#### THE NEW ROWING CENTRE

Since 1989, and the launch of the OUBC 150th Anniversary Appeal, over £380,000 has been donated. Oxford rowing now boasts a new rowing centre at the University Sports Centre, Iffley Road, containing an indoor rowing facility and a high-tec gymnasium specially equipped for rowers. Phase I of the £500,000 project is now complete.

Phase II - the building of a new boat house is still short of just over £100,000, in spite of a magnificent donation from the PF Charitable Trust in memory of Philip Fleming, founder of Robert Fleming & Company Limited. As a result of this generous donation, the new boat house will carry the Fleming name.

Following last year's disastrous defeat and the desertion of four of its returning Blues the outlook appeared bleak. A whole new system and outlook was called for to get OUBC back on its feet. There was no way we were going to be able to take on a Cambridge squad with four Olympians without drastically redressing the problems in the club. Our first step was to bring in an entirely new coaching team. Led by Penny Chuter, ARA Chief Coach for the past hundred years, and Dan Topolski, architect of 11 Oxford wins in 12 years, we had the experience and expertise to establish a solid foundation.

This foundation was built on by the toughest squad Oxford has seen in many years. Our mornings became earlier, our days off fewer and the time and concentration on the water set new standards. Though we were buffeted by significant setbacks such as illnesses and constant flooding, throughout it all the men of the squad showed a depth of commitment


that surprised even old hands like Dan and Penny.

We were paid off with a successful run up to the Boat Race. Despite a sub-standard fours head, the autumn showed our pairs and singles to be consistently at the top of all the regattas we entered. Our Trial Eights demonstrated great promise in a great race, with the times of the eights being some of the fastest in Boat Race history. Following training camps in Seville and on the Tideway we formed provisional Blue Boat and Isis crews for our Hilary term fixtures. Solid wins against Brookes and Notts County, along with tough battles against U.L. and I.C. showed how far we had come since September. Looming ahead of us as always was Cambridge, with victories over the Dutch national team and a strong Notts County boat.

The day of the race brought a medium tide and a strong headwind from the west north west, with choppy conditions at the start, worsening around Hammersmith bridge. We were given the Middlesex station, which trades a slight initial bend for the long Surrey bend around Chiswick steps before turning back towards Middlesex at Barnes bridge. Leading slightly off the start, we were level passing the Black Buoy, and by the end of Fulham wall Cambridge had snuck out to a 6-seat lead. There they stuck however, as aggressive steering by Abbie Chapman and determination throughout the boat stopped their advance cold. We held those positions passed Harrods and coming around the first part of the Surrey Bend. As the bend really began to take effect we came out of the shelter into rough water and tightened up slightly. Cambridge seized this opportunity and pushed, managing to break free from us and take our water. Though we closed on them a bit in the final mile, the gap they created was too much and we lost.

Though there was bitter disappointment on the day, there are high hopes for the future of OUBC and our effort to reverse this year and bring a victory to Oxford in 1996. Next year's campaign will be led by Rob Clegg of Keble College, this year's Vice President and with two Blues under his belt. He will be ably supported by Oriel's Martin Brown and Jorn-Inge Throndsen of St. Peter's, as well as returning stalwarts from this year's Blue Boat and Isis. Furthermore, there have been other changes to OUBC which we will see the benefits of in years to come, not just at the University level but throughout the colleges. There are few other places in the world that have the depth of rowers as Oxford college boat clubs, and part of our new mission is to raise the standard of Oxford college rowing back to a formidable level. OUBC is now taking a much more active role in college rowing than in the past, including running coaching seminars with Penny Chuter for college coaches. We are also now running a large development squad to give full support to any college rower who wants to join our fight against Cambridge next year.

My special thanks goes out to all the Isis lads, who get far less recognition than they deserve, our spare men, Richard McKenzie, Rob Knapp and Leila Hudson for their constant support of the squad, and finally to Beefeater Gin for the sponsorship that allows us to run an international level training programme, and to High-5 whose nutritional supplements help us to achieve it.

Women's Blue Boat at Henley Races

Despite the result of the Boat Race, this year has been a very successful one for OUWBC and for Kevin McWilliams in his first year as Chief Coach.

This year got underway with an enthusiastic squad who competed for the first time at the Fuller's Fours Head of the River on 12th November. We won Novice and Senior 2. Pots were won and experience gained at Marlow Fours Head and Bristol University Head. Then, on 16th December, Trial Eights were held in Henley. Sonic, coached by Tim Bramfitt, beat Flash coached by Lynton Richmond and Gordon Buxton.


After Christmas the squad regrouped for a training camp at Kingston, when provisional crews were selected. The squad gained valuable side-by-side experience over the next few weeks, racing against Kingston, Bedford, OUWLC, Thames Tradesmen, Imperial College, Tideway Scullers. In almost all races, the Blue Boat beat the club 1st crews, and in some cases Osiris did too.

On 11th March we had our first race against Cambridge at the Women's Eights Head. The Blue Boat came 7th, beating Cambridge by 8 seconds and winning the University Pennant. Osiris came 13th out of over 200 crews, despite having a last minute crew change.

The final week in Henley arrived and we spent our time rowing, posing for photographers and making our video-diary. It all helped us to remain as calm as possible. The coaches Ali Gill and Gordon Buxton for Osiris, and Haydon Bass, Gus & Kevin McWilliams for the Blue Boat, spent time preparing us mentally and physically for the big day. However, in the event, neither crew was big enough to hold off the Tabs, even though we rowed well and the Blue Boat had the fastest Oxford time ever.

Our thanks go to all our coaches who put in so much time and effort, and to our sponsors Fasta Pasta and March Marketing Communications.



At the top of the first division **Oriel** again looked to be in an unassailable position; their crew including 1 Blue and 4 Isis rowers. **Saint Edmund Hall** were tipped by many to pose the most serious threat to **Oriel**. On the first day **Oriel** rowed over 3 lengths clear of **Pembroke**. **S.E.H.** lost their chance to go ahead as **Christ Church** bumped out ahead of them on the first day. **S.E.H.** would bump **University** and **Christ Church** to finish in third position. **Oriel** maintained the headship, comfortably, over the next three days rowing at least three lengths clear of **Pembroke** on each day. No crew other than **Criel** won blades in the first division. **Brasenose** were unlucky not to get blades bumping **St. John's**, **Worcester** and **University**. On the Saturday **Christ Church** denied them.

In the second division **Trinity** gained their blades by bumping **Queen's**, **L.M.H.**, **Wolfson** and **Oriel II**; **Oriel II** succumbing more easily than had been expected, due to equipment failure after seven strokes. **Merton** also gained their blades and entered the second division in doing so.

At the top of the women's first division Somerville, the head crew, were being chased by an Osler House VIII packed with Blue boat and Osiris oarswomen. On the first day despite a valiant effort from Somerville, Osler House bumped onto head. Osler House maintained the headship easily for the next 3 days. New College bumped up to second place gaining blades in the process. University, Brasenose, Somerville and Pembroke were the displaced crews. St. Hilda's and St. Anne's also gained blades, further down the division. The steady rise of Oriel's women was at last ended, as they suffered the ignominy of being bumped every day (before the gut!).

In the women's second division S.E.H., Hertford, Worcester and Linacre all won blades. Linacre going up six places as they bumped into women's division II.





On the eve of Torpids, many in Oxford believed that **Oriel** might be bumped off head for the first time in 23 years by a **Brasenose** crew that had been training at Wallingford, thus avoiding the red flag which kept many crews off the water unless they were prepared to migrate to other stretches of the Thames. The persistent winter rain and snow ultimately resulted in Torpids being reduced to two days of racing for the men's top division and women's top half division and one day only for the top half of the men's second division and bottom half of the women's first division.

On the Friday **Oriel** held **Brasenose** at a length going past OUBC, when a **Brasenose** push brought them to within a canvas of **Oriel**. The situation was repeated on Saturday, but this time **Oriel** were ready for the **Brasenose** attack and responded with a push of their own to hold off Nose and retain the headship.


A relatively inexperienced **Pembroke** crew were bumped off third place by **Univ** on the Friday, but a sudden bout of illness weakened the latter crew to such an extent that **Pembroke** were almost able to bump back on the Saturday. In the bottom half of the first division, in the circumstances rowing as the second division, **Balliol** received a technical bump on the Friday for failing to don their cox in a lifejacket, whilst **Oriel II** bumped back into the division, catching **LMH** forty seconds after the gun. On the Saturday **Oriel II** closed to a canvas on **Balliol** by the gut, but then decided to take a detour through it and some time later emerged a length down. In the third division (usually known as the top half of the second), **Lincoln** quickly bumped **LMH**.


In the women's division Osler were heavily tipped to catch Somerville and did so on the Friday convincingly, leaving Somerville to defend itself from being overbumped by New. This did not happen as New's cox attempted to T-bone Somerville along the green bank and missed. New succeeded on the Saturday. In the lower half of the division, racing only on Saturday, Univ succumbed to Pembroke early on, leaving the way clear for Oriel to achieve an impressive overbump, catching University at the end of the green bank.







St. Hilda's bump University







Between divisions, the OUBC will operate a ferry from the OUBC boat house to the lower end of the college boat houses, on each night of Eights from noon until 20 minutes after the First Division has finished (or later if by agreement with the ferryman).

The use of the ferry is restricted to college crews, those assisting college boat clubs and those authorized by the OUBC officers with priority for the latter, and for coaches. No alcohol may be carried on the ferry. Coxes are asked to look out for the ferry and to steer clear of it, since the ferry will be used when the river appears empty.

No one may operate the ferry except those authorized by the OUBC. College boat clubs are responsible for the proper use of the ferry by their members. Ferrymen have discretion in deciding priority for passengers if necessary. The OUBC thanks ferrymen for their voluntary help, in particular Old Westminsters.

# Rowing in Oxford: An American Perspective

When I first thought of coming to Oxford, rowing, it seemed, was automatically a part of the picture. The two entities are somehow inextricably connected in the popular imagery that commonly dominates an American's imagination concerning Oxford. In much the same way that my English mates have a fixed image of Americans as nothing but obese, guntoting, couch potatoes, where I come from, England is still thought of as a land of chivalry and supercilious pale people. As this picture melted away, so too did my dreams of Oxford rowing, for upon my arrival I learned that I was associated with the college that had been keeping the Torpids Headship tightly tucked under its armpits for over two decades.

But things began to look better in the land of Oriel once the training began. What I was most relieved to learn was that no matter where you are, training is training, and I settled down into the monotony of ergos and weight sessions just as if I was back home. That is the one universally valid axiom concerning rowing, or any other sport for that matter; hard work pays off, no matter what country you are in. As the water training began I was disheartened to hear the coaches voice drifting over the roar of the launch motor, "Three man, are you from America?" Unfortunately, whether it was my poor technique, or just a different style of rowing, I stuck out like a sore thumb in an

English crew. That is when I began to realize that rowing, as a sport, a pastime, or just as a spectator event, has a special place in the hearts and minds of the English people. Whether it is intertwined with the nation's heritage that London patriots hold on to so tightly every Sunday afternoon in Hyde Park, or whether it is simply a part of the culture that the English believe makes them unique, rowing here is different. It seemed that every rower I bumped into had been rowing since before their voice had gone through its adolescent change, and I knew that I was out of my league. This is not to say that English boats will always go faster and win more medals in international competitions, but rather to note that the commoner's perspective of the sport is very much askew relative to their former counterparts across the Atlantic.

At my home university, Boston College in Chesnut Hill, Massachusetts, rowers are regarded as a strange breed of loonies who enjoy masochism and don't mind rolling out of bed when it is still dark out and the birds have not yet begun to chirp. Last year, our boat club president had trouble getting the university to allow him to live on campus. When I arrived at Oriel, I was shown the room of the boat club captain, which lies somewhere between a fraternity house, a locker room and a rowing museum. I can assure you that the captain did

not have any trouble moving in. Rowers here, and I am sure some anti-boaties will disagree, are treated by some as almost demi-gods who have the strength of ten men and haul the hopes, prestige and aspirations of their entire college down the Isis each February and May. I rubbed my eyes as I saw the row of boathouses on the Isis, a far cry from the virtual garage that my team calls home in America. Certainly, there are some grand boathouses that line the Charles or the Schukhvill back home, but I have just never had the pleasure of rowing out of them. That is what is so unique about rowing in Oxford. Any student, no matter how uncoordinated or unfit, has a place at their college's boathouse, whether it be in the 5th Torpid, or just to have a few beers on race day. Oxford, far from an equal opportunity in itself, has continued to hold open this grand old English tradition to all who come.

Rowing over Head in Torpids is an experience that will stay with me for the rest of my life, and this is not because we rowed hard for five minutes and avoided getting bumped (however narrowly) but rather it is because for one brief moment in time, I was a part of a grandiose tradition and legacy that remains so much bigger than any of the people that make it up. I have been slagged off in hall at least once a week since I got here by gaggles of

America-bashing peers who force me to be responsible for every action, person or problem in my home country. But for one frozen second in time, whether my hat was turned back to front, I needed a map to find the places I wanted to photograph, or I was wearing white socks, it did not matter, I belonged.

Rowing here in Oxford is like getting married in today's modern world, everyone has done it once. Some people quickly get out of it, because it can be a very painful experience, but some people dedicate their life to it, and then, and only then, is it that you begin to truly appreciate the beauty and power of the sport.





Women's Lightweights Winners at Henley Races with trophy

Our success in the 1995 Henley varsity race had indeed been long-awaited — Oxford had last won in dim and distant 1986. Our win by two lengths, the biggest margin of all 1995 Henley boat races, not only prevented Cambridge from sweeping the rowing events this year, but was the first success for an Oxford women's crew since the Blue Boat won in 1991.

Looking back in October, it was surprising that after the 1994 crew's excellent performance in their varsity race, only 18 rowers came to lightweight trials. But thanks to head coaches Ben Hunt-Davis (Leander and Great Britain) and Dot Blackie (Thames and Great Britain), we had plenty of motivation — both on the water and in the gym — to keep focused on beating Cambridge.

A squad of 12 was selected for a pre-Christmas training camp in Henley, which culminated in a 3-way race against two OUWBC crews over the Henley Boat Race course. This was to be the first of a series of valuable side-by-side racing experiences. A second Henley training camp was held in early January. Back in Oxford for Hilary term, mind-numbing steady-state was fortunately supplemented by side-by-side races nearly every weekend with local rowing clubs.

Since the race, (slightly tighter fitting!) lightweight kit has been well-represented on the Isis in the build-up to VIIIs Week, and everyone (apart from our St Hilda's pair) is enjoying the break from steady-state. The OULRC crew will race together again in Women's Henley. Looking further ahead, we hope that this year's success will encourage many college rowers to take part in the Windrush development squad, and to trial for the blue boat in Michaelmas term. Through closer cooperation with OUWBC, we hope to strengthen women's rowing at Oxford. In the end, we all have the same goal to beat Cambridge.



# The thoughts of Martin Brown

MARTIN BROWN

The following is an extract from the OUBC Presidential election speech of Martin Brown. It has been reproduced here partly to provide a unique insight into current thinking within the squad and partly because some of the issues raised are similar to those faced by other squads within the University and College boat clubs. Certain sections have been removed so as not to help the Tabs.

Good evening and thank you for coming. I intend to divide my speech into four parts. In the first I want to offer you a vision for the future of the OUBC, in the second I intend to 'put some meat on the bones' by outlining a plan for the six months run up to the race. In the third section I will outline what I see as the role for the support team of the OUBC, and in the final section I will try to suggest some reasons why you should vote for me as President.

#### A Vision of the Future

The system we had in place this year achieved, I think, more than most people could have possibly imagined in September. In the last six months we have taken a very diverse group of people with widely differing levels of rowing ability and formed a very strong squad. A lot of credit needs to be given to not only the athletes involved in the system but to the coaches and backup team which made this possible.

To win a boat race you need two things, a strong squad of people trialing and a system which takes those people and develops their rowing as much as possible. My concern with the current system is that it performs the latter criteria well but may be detrimental to the first.

This year at OUBC nine people did not make themselves available for trials. These were either junior internationals, senior internationals or old blues. Some did not trial because of disgruntlement and others because of time pressures. What OUBC must become is an organisation which takes in freshers as they arrive at the University and is set up so as to allow them to row for OUBC throughout their University career. I believe that it is only with this continuity that we will win. If we have a system in place which puts people off trialing, because they see that it is necessary to place your life on hold for the

six months before the Boat Race, then maybe it is the system itself which is stopping us winning, because we will find ourselves in a situation of having to train a different group of people up from scratch every year. What we need is to train people all year round and have them come back the following year.

A common question asked of all Presidential candidates is why did Isis Iose. I have been involved with the OUBC since Autumn of 1990, and since then I can say that the top sixteen oarsmen at Oxford have not rowed on Boat Race day. Isis has a dual role within the Oxford system, not only does it nurture talent for the following year's race, but it also pushes the Blue boat in training. If Isis are being more professional in training and pushing the Blue boat, which naturally they will as there is always someone in Isis who believes he should have made the first boat, then the Blue boat will respond and increase the level of their game. This relationship ultimately helps both boats. If Isis is weaken, either by those who do not make the Blue boat dropping out of the squad, or not trialing at all then this does not happen and is detrimental to the whole squad.

So, what is required is a system designed so that we have a great deal of continuity between years, the same oarsmen rowing every year, and all year round, for OUBC. There are two ways to achieve this. The first method is to count on people's loyalty to the OUBC and expect them to come back every year because you think it is what they must do. The second method is to set up a system which makes people want to row for Oxford rather than driving down the road to Leander. I intend to follow the second approach.

So how am I going to achieve this? I intend to move the operation to Sandford and row in the early mornings. It would be my aim that people left Oxford at apx 6.35am and were on the water at 7am at Sandford. This would mean that land training could occur in the evenings. Physiologically this would be beneficial since it would place eight hours between sessions rather than four. This would also free up people's afternoons for work. Presently with land training in the early mornings and rowing in the afternoon, athletes have four hours in the morning to work and then the evening, at which point they have probably completed something in excess of four hours of hard training and are often too tired to work.

Under the new system eight hours of time would be available to work in having only trained once. Time on the water would be absolutely sacrosanct and would not be reduced from this year.

#### 'The final six months'

In the Michelmas term I see two boat types dominating, the single scull and coxed four. I believe that physiologically there is great benefit to be derived from doing the longer workouts in the single. It also provides a platform to work on individual aspects of your technique. If you are in, for example, a pair and wish to work on your finish then you are dependent on your partner's co-operation. Also, in pairs, you get a different training effect at stroke and bow since the stroke must work harder. In an Eight it generally takes half an hour or so for everybody to warm up to the same level and start working together. It is also possible to hide in an Eight, you come back half an hour later than everyone else in a single.

Under my proposed system the four would play a duel role. It is obviously necessary to teach people to row as well as scull and the four is the ideal platform to do this in. The four can also play a vital role in selection if used properly. For some of the steady state outings two coxed fours side by side would be used. This gives the coaches an early opportunity to see how combinations of athletes work together so giving an early guide to selection. I would hope this would then free up the Seville training camp from selection and allow us to utilise the flat water purely for technique. With all training camps I believe that nine to ten days is sufficient and that staying longer is counter productive. Running a training camp over two weekends and the intervening week also means graduates only have to take one week off work and not two.

#### 'The Support Team'

OUBC has traditionally been poor at giving support to its athletes. This year several steps forward have been made and I intend to push that considerably further.

Physiotherapy – I see the physio as having a key role within the squad. If an athelete is injured and cannot train with the

group there is often a sense of isolation. To spend six hours a day with the same group of people and then suddenly none is a dramatic change. I intend to have a physio at the sports centre daily during the land training so that injured athletes can be treated and still interact with the group.

Doctor – I see it as essential that there is a doctor available to see any ill athletes on a same day basis.

Physiologist — If, in the final fortnight I suggested we adopted a new style of technique I would be met with ridicule, and rightly so. I suggest that introducing visualisation in the final fortnight is therefore too late. I intend to work with a physiologist on a weekly basis, particularly for the younger squad members. I trialed for the squad when I was eighteen and it is a particularly challenging experience. You have just arrived in Oxford, are thrown into a new system of work, a heavy training schedule and expected to make new friendships all in one go. If the squad is going badly in the first year there can be few people to turn to within Oxford.

#### Conclusion


This year Jeremiah has done a lot of behind the scenes work setting OUBC on a firmer long term footing. If elected I would continue this work and restructure the system so as to put the visual part of OUBC on a long term footing which would take good oarsmen into the squad and provide the support they need to row for their whole time in Oxford and work. Under my system athletes benefit by having more time to work in and OUBC benefits by having a higher standard of rower. Everyone benefits and we win the Boat Race. Thank you.


# Top Two Divisions of TORPIDS




