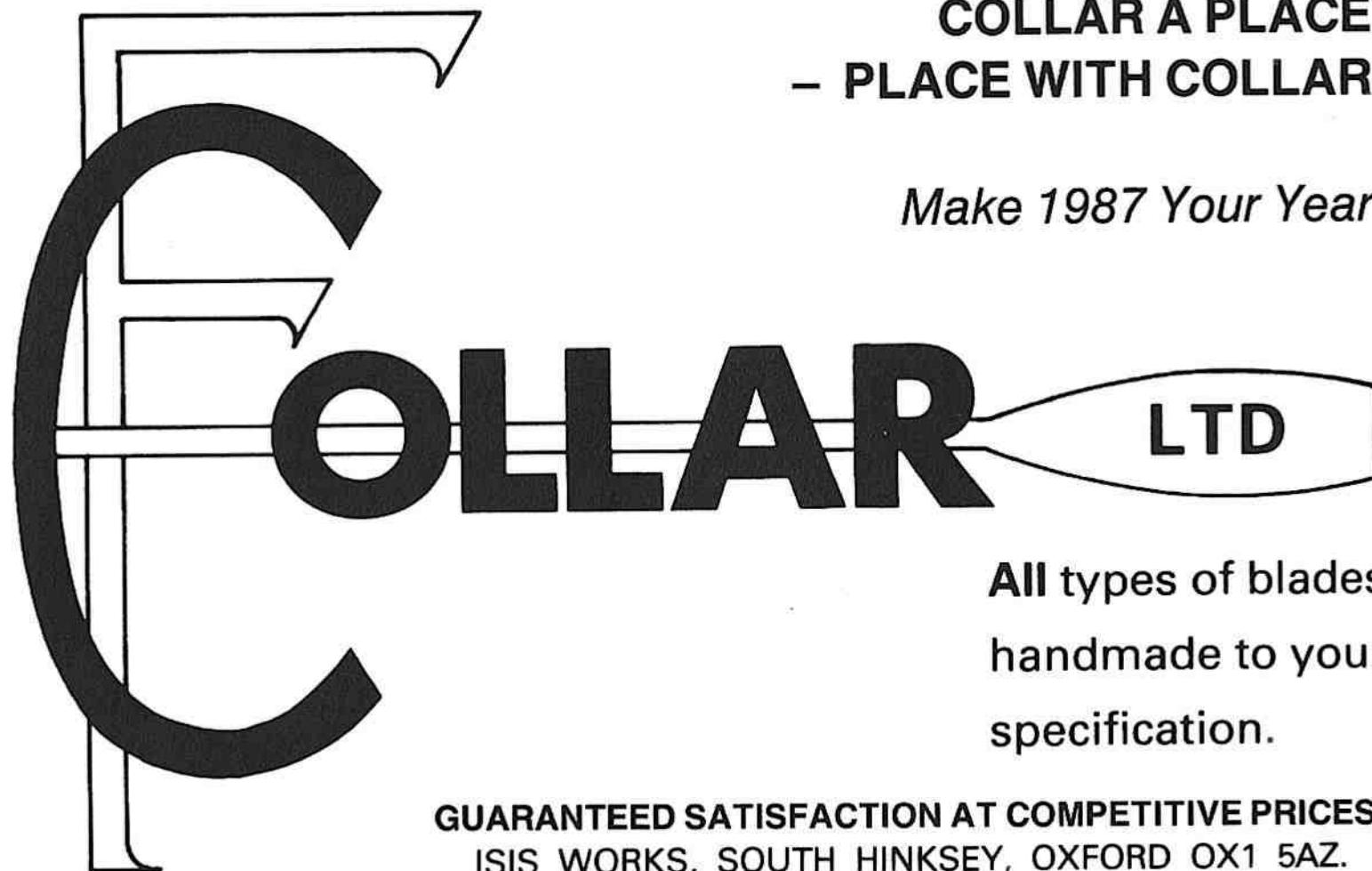

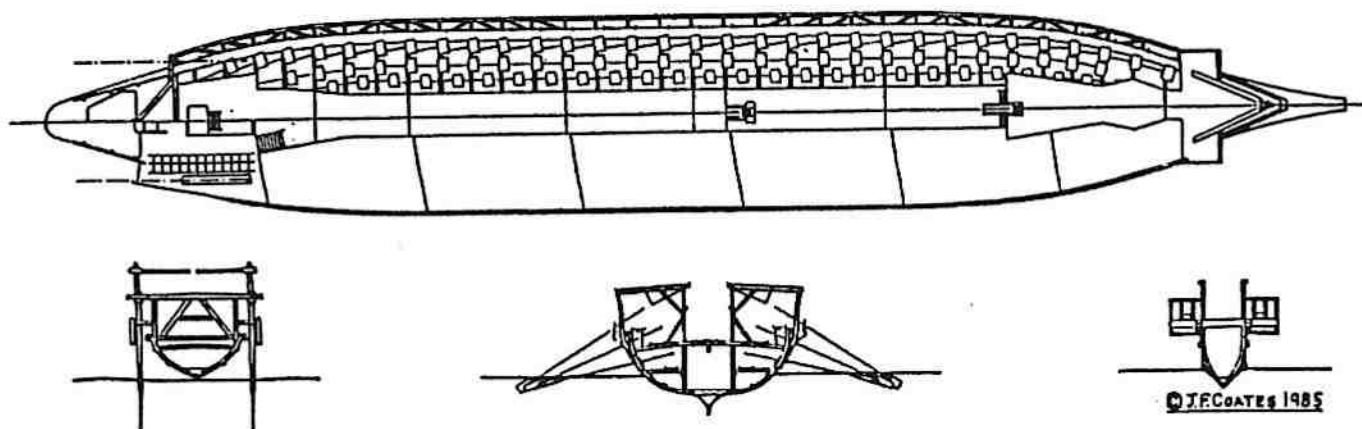

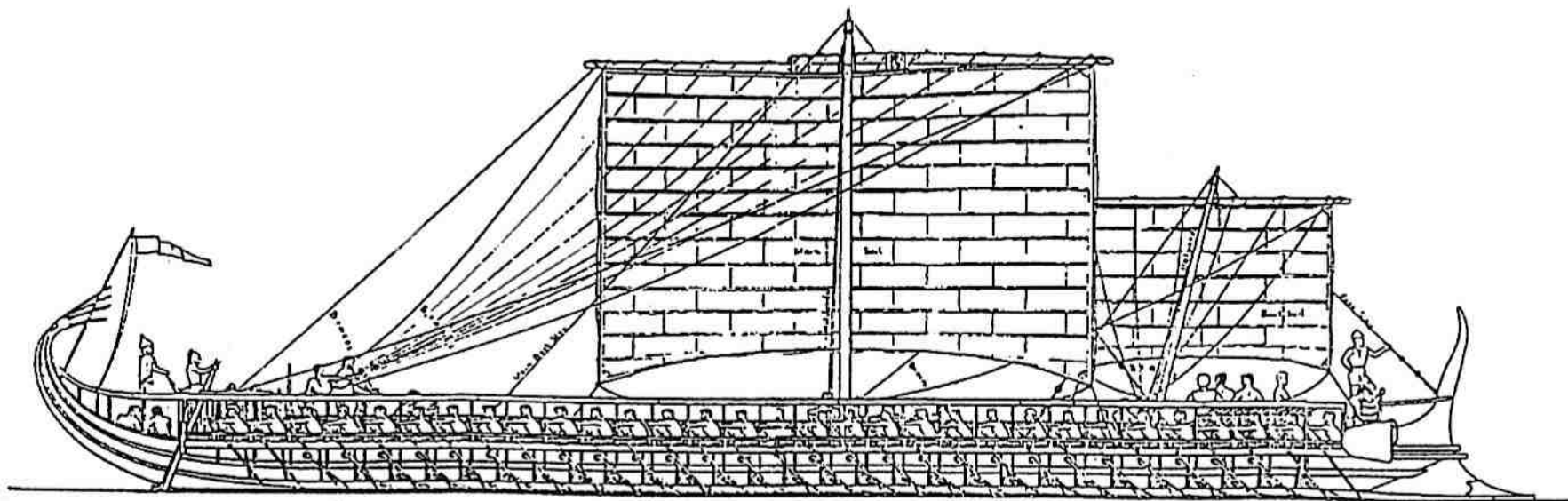
TRIREME UNDER OAR: 1-15 AUGUST 1987

On 1 August this year some 400 *trieritai* will gather in Piraeus to see the 'launching' of the reconstructed trireme at a ceremony which will mark the beginning of crew training and sea trials of the ship. She has been built at the expense of the Greek authorities in the boatyard of Dimitris Tsakokos to the designs and specifications of the Trireme Trust and closely supervised by its distinguished naval architect John Coates. (In fact the ship will necessarily have been put into the water earlier for various tests). A fortnight's training of both a Greek and a predominantly British crew will culminate in a grand ceremony on 15 August at which a famous ship will make her first public appearance under oar for 1500 years.

One of the two crews to undergo training has been recruited from Greek rowing clubs; the other, organised by the Trust, is made up of 190 + men and women from British rowing clubs joined by a contingent of about ten from a Brittany rowing club. The largest British contingent comes from Oxford University (45:20 from Oriel). There are thirteen from Cambridge, and the remaining 2/3rds come from rowing clubs in all parts of Britain. All the members of the Trust's crew are paying for their own transport to and from Athens. The Greek Ministry of Culture is providing free accommodation at Poros. The Trust is indebted to the Aurelius Trust and Dr M.F.B. Fitch C.B.E. for a generous grant towards the expenses of the trust in the sea trials.

Poros has been chosen for reasons which anyone who has been there will appreciate. It is a very pleasant place and has good communications with Piraeus across the Saronic Gulf by ship and hydrofoil. More importantly, the island of Poros shelters a large area of water from the NE, the direction from which the *melteme* wind is liable to blow in August. Since the weather will be hot, particularly at midday, the ship will





be taken out under oar in the early part of the morning (once by each crew) and in the later afternoon (again once by each crew). There will be a permanent Greek helmsman and deckcrew.

The oarcrew's first task will be to learn the drill for going aboard and ashore, for pulling and manoeuvring a 170 oared ship, and then to learn how to harmonise the stroke at different rates of striking. Its next task will be to cover shorter and longer timed runs and to develop the techniques of quick turns and backing water. There will also be opportunities for using the ship's sails and of exploring the potentiality of the ship under sail in various conditions of wind and weather. A BBC television crew under producer Mike Purton will be on hand throughout the fortnight ashore and afloat to make what they can of the proceedings. By the time of the public ceremony on 15 August both oarcrews (not of course in competition) will be in a position to show off the ship, which was famous in antiquity for its acceleration, speed and manoeuvrability, with power and style.

Boris Rankov is the British pulling master, assisted by James and Peter Macleod, all three well known in rowing circles. Dr Michael Budd is the 'ship's doctor', and since the enterprise is also a serious archaeological experiment, Ian Whitehead, one of the crew of Tim Severin's *Argo*, is Recorder assisted by Graeme Fife and Dr R.B. Leitch. They will have the task of monitoring the performance of the ship, and the physical reactions of the crew in the various parts of the ship. Mrs Rosie Randolph, who has been in charge of enrolments, is the ship's purser. John Coates, Frank Welsh and John Morrison will be highly interested (but not of course anxious) observers, and will watch with eager anticipation for the signal to be run up 'Trireme Under Oar'.

OXFORD PUNTING

“The Cherwell’s not what it was, especially on a Sunday. More like Bank Holiday at Margate, with gramophones and bathing dresses and everybody barging into everybody else”. Perhaps it is best that Lord Peter Wimsey and Harriet Vane never lived to see an age when ‘Punter’ had taken on a whole new meaning. We, like Wimsey, associate punting with languid summer afternoons, champagne and boatered patricians at play. Yet the origin of the punt is plebeian. Before the mid-nineteenth century a punt was any small craft. The earliest punts were used to ford rivers and the similarities between the gallic ‘pontoon’, latin ‘pons’ and sanskrit ‘pathi’ are no accident.

The punt, easy to manoeuvre, capacious, and able to move in very shallow water was the ideal means of transport throughout the Thames Valley before 1770, when the river was deepened by locks. Punts were used for all sorts of transport needs. The barges, with sails added, plied the mud flats of the East Coast, as well as the shallow parts of the Thames Estuary. Ballast punts dredged gravel needed for road making from the bed of the river. Beer was delivered to the Isis Tavern by punt until recently. Work punts were used to repair river banks and locks. But it was from the fishing punt that the modern racing and pleasure punts both originate.

The saloon punt used today at the 3 major punt stations in Oxford, at Folly Bridge, Magdalen Bridge and Bardwell Road, only appeared in the 1880s. They were made of mahogany instead of the sturdier oak of their fishing ancestors – ‘sitters’ and ‘backrests’ completed the picture.

Heavy oak punts had to be ‘walked’ or ‘run’. The punter dropped in the pole at the bow of the punt and walked down it at least three paces pushing or ‘shoving’ the pole. When lighter pleasure punts were developed they were ‘pricked’ stern first from the open end, and this is the traditional part of the punt to prick from, whilst the less courageous Cantabrigienses prefer the false security afforded by the till.

Whilst the enthusiasm shown for racing Eights at Oxford seems to know no bounds, punt racing appears unable to summon the same enthusiasm. Both professional watermen and amateurs raced punts from early in the nineteenth century, and racing clubs on the lower Thames abound. There are still about 8 or 9 annual regattas with punting events.

There are two types of racing punt – 2ft wide punts for novice and doubles racing, and ‘best and best’ punts for seniors and championships which are about 14½ inches wide and 32-35 ft long. A punt race course is 660-880 yards long with a turn so that only half this distance of river is used. It should be 3-4 ft deep with a firm bottom; the punts are double-ended and ‘shoved’. Despite the efforts of Symons-Jeune in organising a punt championship at Oxford in 1905, supported by Merton, New College, Trinity, Oriel,

Christ Church, Queen's and St. John's, the strong commitment to rowing left no room for it.

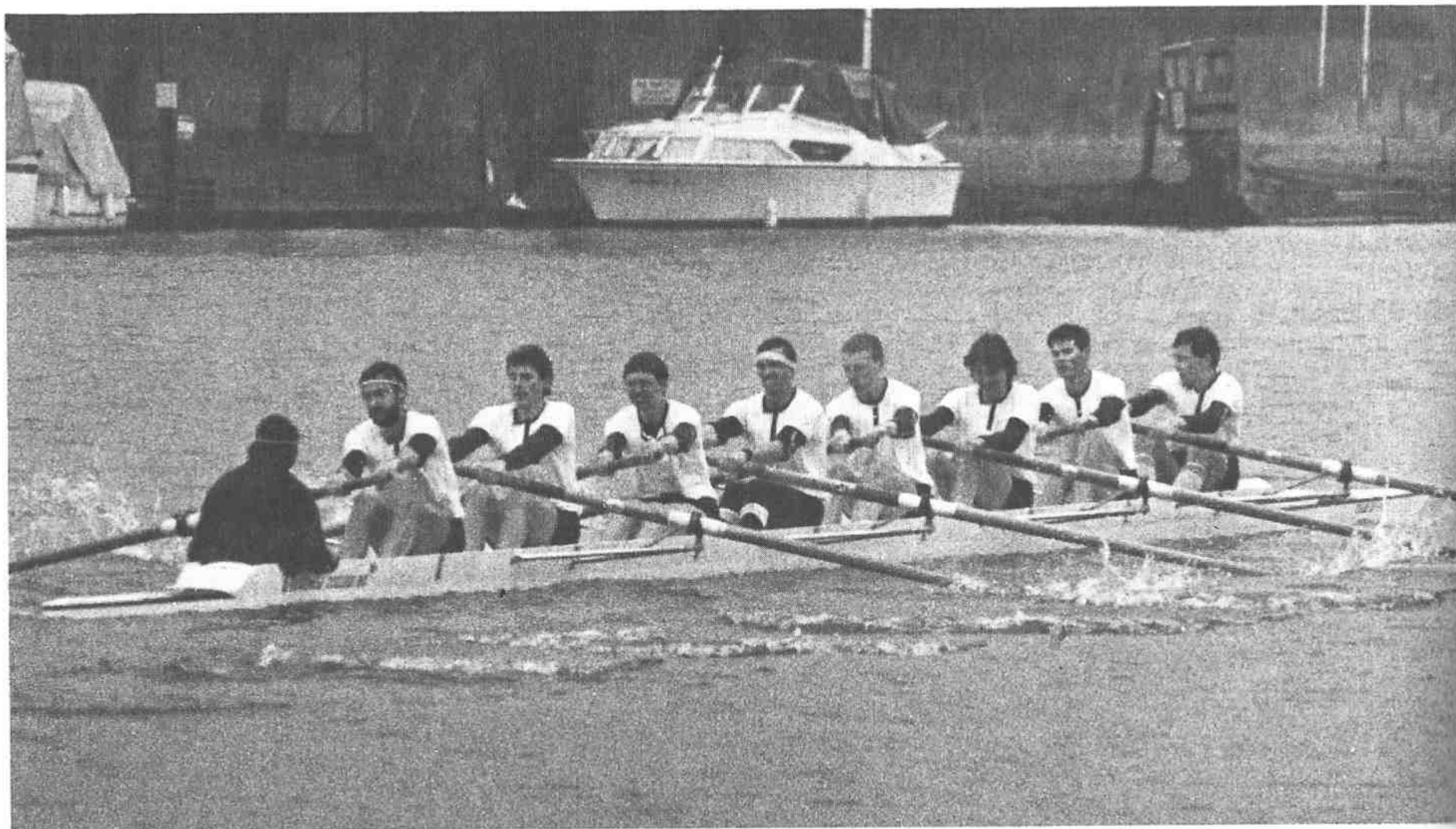
Dongola racing, in punts propelled by a crew of 8, 4-a-side with paddles in fancy dress is another serious watersport sadly absent from the Isis.

Such is the animosity that the rowing fraternity feel towards punters that the tender-hearted should keep well to their right on the river, or risk a coxswain's spleen. Those braver can bate them in the sure knowledge that the solid construction of the punt will shiver the fibreglass bows of the Boat Club's pride without taking more than a scratch.

As an acquaintance of Lord Peter Wimsey remarked of the techniques of punting "either you look graceful or you look ghastly: there is no middle way in punting". Anyone wishing to discover that art should read R.T. Rivington's "Punting: its history and techniques."

EXCERPT FROM THE O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR BUMPING RACES

57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.

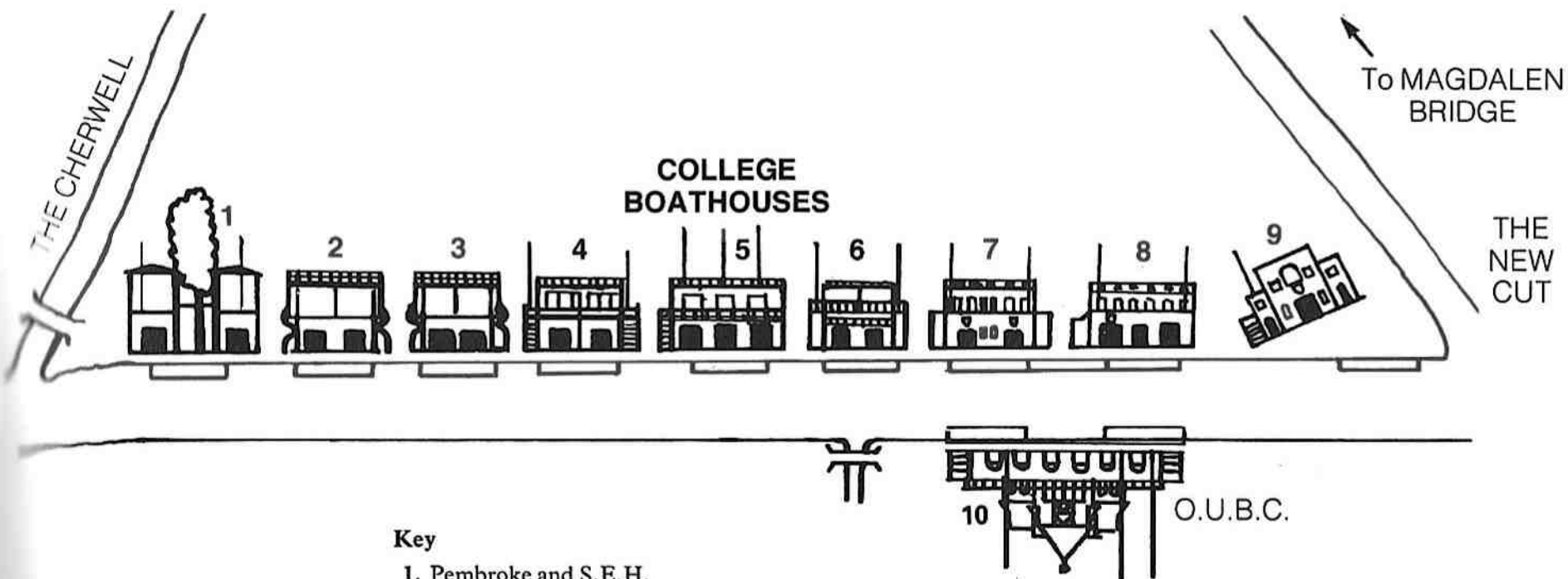
58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.

65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .

67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.

69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.
