Due to a number of crews not succeeding in "Rowing-on" last Friday, some crews named in this programma may not be rowing in Eights Week.





THE NEW ROWING CENTRE

Since 1989, and the launch of the OUBC 150th Anniversary Appeal, over £380,000 has been donated. Oxford rowing now boasts a new rowing centre at the University Sports Centre, Iffley Road, containing an indoor rowing facility and a high-tec gymnasium specially equipped for rowers. Phase I of the £500,000 project is now complete.

Phase II - the building of a new boat house is still short of just over £100,000, in spite of a magnificent donation from the PF Charitable Trust in memory of Philip Fleming, founder of Robert Fleming & Company Limited. As a result of this generous donation, the new boat house will carry the Fleming name.



With a wealth of home and international talent the failure to win the Boat Race has certainly hurt badly. Cambridge had, perhaps for the first time in many years, the right combination of talent, coaching and determination and it produced an outstanding crew. We, on the other hand, struggled to combine our talent into a cohesive unit and despite encouraging wins at Reading Head and over Molesey BC and London University, we paid the price on Boat Race day. Cambridge were arguably the best crew we raced and certainly had the fastest start. They put it to good use and never gave us a chance to get into the race. The victory of Goldie over Isis made the 27th March the second all Cambridge day of the racing calendar.



This year a small relatively inexperienced squad started training at Godstow under the guidance of Marysh Chmiel and Mike Rosewell.

During Michaelmas term a lot of fitness and technical work was done and the standard of rowing improved enormously.

Adverse weather and water conditions meant the pre and post Christmas training camps were held at Ely where the top 18 oarswomen and 2 coxes were selected. During Hilary term training continued at Godstow and Henley where the final crews were selected two weeks before the Womens Eights Head.

The improvement in standard and indication of potential of the crews was shown over a series of close races with the Tideway Scullers 1st and 2nd Eights mostly consisting of Olympic and top club oarswomen.

In the Womens Eights Head the Blue Boat came in 7th-a good result, but when Cambridge had an outstanding row to finish 3rd we knew we had a tough job ahead against the strongest and largest Cambridge squad ever.


Osiris suffered in the Head from the absence of their strongest crew member (who rowed in the Blue Boat due to illness of one of the Blue Boat rowers) and came in 23rd which was not a result that did justice to their standard and ability.

In the Boat Race two weeks later Osiris had a very close race with Blondie going down by just over a length and silencing many critics who had predicted a much easier win for Cambridge.

The Blue Boat had an initial lead over Cambridge with more polished technique and a crisper rating. But once Cambridge settled to their rhythm and let the large engine room in the middle of the boat start to work Oxford could not prevent Cambridge pulling back and eventually going on to a win of 4 lengths.

This year the squad suffered from a lack of size and strength and experience. Next year however sees many of the squad returning, so with the hard work and experience gained this year and the addition of new good college oarswomen the squad should do very well and has the potential for victory in both races.


Having regained the Headship in Torpids, Eights Week 1992 saw **Oriel** continue their dominance of the Isis. On the first day they bumped **University** between **Univ's** own barge and the OUBC, thus becoming Head in both Torpids and Eights. **Pembroke** appeared to be the only possible challengers, having bumped **Christ Church** on Wednesday and **University** on Thursday, giving them two days to mount their attack. However Friday saw **Oriel** row over three lengths clear, and **Pembroke** made the decision to switch to the new 'hatchet' style blades for Saturday, which were hurriedly sent down from Nottingham. In the event they closed to within half a length out of the gut but the challenge rapidly faded along the green bank and once again **Oriel** finished three lengths ahead.

Magdalen had a very impressive crew, deservedly winning blades and moving into the first division.

Exeter also gained blades and moved into Division II.

Somerville never looked seriously threatened in the women's division, always rowing about three and a half lengths clear of Brasenose. Oriel women finally reached the first division. With arguments in Cherwell as to whether they were in fact the fastest women's crew on the river, they could well be one to look out for. Perhaps to compensate for their men's fall, Univ women rose from 6th to 3rd on the river.

At the foot of the river, the **Oriel** VII Eight were the slowest crew to take part in rowing on. **Regents Park** rowed over every day at the foot of the women's divisions and **St. Antony's** were bumped on the last day so giving them that dubious place in the men's divisions.

Head of the River - Oriel College 1st Torpid 1993



If the floods of Michaelmas Term had instilled a depressing sense of *deja vu* in those with memories of interrupted Torpids past it was quite understandable. Fortunately, although much training time and all rowing on divisions were lost, the Isis subsided in time for the main event to proceed essentially unhindered. It is to be hoped that this lost time will not affect Eights Week too much.

Speculation as to the immediate destiny of both Headships petered out earlier than usual this year in the knowledge that both **Oriel** and **Somerville** were looking outstanding. The unchallenged **Oriel** used their commanding lead, eight lengths on Friday, to treat their boathouse to a nonchalant easy oar on Saturday – the first seen since 1989 – and still finished 27 seconds clear. **Somerville** may have exhibited less arrogance in rowing over but their margin of victory was barely less impressive.


The lack of challenge to the head crew could not remove excitement from an otherwise rather fluid Men's First Division. Blades were won by the impressive **Worcester** who built on similar fine progress last year. **S.E.H.** made five bumps in re-entering the First Division and so revived memories of heady days in the 'sixties. If **Pembroke** failed to live up to expectation, making little impression on second placed **Brasenose** before succumbing to a snappy **University** on Saturday, **New College** were still more decisive in dispelling rumours of a serious challenge – they dropped three places from fifth.

In the Men's Second division **Queen's** and **Exeter** made steady progress but **Keble**, after suffering a disastrous fall for the second time in four years, must be wondering when their luck will change. In the women's races **Oriel** were blades winners as they entered the First Division for the first time in their history. **Christchurch** were also impressive in taking six First Division bumps.




OUBC Ferry

Between divisions, the OUBC will operate a ferry from the OUBC boat house to the lower end of the college boat houses, on each night of Eights from 11.30 am until 20 minutes after the First Division has finished (or later if by agreement with the ferryman).

The use of the ferry is restricted to college crews, those assisting college boat clubs and those authorized by the OUBC officers with priority for the latter, and for coaches. No alcohol may be carried on the ferry. Coxes are asked to look out for the ferry and to steer clear of it, since the ferry will be used when the river appears empty.

No one may operate the ferry except those authorized by the OUBC. College boat clubs are responsible for the proper use of the ferry by their members. Ferrymen have discretion in deciding priority for passengers if necessary. The OUBC thanks ferrymen for their voluntary help.

Another Place

Spectators may be aware that bumps racing is not quite unique to the Isis. Indeed, through the Cambridge Mays, the Fenland offers more to the aquatically orientated than an interesting flora and fauna alone.

The Cambridge May races are today very similar to the Eights — a similarity that surely begs a question as to whether the evolutions of the two events could have been entirely separate. In looking for answers we are hindered by a shortage of records of very early racing. Although, immediately after its formation in 1827, C.U.B.C. was more efficient in keeping records than its Oxonian counterpart in the same period, the documentation of non-systematic racing before this time is actually rather worse.

Neither Cam nor Isis is consistently wide enough for convenient side by side racing so both places had good cause for the invention, or introduction, of a new racing system. A glance at the dates of the first recorded Head of the River at both institutions shows that the May races started some twelve years later than the Eights in 1827. Since the unique Iffley Lock starting system in Oxford is well known one might be led to suspect that the Cantabrians unimaginatively adopted the Oxonian method as it was in the late eighteen-twenties. This suspicion would, however, be unfair as Cambridge, in fact, had a non-systematic precursor of organized bumps racing of their own.

Early Victorian Cambridge rowing appears to have been, in common with Oxford, largely a relaxed pastime as much concerned with tea and scones as anything else. The first eight oared boat was launched on the Cam in 1826. Bought from Eton by St. John's college, on the advice of The Hon. Richard le Poer Trench, she was called the 'Lady Margaret' and it is in her memory that their boat club has ever since been known as the L.M.B.C. It is a little known fact that the word 'blazer' was coined for the bright red jackets worn from this time onwards by the club's members. She was hardly a racy number. Apart from being made for schoolboys, and so a little small for

undergraduates, space was necessary for all manner of picnicking provisions. The Lady Margaret is reported to have had on board a tin 'panthermaticon' containing 2 kettles, 9 cups and saucers, 9 teaspoons, 9 plates, 4 dishes, 4 basins, 1 box, 1 salt do., 1 mustard pot, 2 grates, 9 egg holders, 9 eggspoons and a separate case with a dozen knives and forks, a canvas bag marked 'Lady Margaret', 4 irons and screws for legs of ditto, 2 tablecloths and six napkins. Other benefactors presented eight sheepskin seats, a horn and a trumpet. It is, surely, a telling reflection on the near monastic existence of contemporary college oars that, with the possible exception of some from the lower divisions, they generally choose to omit these socially essential items from their inventory.

The prospect of an eight on the Cam was greeted with derision by the rather more athletic oarsmen of Trinity; who contented themselves with beating all comers in a four, stroked by a statuesque Ernest Finchley-Strawson. Their principles, however, were not held so dearly as to survive a demonstration of the relative speeds of eights and fours and they promptly bought one themselves. In desiring a somewhat speedier eight than the Lady Margaret they, naturally, looked to King of Oxford who built the King Edward which was to become the first Head of the River in Cambridge. In 1826 the two eights were racing in a manner whereby the Lady Margaret would go off and lie in wait - intimating its position with a bugle. The King Edward would then come by and give chase; apparently invariably succeeding in bumping the Johnian boat. That these races were rather informal is illustrated by the fine. of one guinea, imposed on any cox allowing a race to proceed if any one member of his crew was not in the mood.

In the first official May races in 1827 these two were still the only eights involved — as were those of Brasenose and Jesus in Oxford's first races in 1815. However the races on the Cam also included three sixes and a ten


oared Monarch belonging to Trinity. Any unscrupulous boat club captains interested in the last mentioned competitor should note not only that umpiring has since been considerably tightened regarding this matter, but that it was the eight that actually went Head.

It is at this point that we can really suspect a significant Oxford influence as the C.U.B.C. seems to have formed suddenly and imposed a set of rules for regular, systematic racing bearing many similarities to those of the O.U.B.C. The two methods were not identical though. The original Mays course was shorter than today due to the position of Chesterton Lock (since removed) and there was a sharp bend right after the start. As a result of this the quick bump was a very likely, and hardly exciting. possibility. To accommodate this a 'bumping post' was erected after the bend and bumps made before this point did not stand. In 1830 this rule was tightened such that if a crew did perform such an illegal bump it would be demoted. Bumps were conceded by 'changing flags' whereby the cox started the race with a small flag but would replace this by a large one to acknowledge defeat. The original starting procedure involved a man with a wooden leg called Bowtell, who was somewhat long in the tooth even at this time and must have been decidedly crusty by the time a more familiar pistol procedure was adopted in 1844, sculling past all assembled captains in an old skiff asking if they were indeed ready to race. On receiving an affirmative reply he eventually fired a gun. In an attempt to lessen the disparity in distance rowed by head and tail there were two finishing posts, one for the top and one for the bottom half of a division, two hundred yards apart.

It is reported that, around the turn of the century, it was common practice in Oxford to give your starting rope to the strongest man in college who would try to stretch it to gain a few valuable inches. At this time Cambridge starting procedure used a chain in an attempt to prevent this. Whether this successfully removed the habit, or merely provided more of a challenge, is not recorded.

Following last year's win, David Hardy, the new Head Coach, ran a summer development squad consisting of three eights, chosen out of some 50 or so triallists. Three crews were entered for Marlow Amateur and Henley Royal Regatta (the 1st eight winning Senior 1 at Marlow) and two for the National Championships, where the 1st eight won the Bronze medal behind two national squad eights.

A coaching weekend in September began the months of preparation towards the boat race; about 30 hopefuls were able to attend for some intensive coaching from the head coach and Chris Jones (LRC) before trials proper began. In 0th and 1st week of Michaelmas, a squad of 28 was rapidly selected to train together until the first cut in November, when 18 oarsmen and two coxes were selected as the 1993 squad. Training then began at Abingdon in small boats, thanks to the generosity of the school and its rowing master, Mike Martin. Wins at Tiffin Head confirmed the progress being made by the squad, which contained only one blue from the previous year. The flooding which followed led to the cancellation of the other planned head races, and the squad had to move into eights on the Tideway in order to continue with waterwork. The new 0.U.B.C. training tank and gymnasium were to prove especially useful during this period, as land training coach Paddy Gillespie came into his own.

Having finished off Michaelmas term with a training camp in London, the flooding continued into January and within a week of returning on 4th January, the squad once more had to travel daily to London in order to keep afloat. Selection of two crews

was preceded by the trial eights race on the tideway on Sunday 24th January.


The boat race crew having being named, a second crew, "Nephthys", was selected to train under the guidance of Bill Potter, and both crews returned to Radley College to resume training after river conditions finally became acceptable for rowing. With the aid of a new coaching launch, bought partly with donations from old members of the club who responded to an appeal launched along with the club's own newsletter, progress was swift, and both crews performed well in the Burway and Reading heads, the blue boat winning the senior 2 pennants as the previous year's crew had done. Once again, Dr David Otterburn kept us healthy and injury free, and Jacqueline Boorman, a dietician from the JR began the work of getting the crew down to weight.

Nephthys also entered the Kingston Head before the crew raced in the Head of the River Race, the day before the Henley Boat races. Two creditable performances finished off an exceptionally hard working six months for those in the crew who had elected to stay together despite having no race against Cambridge to aim for. Their efforts this year have ensured a better starting position in next year's Head of the River race (up some 230 places from this year), and have also made the prospect of a reserve mens lightweight race at Henley all the more likely for 1995 to mark the twentieth anniversary of the race.


The Blue Boat moved to Henley under Colin Barratt for final preparations before the race on the 21st March. Training had gone smoothly and in fair conditions the crew produced some exceptionally fast pieces, building on the sharpening work done in races against London RC and Radley College. Conditions turned on the day of the race but had calmed down by the time of the mens race, the last of the day. In slow conditions, Cambridge won by half a length in a time of 5 min 39 secs, a second faster than last year's Oxford crew. Cambridge had been able to capitalise on some aggressive coxing at the start of the race, where they succeeded in pushing Oxford out of the stream. While Cambridge were being warned for washing Oxford down, the Oxford stroke tore some back ligaments taking a catch into Cambridge's wash. Failing to hit its rhythm, the crew allowed Cambridge to go a length up after Remenham. Finally rallying late in the fourth minute of the race, Oxford pushed back but had left too much to do.

The year has, despite losing the race, been an important one for the club. The acquisition of the coaching launch and a coxless four as well as running two crews was done on a tight budget which still left room for cutting the club's overdraft. A management committee now meets regularly to ensure continuity from one year to the next, to plan equipment, financial and coaching needs in the future and to co-ordinate contact with our old members. The newsletter was an important element in this; anyone wishing to receive it (free) should contact the President (Mark Lauder, SEH).

Plans for the summer and for the next year have already been made, and those interested in trialling either for the summer or in the autumn, coxes especially, and anyone interested in the September Coaching camp, should contact any one of the following: M Lauder (SEH), H Collins (Balliol), R Weeks (BNC) by the end of 6th week.




Women's Lightweights 1993

OULRC started training at the beginning of Michaelmas term and trials were held to reduce the initial 25 triallists to a squad of 16. With members of the first development squad returning to trial, talent was of a fairly high standard. Training started at Godstow under the guidance of new Head Coach, Ben Hunt-Davis of Leander Club. Development of the squad's fitness was ensured by the extensive land training at the new OUBC rowing centre, where the rowing tank was especially useful during the appalling weather conditions when flooding closed the river. Due to bad conditions at Henley, the training camp at the end of Michaelmas was moved to the Tideway, where the squad advantageously trained with Thames Tradesmen and UL. Following work in both VIIIs and IVs, the end of the week saw the squad cut to 12. Over the short Christmas break, land training continued and tests were held in early January, preceding a week's training camp at Henley. Having trained with Oxford Polytechnic in Henley, the final crew was selected and continued to train at Radley, Godstow and Henley. OULRC competed in the Reading HORR, with an efficient performance to earn third place overall in the women's section. On March 21st, OULRC rowed with determination in the varsity race but were beaten by a Cambridge crew which broke the lightweight women's course record in 6.18. We were an outstanding crew, but this year Cambridge were exceptional.

Plans for a summer development squad, interacting more with OUWBC are well underway, and we wish the crew of 1994 all the best. The 1993 crew would like to thank their coaches, Ben Hunt-Davis (Leander Club), Charlotte Bamforth (Radley), John Peters (Leander Club), Lizzie Chapman (Thames Tradesmen), Marcus Williams and Adrian Smith, their boatman, Chris Morgan, St. Edward's School Boat Club, especially Geoff Beasley, and everyone who has supported OULRC.

Some surprising faces have once been seen straining at the oar, writes *Cherwell* journalist CHRIS HACKINGTON "Oh yes, I'm ever so proud of it," says actor and personality Lionel Blair as he gazes at the dark blue blade that adorns the wall above his dressing table. "I even did the decor to match, though finding the right shade of eggshell blue curtain tie-backs was a real business. Worth it though, don't you think?" Lionel gained his blue in 1953 — "Coronation year, we were so proud" — and has never regretted the character-forming hours he spent on the river. Some of the training, he confesses, was hard: "Calluses on the hands, I'll admit, were a bit of a problem during the winter. I was doing Aladdin at the Playhouse that Christmas, and regularly laddered two to three pairs of tights each evening while putting them on!" He hoots with laughter as the madcap scenes flood back.

Another unexpected member of the fellowship of the oar is TV's Anneka Rice. She breaks into a broad grin at the thought of her three years in Somerville 1st VIII. "Oh, yes, it was really great. I was at seven and they put me down in the programme as 'Thunderthighs' Rice. I got my own back by putting the cox in as Julie 'What Barge?' Brown and the captain in as Susie 'Jacker' Jones. They were livid, I can tell you! But that's the sort of crew we were — madcap." Did they have much success? "Did we have success or did we have success?!" cries fun-loving Anneka, 34. "I've still got my women's novice pot from Wallingford Regatta. And though we dropped a few places each year, we always had a really super crew dinner afterwards at Pizza Express. It made it all worthwhile."

Noel Edmonds is the first to confess that his wetbob career was not all it might have been. "I was really in it for the fitness aspect," he says, recalling his days at Westminster and Christ Church. Some of his 2500 metre scores on the Christ Church ergometer are still legendary. "Weights and ergo tests, that's what really got me going. They called me 'Ergmeister Edmonds'. I didn't have the technique for a Blue. But I did have a sense of rhythm which certainly helped me as a DJ on Radio Caroline." Was there a connexion between his former sport and the recent appearance of Jonny and Greg Searle on his

current programme? "Well, in a way yes," concedes the madcap ex-Swap Shop presenter with a knowing smile. "Jonny had written to me previously asking for my autograph – he had seen my ergo scores in the Christ Church captain's book – and I said OK as long as he and his brother came on the show. They're two really great lads, make no mistake – just lovely guys. Word is they'll have their own show in the Autumn."

Rowing, as Matthew Arnold noted, is "a good laugh, if a bit knackering". Sir Walter Raleigh echoed this five hundred years previously after rowing in the Oriel head crew of 1539: "I doubt me an there be ought so worthy of a right royster-doyster as a good fothering bump in the Gut." Two much-loved personalities who would certainly agree are News at Ten stars Trevor Macdonald and Sandy Gall. "That's right, we started out as a pair, training for the '56 Olympics after that year's Boat Race," says Sandy. "Trevor's always been a bit of an anchor-man." The cheery locker-room banter breaks out readily. "But we just missed selection," explains Trevor, "so we came back and did the commentary and results service for Eights Week, over the loudspeaker. It was there that we got spotted by the late, great Richard Dimbleby, who was up coaching a Linacre crew, and he whisked us off to international stardom." But they haven't forgotten their roots. "Oh no," says Sandy. "We were back last year for Eights Week and were, I must say, awfully impressed by the commentary team they've got there now. Of course they do a lot more training than in our day, but even so they were very professional."

And so back to Lionel Blair. He has special reason to keep up with the sport he loves so much, as uncle of this year's OUBC president Matthew Pinsent. "Well, I like to think he's learnt a great deal from me," the old stager confides. "Tricks of the trade, you know. I was able to give him some advice before *Question of Sport*. And after the race he came round and had a cry on my shoulder, poor lamb. He's just a big softy at heart."

O.G.S. Crawford, CBE, FBA, editor of Antiquity (Keble 1904-8), archaeologist:

"For four years I rowed every afternoon of term-time and enjoyed it. My rowing career was a success and did me all the good in the world, both in mind and body."

Sir Lawrence Jones ('Jonah'), Blue 1905, 1906, Pres. of OUBC 1907, 2nd in Greats 1907, 1st in History 1908, poet:

"I am left in no doubt that my subconscious self regards no effort, no drudgery too great, if it gives bumps to my college, a win at Mortlake to my university, and at Henley to my school."

A.J.P. Taylor (Oriel 1924-7), historian:

"Needing some exercise in the afternoon I took up rowing which I came to enjoy greatly. I rose to stroking a boat in the spring races and made four bumps."

Whose phrase discreet and prudent,
Whose penchant for a learned theme
Proclaimed the Serious Student:
I never knew a scholar who


Top Two Divisions of TORPIDS

1982-1993




Top Two Divisions of SUMMER EIGHTS 1980-1992
