O.U.B.C. Report

Despite the misplaced conviction held by press and supporters alike that Oxford would lose this year's boat race thus spoiling a solid run of successive victories, the Blue Boat showed its strength and experience on the day, powering away to win in style. Although Cambridge generally looked neater and technically proficient, much of the criticism levelled at the Oxford crew was unjustified.

Oxford approached the race with confidence in their abilities after a reasonable season of wins, with only one major defeat at the hands of the much fancied U.L. crew.

The race itself saw Cambridge take an early one length lead, but Oxford took advantage of the Surrey Bend to power through their opponents after the four minute mark, setting up a comfortable victory by 41/4 lengths. Though Cambridge had boated what they thought was their strongest crew for some time they were still unable to match the less pretty and supposedly "weak" Oxford crew.

Unfortunately, this year's race was marred by the following press reports which invoked nationwide anti-Oxford feelings. It is a private race foremost and not a vehicle for the media. This year's victory was due to the hard work of many individuals — John Wilson the Chief Coach who gave the whole squad a very good background training programme through Michaelmas and early Trinity terms and Steve Royle, Tim Bramfitt, Fred Smallbone and indeed Mike Spracklen who all contributed considerably to the boat.

Finally, the President, Rupert Obholzer, who despite wandering fingers and a Pre-Raphaelite hair cut, did a fine job in leading the crew to another win, which will hopefully be kept up under the new presidency of Jo Michels.

In the beginning there was the ISIS but it was crowded and full of novices — so we moved to Radley. We were attempting to do more work in small boats — but our two new Janousek Fours were as small as we got. Still, having four 4's meant that we could work on technique and compete within the squad.

We maintained a squad of twenty and spent Michaelmas Term hacking up and down the freezing waters of Radley, with Tessa Miller, our Chief Coach frantically trying to instill a few basics. There were various expeditions to Head Races with the Fours, and we had considerable success at Watney 4's, the 4's Head of the River, Marlow and Tiffin.

The term ended with the trial VIII's coached by John Pilgrim-Morris and Jon Leyne. The race was very close and was re-rowed with the 4 swapped in and the result was reversed – which meant that nearly everybody had a win, and went home for Christmas contented.

After a measly 16 day break for Christmas, Training Camp ensued at Kingston Rowing Club, with the entire squad camped out with Harry, Charlotte and Tessa. Adrian Ellison kept hammering in the technique and Tess ran exhaustive Seat Races. These yielded more racing experience but not many clear results.

Tessa then ran away to sunny Australia for 6 weeks and the squad sulked.

Pauline Bird and Adrian grappled with selection and Tessa returned just in time to make the final, painful decisions. It was a bad period and it left us with a lot to do.

Fortunately Tim Bramfitt, who was coaching the men managed to coach us for several outings a week (whilst cunningly pretending not to), and both boats started to move.

We decided to enter the Women's VIII Head, only a fortnight before the Boat Race. Cambridge failed to get their entry in on time and we started very low down but still managed to finish 9th and 12th and win Senior III. It was an excellent result at just the right moment.

We didn't move to Henley until 3 days before the race which kept Cambridge wandering. . . .

Osiris got the more difficult Bucks Station which gave Blondie the early advantage, Osiris never quite repaired their form and lost to a very strong Cambridge Crew.

The Cambridge Blue Boat won the toss, then to our delight chose the wrong station. Oxford blasted off the start, had a length in 15 strokes and kept increasing this lead to win in 3 lengths.

There was great anticipation at the prospect of this year's racing due to the widely held belief that both the men's and women's head crews were weaker than their immediate rivals. **Oriel** had none of the squad oarsmen so prevalent in recent years whilst **University** boasted one Blue and two Isis oarsmen and **Christ Church** one Blue and three Isis. Similarly in the womens' first division **Osler**, head in 1989, lacked the wealth of University rowers that **Somerville** threatened them with.

The first day's rowing saw **Oriel** unchallenged by **New** and left to row over head as **University** caught the same at the bottom of the Green Bank. This left **Christ Church**, **St. John's** and **Teddy Hall** to row over behind them, **St. John's** pushing **Hall** all the way to the finish.


In the womens' first division **Osler** rowed over as **Somerville** removed **Wadham** from second on the river.

Thursday brought both head crews into direct conflict with their strongest rivals. **Oriel** held their own through the Gut but were rowed down and bumped by **University** halfway up the boathouses. **Osler** succumbed to **Somerville** in an almost identical fashion.

On Friday it remained to be seen whether the deposed crews could mount a realistic challenge to the new head crews. **Oriel** closed to within half a length of **University** entering the Gut but could not maintain this pace onto the Green Bank, falling to **Christ Church** at the top of the boathouses. **Osler** too conceded a bump to **Pembroke** who moved up to challenge for the headship on the final day's racing.

Elsewhere in the divisions **Jesus** broke into the first division with their third bump, whilst **St. John's** in bumping **Teddy Hall**, and **Oriel II** in bumping **Lincoln** overpowered crews whom they had unsuccessfully chased on the previous two days.

On the final day's racing both **University** and **Somerville** fended off with some ease the challenges of **Christ Church** and **Pembroke** respectively to row over head of the river. Both **Jesus** and **LMH** gained their blades in the men's divisions whilst there was a dearth of bladewinners amongst the women's crews.

It is unfortunate that in years to come Torpids 1991 will undoubtedly be remembered not so much for it's racing but for controversy before the event had even begun. Individual interpretations will vary in the apportionment of blame but, surely, it will be generally agreed that it was a great shame for Torpids that the Headship had to be decided in the way that it was.

The series of events leading up to the demotion of **Oriel** from Head of the River began when **Oriel** and **Oriel II**, albeit unwittingly, flouted a rowing ban on the frozen river during a bitterly cold spell shortly before the bumps. A penalty of four technical bumps was seen to be in order for **Oriel** and the two **Wadham** first boats who had behaved in a similar manner. When Wednesday of Torpids arrived, therefore, it was **Christ** 

Church who prepared to race from the head station.


The result of the above drama was to treat spectators to some fascinating racing between **Christ Church** and **Oriel** – the latter having comfortably bumped **New College** and **Brasenose** on the first two days. Although **Oriel** started strongly and even closed to within inches on Saturday the lighter House crew rowed very well under extreme pressure to repulse the challenges and finish clear on both days. Further down the division blades were won in fine style by **University** and **Pembroke** to leave them fifth and seventh respectively. It was a sad week for **Hertford** who, having made no impression on **Oriel II**, dropped out of the division after a collision with the bank on Saturday.

In the women's races the Headship was also to change hands. Despite rowing neatly and aggressively **Osler House** were unable to hold off the impressive **Somerville** who had started in second place. The college now holds the Headships of Torpids and Eights. **Wadham** were unable to regain the ground they had lost through technical bumps despite having been widely tipped to do so.



#### **OUBC Ferry**

### Brains and Brawn

The perfect English undergraduate, effortlessly excelling at games and studies, is a type familiar to us from fiction: elsewhere he comes in for hard knocks as being unreal, outdated, irrelevant, Much as dons laud the Homeric ideal in Homer, attempts to attain it in practise are treated with scorn. Figures such as Dean Farrar's Julian Home - Firsts in Mods and Greats and a rowing blue - and Sandy Arbuthnott and the other 'Buchaneers' are rejected as unrealistic. "Absurd", says Richard Jenkyns in The Victorians and Ancient Greece, and even Noel Annan's chapter 'The Insufferable Ideal' in Our Age partakes of the scepticism. Present-day realists point out that Blues with Firsts were few and far between: most sportsmen. in 1900, were passmen as well. If one mentions C.B. Fry, it is gently pointed out that he followed up his first in Mods with a third in Greats: and in any case, he was exceptional. The same presumably goes for the two Oriel paragons of the twenties, Macpherson and Peterson: both got firsts in Mods and Greats; the former captained Oxford and Scotland at Rugby, the latter Oxford at Football; both also played for the Authentics.

Despite these examples, the scepticism is to a large extent justified by our tendency to examine only the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. By this time the notion of the University turning out the all-round man, groomed for stardom in all its aspects, à la Peel and Gladstone, had become badly tarnished. One need only think of Charles Ryder's cousin Jasper, at the beginning of *Brideshead Revisited*: "a considerable man in college", he was Secretary of the Canning, JCR President, and nearly a rowing blue — and insufferable with it. The division between hearty and aesthete was then at its sharpest, and had been visible from the midnineteenth century on. In these circumstances, the sceptics are right to consider Julian Home as unrealistic as that deliberate pastiche of a paragon, Max Beerbohm's Duke of Dorset in *Zuleika Dobson*.

But there is one way to see some real-life paragons in the flesh, and that is to go back closer to the age of Peel and Gladstone. Not they themselves – despite their academic and political excellence, they had little time for sport, though Gladstone walked prodigious distances. But roughly contemporary with the regularization of university studies – the first published class lists in Oxford in 1800, with Maths distinct from Greats in 1807, and the first Classical Tripos at Cambridge in 1824 – a similar trend had been acting on sport,

most notably with the first Boat Race in 1829, preceded by the first recorded bumps racing at Oxford in 1815. This much is a matter of history, eloquently recounted by G.M. Young in Early Victorian England. What is often missed is that many individuals were involved in both trends, by virtue of succeding in the new competitive atmosphere of both academics and sport.

Pride of place must go to two Harrovians, Charles Merivale of St John's Cambridge, and Charles Wordsworth of Christ Church. Both had played in the first Eton-Harrow cricket match in 1824, Wordsworth as captain. Both rowed in the first Boat Race in 1829, of which Merivale had been prime mover. Wordsworth, nephew of the poet, son of the Master of Trinity Cambridge and brother of two other dons, took the Chancellor's Latin Verse Prize in 1827 and a first in Greats in 1830, becoming a Student of Christ Church and, much later, Bishop of St Andrews. Merivale was Browne Medallist in 1829 and 4th overall in the Classical Tripos (i.e. '4th Classic') in 1831. Interestingly, his father John Herman Merivale, "eminently a reading man" and a friend of Byron, had complained when up at Cambridge himself of the lack of organized sport. The oarsman's two brothers excelled on the academic side.

Four oarsmen in that first Boat Race later took firsts. Of the others, three nonetheless became dons, including a Fellow of All Souls. It would be tedious to list them all, but two in the Cambridge boat deserve mention. At 7, George Selwyn, later Bishop of New Zealand, in whose memory Selwyn College was founded, was 2nd Classic in 1831: his brother William was a superb scholar, being Senior Classic and 6th Wrangler (i.e. 6th in Maths) in 1828, and later Professor of Divinity; and his son John, later Bishop of Melanesia and Master of Selwyn, rowed for Cambridge in 1864-66.

At stroke was William Snow: his elder brother had been one of the founders of LMBC a few years before, as well as winning the Browne Medal for classics and going on to father Herbert Snow (later Herbert Kynaston), who rowed for Cambridge in 1856 & 57, was joint Senior Classic in 1857, was a mountaineer, and at home in 5 or 6 languages.

Perusal of the Boat Race and university records will furnish other examples: W.H. Waddington, a blue for Cambridge in 1848, 2nd Classic in 1949, briefly Prime Minister of France in 1879, later French Ambassador to London, and an eminent archaeologist (though despite all this, Disraeli hoped

he would not be assassinated because that would make assassination ridiculous); Edward Macnaghten, Cambridge blue in 1852, 3rd Classic the same year, later a judge of great renown; George Denman, who rowed for Cambridge with his brother 1841 & 42, Senior Classic in the latter year; William Awdry, of Balliol, a blue in 1863, a first in Mods and Greats, and President of the Union in 1866; Gilbert Bourne, a later case, a blue for Oxford in 1882 & 83, son, father and grandfather of rowing blues, a fellow of New College with a first in Natural Science.

These are just some of the more startling instances. Others can be adduced to illustrate particular themes no longer present. The 1852 Oxford blue boat had at stroke Joseph Chitty, later a Q.C. and famous as the umpire of the only dead-heated Boat Race in 1877: he had taken a first in Greats the year before and was already a Fellow of Exeter. In 1848 and 49 he had also won Cricket blues. At bow was Kenrick Prescot, who took his first in 1852, and became a Fellow of Merton, where he stroked the college VIII with considerable success for several years. Cambridge also used dons: at cox and bow in the 1841 crew, along with the brothers Denman, were the brothers Croker. Bow, at 9 st 12 lb, had been 9th Wrangler in 1839: cox, at 10 st 8 lb, had been 8th ditto in 1840; both were now Fellows of Caius.

Another point can be made with reference to the six-man in the same boat, Francis Penrose, later Surveyor of St Paul's, Director of the British School at Athens and an astronomer. His eldest brother was a Fellow of Lincoln: his second brother, Charles, a Bell Scholar, had had a kind of annus mirabilis in 1839 when he had got a winning blue with Cambridge, been 2nd Classic, and won the Grand Challenge Cup at the first Henley Regatta with 1st Trinity. These three were nephews of Dr Arnold, Headmaster of Rugby, and were thus positioned at the heart of what Annan called the Intellectual Aristocracy. (In his article of that title, Annan discusses the Penroses, but makes no mention of their athletic successes.) The same can be said for Wordsworths, Denmans and Merivales.

Montion of the 'Intellectual Aristocracy' draws us towards a conclusion. The aristocrats in Annan's hierarchy were those aminently successful men (and women) who postdated and


thrived on the reorganized academia we have mentioned. At or near the root of this was a sense of competition: prize fellowships, class lists, exam scholarships, things that are sublimated these days, abounded from the 1820s on. It was the same with sport, and athletic achievement was for a time genuinely regarded as a valid string to the bow of even the most serious gentleman, rather than an amusement for duffers. Indeed, as the later writings of Charles Wordsworth make clear, it was inseparable from other modes of achievement, being born of the same spirit.

Many have pointed out that, with regard to academia, regularization and competition eventually stultified original thought. Housman's crack about the year 1825, by various means, seeing the end of English Classical Scholarship, was linked by M.L. Clarke to the foundation of the Classical Tripos at Cambridge the year before. Classics was at length, it is argued, reduced to a conveyor-belt system, with thousands of small boys learning irregular verbs and drudging through Caesar and Horace. And something analogous may have happened with regard to sport, and in particular rowing: the era of invention — the setting up of the Boat Race, of college races, and of organized sport as a whole — was over. By the end of the century, thinking sportsmen were rarer, the road to a Blue being clearly defined, and clearly distinct from that towards a First. Hence the situation described at the outset.

But this did not take place immediately. The phase of all-round success described above should not be seen simply as a transitional one: transitional phases are historical inventions. The era in which a student could realistically hope to be an all-rounder was long enough to merit separate treatment. Just as bright minds benefitted from the new approach to learning, so eagerness in athleticism was rewarded. The two often thrived in close proximity. It has been noted that there was a point in the 1840s when Oriel, filled with bright young dons, looked as if it might start a renaissance of classical scholarship, before it was waylaid by the Tractarian controversy. An oarsmen hardly needs reminding that it was in 1842 that Oriel, under the benign leadership of George Hughes, the perfect Englishman (with blues for rowing and cricket, and a second in Greats), won the Headship for the first time.

### Lightweights 1991

LUKE HOWARD OULRC President Trials began in Trinity Term 1990 following Summer Eights. An extensive squad produced two Eights and a Coxless Four, from which an Eight was chosen to race at Henley Regatta, accompanied by the Four. These continued through the Regatta season, and the Coxless Four won at Marlow, Richmond and Bedford. Trialling subsequently continued into Michaelmas Term, using the Abingdon and Radley stretches, from which a squad of sixteen was entered into Kingston Small Boats Head. OULRC came away as the most successful club, winning the Victor Ludorum Trophy for its three wins — Senior 1 and 2 Coxless Fours and Senior 2 Coxed Fours.

These successes were bedded down with further training at Abingdon and Radley, with occasional weekends spent at Holme Pierrepoint in Nottingham.

Two graded trial Eights were formed as term ended and were pitted against the OUBC Heavyweight 3rd VIII and Development Squad. The Lightweight A crew waxed the 3rd VIII by 1½ lengths and the B crew emerged victors by 4 lengths over the Development Squad (both raced over the full boat race course from Putney to Mortlake). Pairing at Shiplake followed these races.

The squad was cut to twelve at the beginning of Hilary Term, and following still further selection an Eight was formed a week later. The Eight expected to race suffered complications due to injuries, before eventually being finalised. This crew produced yet more promising results at Reading Head and against Isis, Notts County (the National Lightweights) and Thames Tradesmen, following Torpids.

The final week of training before the confrontation unfortunately yielded personal problems disrupting training, so that the final line up had only four outings before the race.

On the day, Oxford had a good start in rough conditions, gaining a 3/4 length advantage over Cambridge in a matter of 15 strokes. This was held untill the middle of the race, at which point lack of togetherness due to the recent crew changes started to take their toll, and Cambridge were allowed to slowly edge back. With 150 m remaining the crews were level, and in one of the most exciting finishes in recent years, Cambridge rating 42 to Oxford's 39, nipped in front to take the race by a mere 6 feet.

Oth week of Michaelmas saw the beginning of trials, a timed erg and my diet. The number of triallists was down on last year, though the standard of rowing was higher. After two weeks training on the Isis, the squad was cut to 14 rowers, 4 of which were in last year's Blue Boat, and we moved to Radley.

With land training well established, the water trials continued. A further cut to 10 occurred in 6th week and with this, the basis of the squad was formed. Under the watchful eyes of the coaches, the rowing continued to improve throughout the rest of the term, and culminated in a training camp in Henley during 10th week.


After a short break (in my diet) for Christmas, the trialling ended with some "interesting" seat racing and the crew was announced in 0th week. With a new Janousek VIII and Dreissigacker blades, the training moved to Godstow, where the intensive water work was only interrupted by the spell of exceptionally bad weather. This break in the actual rowing meant that we were only able to compete at Reading Head, where we won Senior III.

Moving to Henley in the week preceding the race, and with the training continuing to go well, the crew hoped to be able to beat the Light Blues.

Losing the toss, we were on the station which had the rougher water at the start. This meant that we were down by 3/4 of a length after the start. After pulling back to almost level at Remenham, Cambridge responded and eventually won by 21/4 lengths. Although disappointed with this result, the prospects for next year are encouraging.

## **OCTUPLE TROUBLE** A Fantasy

When Herr Professor Karl-Angst Baumwolle of the Oxford Institute for Unadministered Brilliance perfected his cloning machine, his first thought was how to use it in rowing. After the collapse of the East German rowing-based economy, the rudergesellschaft, when he and his friend Goetz von Sploschingen, Professor of Marxist Aquatics at the Dresden Academy of Eretmology, made their way to what they had heard was the best rowing university in Europe, they had argued intensely over which one of them would be snapped up more readily. Goetz had been unyielding: his grasp of bow-side/strokeside dialectics would ensure his success in the West; and sure enough, he had been given a fellowship by Plebham College simply for mentioning the name Redgrave. Comrade Vanessa, thought they: good old Steve, thought he, in German.

But now Professor Baumwolle would prove the preeminence of science. And then the ultimate idea: why not a crew of clones? Dispense with incompatibility for ever: one individual, cloned seven times, per crew. He rushed over to Plebham to tell Goetz.

As the story came out, Dr von Sploschingen was bound to admit he was impressed. Cloning oarsmen: it was the answer. His economist brain spotted certain logistical benefits: an oarsman could now attend a tutorial and have an outing at the same time, thus avoiding the risk of being sent down; and he could trial with the Blue Boat, or even the National Squad, while his clone rowed for his college, taking his place in the crew only for the bumps races themselves.

"Ja, that is true," agreed Baumwolle. "But imagine also the difference on the water, Goetz. Think of a crew of clones, rowing as one because they are one: the original at stroke, his brothers behind him, anticipating his every change of rate, feeling his will to win because they are psychologically identical, rowing the very same stroke that he rows: balance would automatically be perfect because any faults would be the same on bowside and strokeside. Just think, Goetz, of the nobility, the purity of such a crew. Imagine it in a race: one catch, one legdrive, one handsaway, one bodyswing."

"Ein catch," whispered Goetz, his pulse quickening. "Ein

leadrive: ein bodyswing."

Three months later, on a Saturday morning at the beginning of Trinity, passers-by at Godstow were treated to an unusual sight, Milling around by the St Edward's School boathouse, and spilling over onto the opposite bank, where it mingled with a few bemused horses, a large crowd was assembled. Enquiries would have revealed that this was trials day for the Academy College first eight. All ten hopefuls were to be seat-raced with rigid fairness. Why this resulted in the assembly of more than eighty individuals, many of whom bore considerable facial similarity with each other, may have been answered by the presence of two interested observers: Professor Baumwolle and Dr von Sploschingen.

As the Head college, though not one with a particularly deep feeling for the sport, Academy had been approached first by the Professor. At first the plan was to select one individual and his seven clones per boat, so that the college would have eight or more first eight standard crews. Conscious of their lack of strength in depth. Academy had readily agreed, and cloning had taken place over the Easter vac. Some of those near the bottom of the first eight pecking order had complained that they would be reduced to rowing in clinkers or the women's boat, but these worries were brushed aside. What scuppered the idea was the SCR's unsporting refusal to admit the 72 new oarsmen as college members, thus preventing their participation in Eights Week. There were still plans to use them at Henley, but for the moment they were for trialling purposes only.

Difficulties arose almost immediately. Where could they sleep? The JCR, the college laundry and the library had been pressed into service, but were hardly comfortable. What could they eat? The college refused to provide steak dinners for the new boys, and many were already distinctly undernourished. Kit, too, was scarce: some of them had appeared this morning in tattered old tee-shirts, lycra bottoms borrowed from the women's crews, and trainers several sizes too small. Even getting to Godstow had proved a problem: they all knew the way, since they had been endowed with all the knowledge of their 'originals', but only those originals had bikes. The remaining squad of 72 had set off running together, but had so monopolised the Queen's highway that the Police had cautioned them and set them off in batches.

Eventually they had gathered, certain - despite these setbacks - that as soon as they got into a boat with their brothers, all would go well. After some discussion, two crews pushed off from the raft and paddled out onto the main stretch. In one boat were the prototype and copies of Dan Fisher, the American who was expected to stroke the final line-up. In the other, Edward Courtenay x8, their identical Radleian profiles etched in concentration. Both boats were coxed by the diminutive figure of Nicola Wright, to ensure an equally

aggressive line was taken by each in the race.

It never got that far. Fisher's crew, on the first firm stroke it took, capsized with stupendous effect. All four bowside clones. unequipped with any experience, real or inherited, on that side, had caught monumental crabs. The laughter from the eight Courtenays only subsided when it was clear that the entire crew had perished, strapped in by the feet: the cox alone swam to the surface to tell the tale. After that, the day went from bad to worse. At the end of it, it was generally felt that the experiment had been a costly one, and everyone trooped back to college to leave the bursar with the dire problem of completing death certificates for seven individuals whose previous existence had been unsuspected by the authorities.

The Professor naturally protested that the problem was a small one: it would be easy to produce mirror-image clones. Their internal organs would be on the wrong side, of course, but that didn't matter: if only Academy would wait a bit, the difficulties would be smoothed out. But 'Acad' was unwilling to

wait.

The problem did not go away as easily as that, of course. The 65 remaining clones, now disowned by Academy, were still very much in evidence. Others, moved by their plight, took up the cause of clone rights. St Adrian's College, sensing a political issue, elected a number of them to Junior Research Fellowships: the St Adrian's crew looked rather an impressive line-up as a result. Two of the Academy bowman's clones, looking for support in different quarters, decide to 'come out' and set up home together. Holding to the maxim 'better safe than sorry', Academy started looking for a new bowman the very next day. The final insult came when several of the other clones found that, while their originals were out rowing, a welcome could be found in their girlfriends' arms.

Problems such as this were not conducive to concord in the Academy boat club. In fact, to cut a long story short, on the eve of Eights Week, the captain stood alone. Most of his crew was refusing to leave college lest something close to their hearts their rooms, their steak dinners, their girlfriends - be usurped by their unscrupulous lookalikes. Everybody was blaming him for

having gone along with the Professor's scheme. The Headship looked lost.

Late that night, however, he received a phonecall from the Professor himself: his heart leapt when he heard the news. The Professor had completed the alterations: mirror-image clones were now possible. For added safety, they would be attuned to the original's brainwaves, and incapable of independent thought. They could be registered as lab-technicians accredited to Academy College. The machine stood ready for immediate use. He dashed over to the Institute.

The next afternoon, a remarkably well-matched crew took its place on bung-line one. The captain himself and seven docile clones rowed at low rate, in perfect unity, down to the start and spun below Donnington. On the bank, as the captain had rather hoped, the former members of the first eight gazed dumbfounded. As for the other colleges, their hopes faded as they watched the crew's immaculate warm-up. The five-minute gun, the one-minute gun, the start, all seemed to sound the end

of their aspirations.

How foolish is man - and clone of man - to prejudge the issue! No-one noticed that tiny piece of wood floating down through the Gut as the Academy boat carried out its perfectly concerted start. But how deadly its effect. The bowclone hits it with his blade, but adjusts not. The minor shock of the impact is transferred through his rigid arms to the crew, and strange things happen. The boat rocks. From a single point of equilibrium, it seems to find two, between which it facillates: these two points bifurcate, and the boat starts to crash around, its parsmen seemingly insensitive. Then a new factor enters the system: the cox applies the rudder, and all semblance of smoothness is lost. The hapless captain, at stroke, catches a crab, and his panic communicates itself to his crewmates, some of whom deliberately copy him as if this were a new racing tactic. Why prolong the agonising account? Academy were bumped.

It has been remarked that private enterprise and opportunism were so easily re-engendered in East Germany because Communism had never really stamped them out. And though he would hotly deny it, some support for this view might be gained from the case of Professor Baumwolle, who a few months later received a very considerable advance payment for a series of lectures in America entitled 'Chaos Theory and Rowing'. He has taken Dr von Sploschingen with him as his

accountant.


## Top Two Divisions of TORPIDS 1980-1991



## Top Two Divisions of SUMMER EIGHTS


