The Centre, with its indoor tank and rowers' gymnasium, will help develop talent for the future and keep Oxford's rowing in the ascendancy.

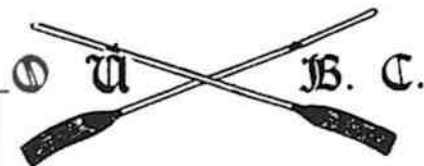

Cambridge were heavy favourites. After all, they had eight returning Blues, two imports from Harvard, a German international, a coxswain whose Tideway experience in years was greater than the age of Liz Chick and the disgruntled 1991 Oxford coach. Despite this, Oxford came from two-thirds of a length down on the outside of the Surrey bend to win by the smallest margin in years. The sports page headlines made it look so easy: "Oxford domination continues." A thorough report of the O.U.B.C.'s campaign beginning at this time last year, however, would show dedication in training and single-mindedness of purpose that forged a winning crew out of a collection of returning Blues and college rowers.

Competition for all seats in the Blue Boat was extremely tight with a final line-up not named until two weeks prior to the race. Once set, the eight beat the University of London for the first time since 1985 and matched some of Britain's top national squad rowers over short distances in work with the Leander Club. Instrumental to Oxford's success were Steven Royle in his capacity as Director of Rowing, Pat Sweeney, the head coach, John Pilgrim-Morris, Boathouse manager/coach and Juergen Groebler, a former East German coach who devised the training schedule. Some of the names are now well known, others less so but the twenty men and women rowers who comprised the Oxford University Boat Club for 1991-92 are, without exception, the best in Oxford.

The year started at a low, with a lack of equipment, finances, a base from which to row, and, most importantly, a coach. We did however have an initial squad of 45 enthusiastic oarswomen and coxes determined to make the best of the little they had!

We worked hard in Michaelmas, with this culminating in the trials races (where we cut up Messrs Redgrave and Pinsent in the fog at Henley) and began the next term with a training camp at KRC which was a big morale boost to squad, now cut to 24 and with a full-time coach. During Hilary the work continued based at Abingdon Rowing Club.

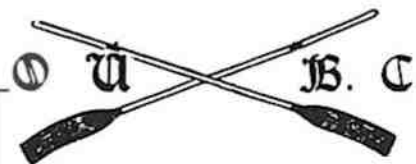
The work paid off, with the Blue Boat finishing 4th in the Women's HoR on the tideway, taking the University pennant, beaten by the 3 National Squad crews.

Competitive work between Osiris and the Blue Boat, which showed the strength of both crews, continued at Wallingford and yielded crews which put up a valiant fight against a Cambridge squad – one of their strongest ever.

During the races Osiris got a good start but were hit by disaster when a technical failure allowed Cambridge to build an early lead. Osiris recovered well to row over at 36, but despite their efforts they could not overcome Cambridge's challenge.

The Blue Boat, with a stone-a-woman disadvantage against Cambridge (but Oxford were better looking) got a slower start than Cambridge, but edged back to being on terms by Remenham. They continued to row strongly to go down by $\frac{1}{3}$ of a length in a tightly-fought race. The shortness of the course was another disadvantage: their superiority of fitness and technique over Cambridge should have seen them through over a longer distance.

The OUWBC would like to thank all those who have supported us over this year, especially Worcester College and OULRC for the loan of their boats.

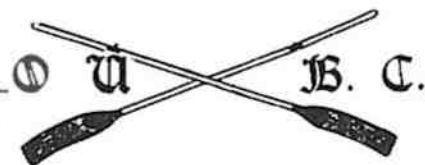
The towpath pundits were anticipating a great tussle at the head of both men's and women's divisions, because of the abundance of squad rowers. **University** contained two blues and one Isis, **Oriel** had two blues and two Isis, whilst **St. Johns** two blues and one Isis oarsmen. It was the latter who were strongly tipped to take the Headship. In the Women's 1st division, **Somerville** looked vulnerable to challenges from **Brasenose**.

The first day saw **University** and **Somerville** row over comfortably leaving no change at the top of either the men's or women's divisions.

On Thursday **Oriel** bumped up to second in front of the boathouses, though **Christchurch**, not contented with stopping, rowed out the full course. **St. John's** much touted campaign had floundered, and **Pembroke** revealed themselves as a potent force. **Somerville** continued to look confident at head, and **Brasenose** men broke into the 1st division.

There was little change on Friday at the top of the men's division with **University** now looking increasingly confident stroked by the 1992 president Jo Michels, though **Oriel** had lost a key oarsman to international duties. In the women's divisions **Osler House** were bumped out of second place.

On the final day both **University** and **Somerville** retained their headships, the former withstanding sustained pressure from **Oriel**, and the latter increasing their lead to over two lengths. **Pembroke** justified their talent and training by winning blades when they bumped a flagging **St. John's** into their own raft. **University** second crew gained blades and challenge **Oriel II** this year, and **St. Hilda's** won blades entering the 1st division.

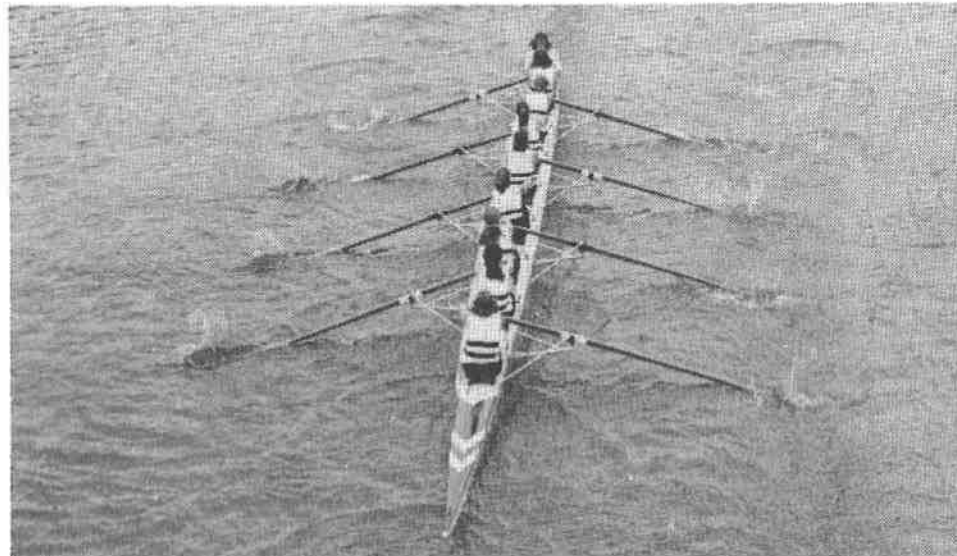

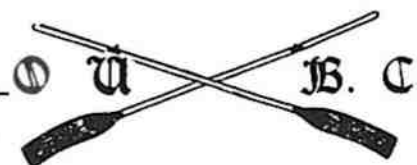

Torpids 1992

Given that Hilary Term of the last two years has seen disruption by freeze and by flood it was, no doubt, with not inconsiderable surprise that crews enjoyed an apparently unprecedented period of entirely average weather.

The mood of the week was of course subdued by news of the sudden death of John Hebbes. Flags were flown at half mast above the boathouse of all colleges and O.U.B.C. who were further to remember John in their naming of the Blue Boat.

Popular opinion before the bumps held that both headships were in danger. This view was proved partially correct on Wednesday when Oriel, starting second, performed a late bump on Christ Church to regain the headship that they had controversially surrendered last year – despite seeming to display noticeably less urgency than their immediate rivals over the first part of the course. Once Brasenose had bumped Christ Church the following day it still remained to be seen whether or not the college could mount a realistic challenge to the head crew on Friday. B.N.C. did not disappoint and pressed hard to finish no more than half a length down at the line. Oriel however, feeling obliged to assert their dominance rather more convincingly, saved their best row until last to finish a comfortable two lengths clear on Saturday.

Lower down Worcester impressed by reentering the First Division with five blade winning bumps whilst Pembroke, continuing their progress of recent years, took three bumps to go fourth. Magdalen also rose three places to finish seventh.

Somerville, however, retained the women's headship with ease as the expected challenge from New College, who had advanced three places in two days to start second on Friday, failed to materialize. Elsewhere in the division St. Hilda's won their blades with four bumps having started the week as sandwich boat.

Those spectators to whom a feast of bumping appeals would have done well to watch the women's Second Division. Here Christ Church and Oriel rose six and seven places respectively in contrast to St. Hugh's who fell a dismal ten in a bitterly disappointing week for the college.

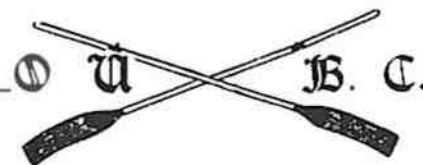

OUBC Ferry

Between divisions, the OUBC will operate a ferry from the OUBC boat house to the lower end of the college boat houses, on each night of Eights from 11.30 am until 20 minutes after the First Division has finished (or later if by agreement with the ferryman). The use of the ferry is restricted to college crews, those assisting college boat clubs and those authorized by the OUBC officers with priority for the latter, and for coaches. No alcohol may be carried on the ferry. Coxes are asked to look out for the ferry and to steer clear of it, since the ferry will be used when the river appears empty. No one may operate the ferry except those authorized by the OUBC.

College boat clubs are responsible for the proper use of the ferry by their members. Ferrymen have discretion in deciding priority for passengers if necessary. The OUBC thanks ferrymen for their voluntary help.

The Origin of Bumps Racing in Oxford

It may seem strange, given the high profile of Oxford University rowing, that the early history of bumps racing is not well documented. Accounts of competitive racing, once The Eights was firmly established, and of non-systematic pleasure boating before this time are plentiful. It is, however, the period of development of the former from the latter that is of particular interest here.

Presumably the men concerned did not regard their recreation as worthy of particular note. This is, in retrospect, a pity. As one author puts it:

"It is the obvious to one generation that is of interest to another, and there is some fear that the obvious may soon cease to be recorded."

Of the material that does exist much is largely anecdotal, for instance:

Who could forget the glorious summer of twenty three? The Eights that never was, Sebastian coming of age and, of course, setting eyes on my wife Doris for the first time. One other incident that has been generally consigned to memory is that which involved Bertram "Squiffy" Finchley-Strawson. I recount the tale as delivered to me, with his customary sombre wit, by the Chaplain of Oriel College with whom I had the pleasure to dine on the evening following the event.

Squiffy was a fellow of military stock who had before him a promising career with the Bengal Lancers. He and an undergraduate friend of his from the House, known to me only as "Stinker", formed an inseparable duo. These experienced oars, in a highly polished tub pair, laid down a challenge to two watermen known to Mr Salter involving a short race on the Isis. With proceedings barely underway the unfortunate college man lost his hat and, in reaching to regain his headgear, dislodged his oar – effecting a violent shipwreck and wholly capsizing their craft in clear view of Squiffy's commanding officer. The embarrassment was such that, I later heard, they considered disbanding the regiment.

I imagine the reader gets the general idea. Interesting though this tale may be it does little to further our knowledge of the evolution of bumps racing. This said, however, one can but hope that Mr. Strawson's military career was not irretrievably damaged.

Although the main river was navigable in the reign of James I, and boating trips to Nuneham and Sandford presumably possible soon after, the earliest recorded row was, perhaps surprisingly, as late as 1793. However this point is scarcely relevant as, given the ever changing population of the university, such activities become 'traditional' in a short space of time. Certainly at this time, and indeed until 1810, these outings were mere 'pleasure boating' as compared to 'rowing' as we know it today. Groups of friends usually in six oared boats, eights were an Etonian invention of 1811, would go for picnics typically around Sandford. These craft were very different to those used today. They would have had ample room for all luggage required on such an excursion and a central gang plank. In returning to Oxford Iffley lock would have had to be negotiated.

It must be stressed that the development from here to bumps racing was by unconscious evolution rather than by design. We can envisage how a race might develop on opening of the lock door and by 1815, the date of the first recorded Head of the River, this had developed into a systematic procedure. Crews rowed back from Sandford and into Iffley Lock together. The stroke, standing in the bows holding a boat hook, would push the boat out of the lock on opening of the doors. Once clear he would run down the central gang plank, or along the side of the boat, take his seat and start rowing. The same routine was followed by the next crew and thus the race had begun – the finish line being opposite King's Barge. In these early races large crowds formed around the lock and we can imagine the pre-race tension being broken, not by a cannon, but by the slow creaking of the opening doors. The results of racing were displayed by flying college flags above one another on King's Barge. The raising of the flags was a focus for celebration and crowds would "cheer the colours" every year as this was done. In the case of 1815 there were just two flags as B.N.C. and Jesus were the only colleges taking part.

The elaborate dress that was normal for early nineteenth century rowing would seem ridiculous today – although Victorian oarsmen might have had something similar to say about multi-coloured lycra shorts. High hats were standard attire in the early Eights. In 1819, however, Christ Church,

acknowledging some Scottish connection, took to wearing Tam O'Shanter's and started quite a fashion that lasted until around 1847.

A historical link with the roots of bumps racing was maintained until around 1840 in that all boats went to Sandford before the start:

"The Eights used to go down to Sandford and stay there for about an hour, the crews amusing themselves with gymnastics or skittles or strolling about until they were tired. They then paddled to Kennington Island where they had a preliminary burst up the straight reach, each boat being anxiously timed by the others."

With the gradual increase in numbers of participating crews the original starting procedure became impossible as the maximum capacity of Iffley Lock was just three eights! Thus, in 1825, the start was moved to its current position upstream. Poles, later decorated in college colours, fifty feet apart marked the starting position of each crew and a pistol was used to start the race. Another consequence of an increased entrance was the need for more evenings of racing if every participating crew was to have a chance to become Head of the River. Originally racing occurred every Monday and Friday of the season from the first of May onwards. In 1836 the number of nights of Eights was reduced to allow training time for the race with Cambridge. In that year Driel bumped every day to finish the season second. An extra night was then granted to give the college a chance, although they could not take it, to go Head. Thus it was soon ruled that there must be one night for each crew entered. The current format of racing taking place on consecutive days did not begin until 1858. A later consequence of greatly enlarged participation was that challenging crews were running out of river with which to catch the Head crew. The solution was separating racing into divisions and this was done in 1874. Although the necessity of this for fair racing was accepted, the change was widely regretted for making The Eights less of a spectacle.

The list of amendments to the rules of racing is long indeed but one is worthy of particular note. Originally a bump would mean the end of the race, not only for the two boats involved, but for all those behind as well. Indeed the bump was

conceded by the stroke tossing his oar! This changed in 1840 to current procedure of both boats drawing to one side so as not to impede those following. The cox's raised hand as a concession was simultaneously introduced.

The word 'Torpids' was first used in 1826 referring to second eights. For years they were taken not at all seriously and were permitted to race with the Eights only if there were too many boats "on". Separate races were made compulsory in 1838 and these took place after, or on the days between, Eights races. Torpids were looked down upon to such an extent that, although records of results exist, the oarsmen's names, even of the head crews, are seldom recorded. After 1852, when Torpids began to race in Hilary Term as feeders for Eights, they were taken slightly more seriously. The current status of Torpids, with established oarsmen taking part, is very much a recent development.

The uncanny similarity of the events of Torpids 1891 with those of exactly a century later is worthy of note. In the bitter winter of 1891 the Isis was covered in thick ice and racing was thus impossible. Several crews skated to Sandford to see if a stretch of open water there might be suitable for rowing. After a short outing they decided that it was not. O.U.B.C. then made a highly controversial decision to reschedule Torpids to a time that interfered with Moderations. The decision was later changed, after widespread disapproval, and a more suitable time was arranged.

After Eights there used to be a ceremony known as "The Procession of Boats". Here every boat on the river would row, in order, past King's Barge and exchange salutes, by tossing their oars, with the Head of the River moored opposite. By all accounts it was a beautiful sight. The tradition gradually died as, once undergraduates stopped staying up for Commemoration, the members of the genuine crews were not always available and so significance was lost.

At Henley Royal Regatta last July, the new Lightweight President was introduced to Jock Wishart, the only ever Oxford Lightweight's winning Chief Coach. He expressed a desire to return as Chief Coach for the 1992 Henley Boat Race and endeavour to bring to an end 14 successive years of defeat. His offer was readily accepted.

In mid-October, the Squad was cut to sixteen and moved to its small-boats headquarters at Abingdon School. Under the eyes of the coaches, Mike Martin (Abingdon School), David Hardy (Radley College) and Chris Jones (London Rowing Club), the Squad began its arduous training programme of 8 water sessions and 5 land sessions per week, and gradually the Squad was reduced to 12.

During the Michaelmas term various combinations of pairs and fours raced at Marlow and Tiffin Heads, winning two events at each, and never finishing lower than second. Then, just before the Christmas vacation, a provisional eight was selected and began its training at Radley. At this point, the ex-lightweight International Colin Barratt, joined Jock Wishart's coaching team.

Following a ten day break for Christmas, the crew was back out on the water, rowing mainly in the eight, with the occasional outing in fours in order to seat race for the last places in the crew. The training ran unbelievably smoothly with virtually no illnesses – something which was due largely to the Crew Doctor, David Otterburn, who had issued flu vaccines and was present at at least 2 outings a week in order to correct minor ailments.

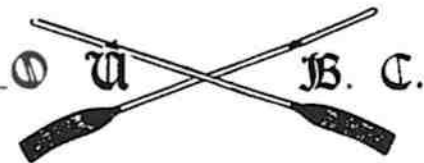
The selected eight competed at Burway and Reading Head, where it secured impressive victories. At this point, it became clear that Cambridge would have great difficulty in defeating such a determined crew. This gap was widened even further, when the crew moved into their new boat – a Sims hired from Oxford Poly's women.

The Lightweight crew moved to Henley ten days before the race, and Jock Wishart took over as finishing coach. It was time for "fine tuning", and a race against Shiplake School proved that the crew was fully prepared, when it devastated the schoolboys by 7 lengths in a five minute row.

On Sunday 29th March the crew boated to race Cambridge. The coaches, crew doctor and Chris Morgan (the Boatman) had done everything possible to ensure success. Both crews got a clean start, and after a minute Oxford had a lead of a canvas. They increased this steadily until finally breaking away from Cambridge as they passed Upper Thames. The Tabs looked both surprised and demoralised, and it was quite apparent after 3½ minutes that only a disaster would prevent Oxford from winning for the first time since 1977. Over the last half of the course, the Dark Blues continued to extend their lead and finally crossed the line 9 seconds (3 lengths) ahead of Cambridge.

The result was an impressive end to an impressive season. Everyone of the twelve man squad, the President, coaching team, Doctor and boatman had given 100%, and this was displayed by the winning time being the fastest since 1979.

The crew is presently training together and hopes to enjoy more successes this Summer, as well as securing a sponsorship deal. The coaching team and a possible six of the crew are returning again next year, along with 2 of the reserves. The 1993 Oxford Lightweight crew is going to be fast.

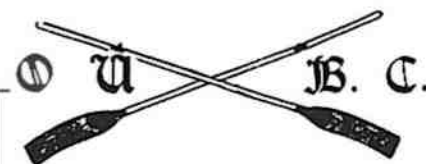

Last October a very determined group of oarswomen set out to avenge the Oxford Women's Lightweight losing streak against Cambridge. More work on the water was scheduled and land training placed a particular emphasis on the development of crew fitness and on ensuring that weight limits were controlled. Unfortunately, OULRC was hampered in forming a crew by the lack of a development squad from the previous summer and the fact that no members of the 1991 crew were available to row. Under the very capable coaching of Rod Andrews and Adrian Smith, the squad was narrowed to 12 by the end of Michaelmas Term, with only 10 oarswomen being invited back to the training camp at Henley directly after Christmas. Trial rows were held at Henley against the Heavyweights, when the Lightweight squad performed well, leading for much of the way. In further contests at Henley against the Heavyweights in early 1992, the Lightweights once again produced well matched contests. By the end of January, the crew was selected and comprised Phoebe Collins (Balliol) bow; Karen Ball (BNC); Catherine Saskis (Worcester); Viva Barthus (Magdalen); Helena Cook (Magdalen); Rachel Farrow (Exeter); Kate Smith (Wadham); Sarah Sharman (Oriel) stroke; and Margaret Keen (Exeter) cox. Good weather through the winter months allowed river work to progress smoothly. OULRC were entered in the Burway Head of the River on 29th February in the Senior III level, winning that category comfortably with an efficient performance that gained them third place overall in the women's open section of the event. Encouraged by their performance at Burway, the crew headed down to Henley on March 23rd for their final week of training in the run-up to the race. Many supporters braved the Henley cold, windy, and rainy weather to cheer on Oxford on Sunday afternoon, March 29th. Despite the increases in water and land training this year, OULRC lost to Cambridge in a race well rowed by both crews. The 1992 crew would like to thank their coaches, Rod Andrews and Adrian Smith, their boatman, Chris Morgan, all the people at St. Edward's School Boat Club, especially Geoff Beasley and Mike Rosewall, and finally, their family and friends for all of their support. We wish the future 1993 Lightweight crew all the best.

150 Years Ago

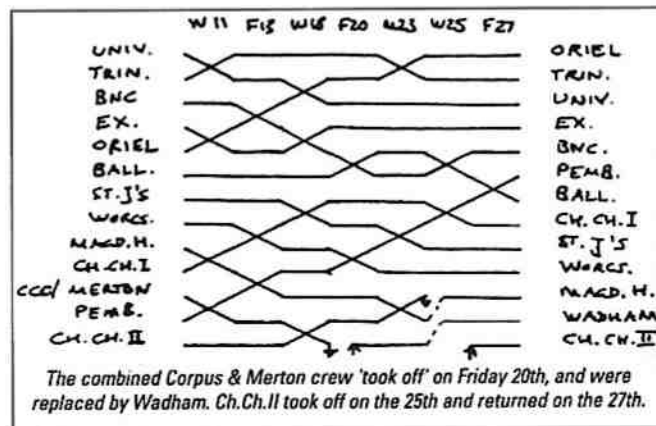

University College, stroked by the president of OUBC but lacking in other talent, are Head: they are widely expected to go down. The President's erstwhile partner sits in the crew that is thought to offer the main challenge, Oriel.

The year referred to is 1842. By the time races were over Oriel were indeed head. The President was the Scot, Fletcher Menzies. The Oriel man, captain of the college boat club and secretary of OUBC, was the universally admired George Hughes; at two in the Oriel boat sat his brother Thomas, author of *Tom Brown's Schooldays* (whose creation Flashman, as George Macdonald Fraser has since revealed, was at this very point returning from the 1st Afghan War to an undeserved hero's welcome).

Readers who have perused Mr Roland Brown's eloquent article on the early days of bumps racing (and if not, why not?) will appreciate the similarities and differences between then and now. In 1842 the eights rowed seven times (11, 13, 18, 20, 23, 25 and 27 May), and with the exception of Christ Church second boat, every boat rowed in every race. Torpids, still a novice competition attached umbilically to the senior event, were held on 19, 21 and 24 May. Other races also took place. And all through this long, languid period of competition – not yet condensed into an 'Eights Week' and consumed in the busy pleasures of Commem. – people were attracted down to the river by the 'enlivening airs' of Adam's band, as the *Oxford City and County Courier* relates.

The river itself has changed, of course. There were no locks above Iffley, and the sides were scarcely embanked. Crews could row side by side over the whole course, with the exception of the Gut: fours' races were mad dashes to halfway, with boisterous coxing, to get into the narrows first. The stream ran much quicker, so that times over the course were slower even than the heavy boats would alone imply. And in 1842 they still were heavy, though sleeker perhaps than the 1829 Oxford boat which hangs in the Science Museum in London: a real barge. They still had keels, and lacked outriggers (these came in 1846) and



sliding seats (early 1870s). Balance was not really a problem. Rates were much higher: Brasenose made a bump in 1851 rating 50 at full stretch. And oarsmen looked different: broad shoulders and a strong back typified the breed, with no need for long legs. It might be thought that in such boats technique was hardly necessary. Well, rhythm was still vital, and in fact much harder to obtain without sliding seats. But, to be honest, little value was placed on bladework until F. Menzies himself introduced a longer, more elegant stroke in the winter of 1841–2.

Scattered throughout the various college crews as they made their way down to the start 150 years ago were several very broad shouldered oarsmen who had trained with him through that winter in the hope of winning the first Boat Race for Oxford in four years. Menzies had introduced tougher training – early runs, longer 'pulls' in the evenings, crew meals. For a while it had looked as if there would be no race with Cambridge to put his work to the test. But finally one was arranged, for 11 June, two weeks after Eights and just before Henley. These races, then, would provide valuable data for the selection of the Blue Boat.

One oarsmen certain to be in the boat, however, was George Hughes, the Oriel captain. He is recorded as a type that is rarely if ever seen these days: a blue for cricket as well as rowing, a cellist, a champion golfer, the friendliest of individuals, the very model of an English gentleman. In

his novel *The Scouring of the White Horse* Thomas Hughes paints a thinly disguised picture of his brother: "you never saw such a clean made man... He looked as if he could jump the highest five-barred gate in the vale, and then have carried it off on his shoulders, and run up the hill with it. And his face, which was browned, was so manly and frank, and his voice so cheery, that you felt he wasn't ashamed of anything, or afraid of anybody."

Speculation about Eights in the Press had begun in early May, with a letter to *Bell's Life*, the London weekly. The writer predicted confidently that Oriel would go Head, Univ. finishing 5th. He added that one should keep an eye on Pembroke. A week later a 'Member of OUBC' wrote to say that this was wide of the mark in every respect. Univ. would remain: Oriel were too heavy (one of them was 15 stone, considered a disadvantage in boats that already weighed so much), and anyone keeping an eye on Pembroke "will need a telescope to give him a view of the leading boats". The correspondents agreed with the first view, as a whole, the bookies with the latter, quoting Univ. as 3 to 2 on.

When the races came – to cut a long story short – the first writer was proved correct, as a glance at the accompanying chart will show. The racing was considered the most exciting ever seen on the Isis. No one was prepared for the manner of the first bump on Univ., however. When the minute gun fired, they were way below their station. At the 'off', they were only just drawing past Trinity. Menzies, frustrated with his own crew no doubt, shouted a concession. But Trinity refused to take it, and hung back as long as possible, allowing Brasenose to get very close indeed: then, having given Univ. about a length of clear water, they went up to firm and bumped them just after the Gut.

But despite this mishap – the nightmare of every participant in the Bumps – Univ. were on the way down

anyway. Oriel, having disposed of Exeter 'after a stern chase' and Brasenose 'easily', caught Univ. 'inexorably' by what is now OUBC. Trinity held out for a day before succumbing just before the finish. Thomas Hughes has left a memorable description of the bump that took Oriel head in *Tom Brown at Oxford*. In it, Oriel is disguised as 'St Ambrose's', Trinity as 'Oriel':

Tom had an atom of go still left in the back of his head ... In another six strokes the gap is lessened and St Ambrose has crept up to ten feet, and now to five ... 'A bump, a bump!' shout the St Ambrosians on shore. 'Row on, row on,' screams Miller [the cox]. He has not yet felt the electric shock, and knows he will miss his bump if the young ones slacken for a moment ... A bump now, and no mistake; the bow of the St Ambrose boat jams the oar of the Oriel stroke, and the two boats pass the winning post ... So near a shave was it.

And so Oriel gained the 'enviable position' (*Jackson's Oxford Courier*) for the first time in their history.

After the races, the Blue Boat convened. Menzies stroked it with Hughes behind him at seven, and they beat Cambridge by six lengths. They were still the Oxford stern pair a year later when, at Henley, Menzies was taken ill just before the final of the Grand, against Cambridge. Due to a new rule, no substitution was allowed: Hughes stroked a winning seven-oared crew against the Cambridge eight, 'Septem contra Camum', and went down in rowing history. In many ways *this* was Hughes' finest hour, and a damn fine one for Oxford rowing generally: writing nearly sixty years later, the Rev. William Tuckwell, who had witnessed it, said "it was the event which really popularised boating at Oxford".

But that was yet to come. For the moment, the Hughes brothers and the rest of their crew were savouring the Headship: for them boating was already perfectly popular.

1981-1992

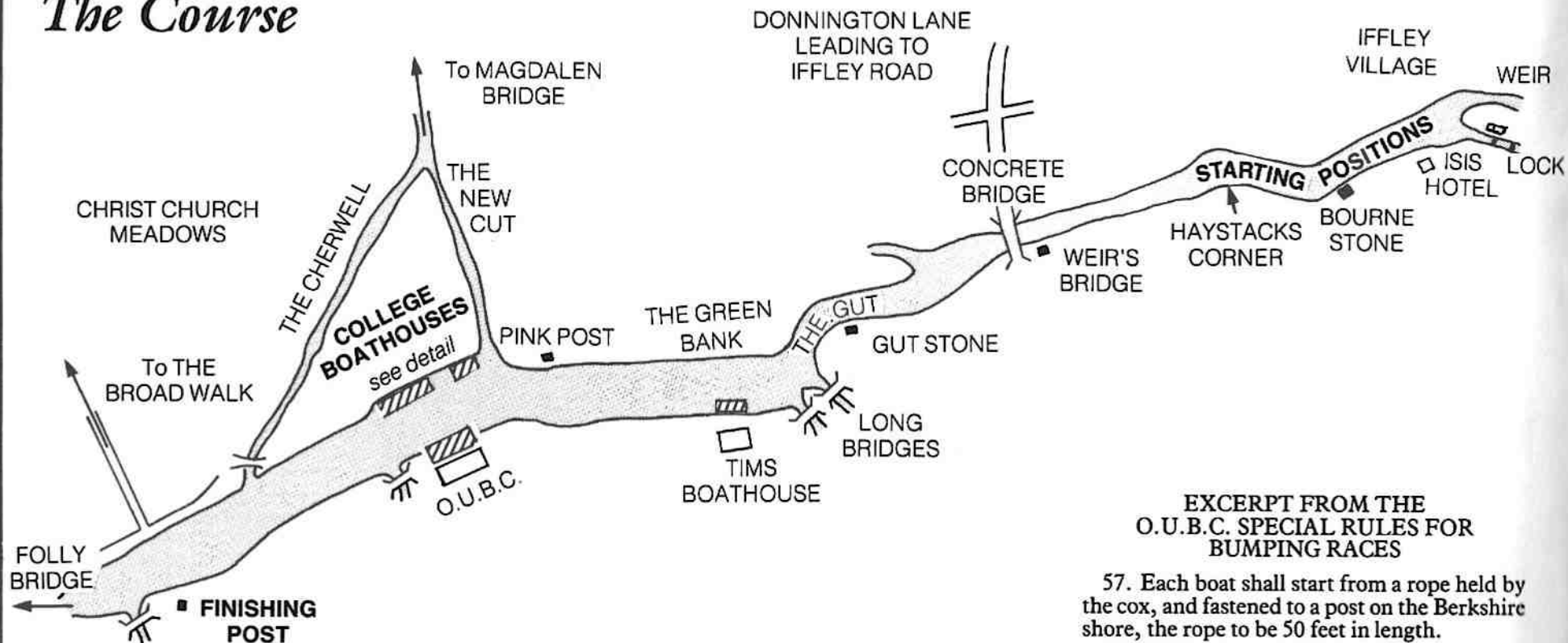

 1979-1991



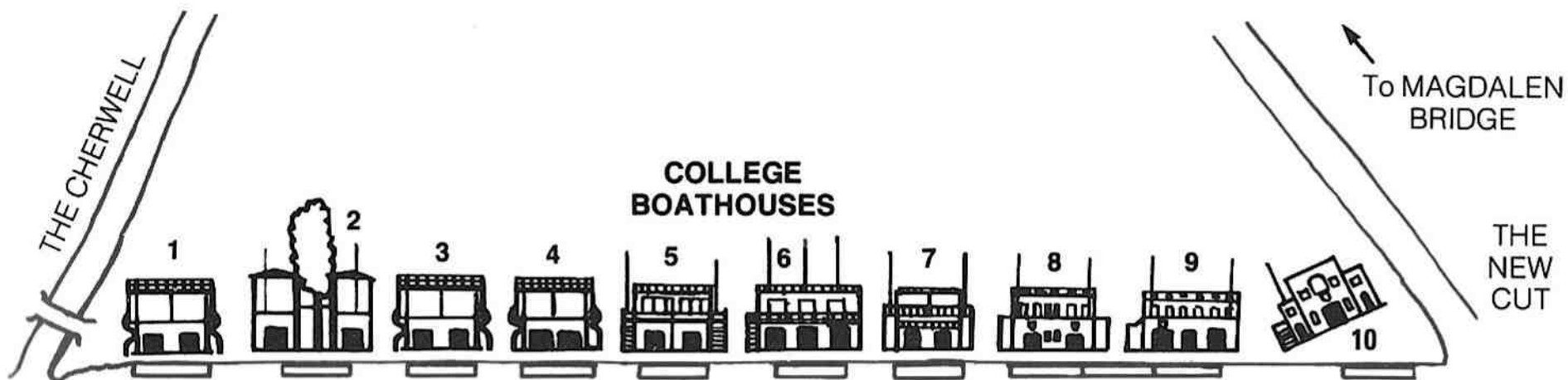

EXCERPT FROM THE O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR BUMPING RACES

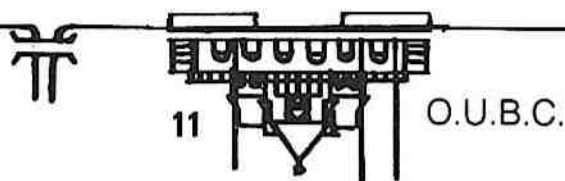
57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.
58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.
65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .
67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.
69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.
