

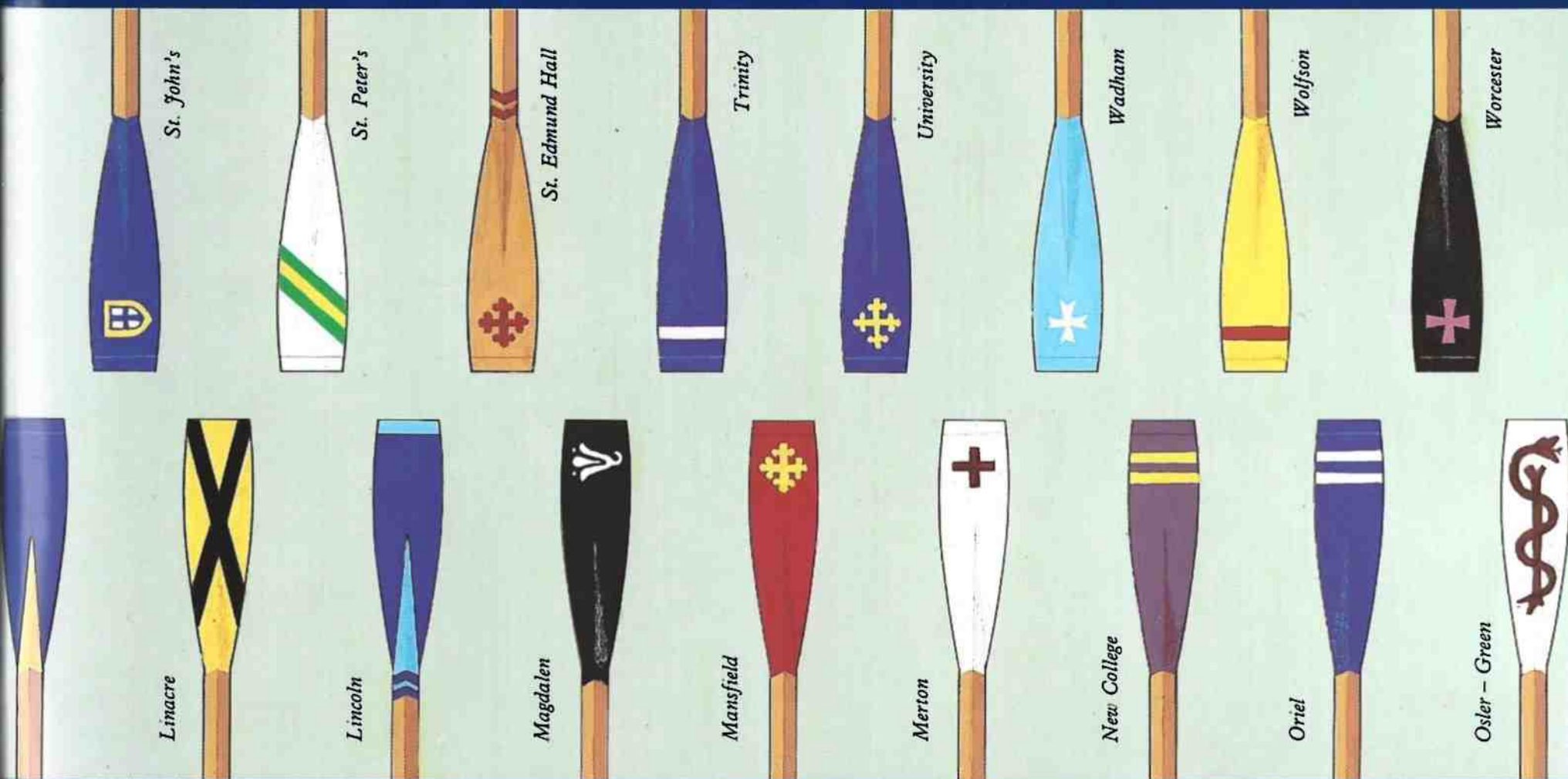

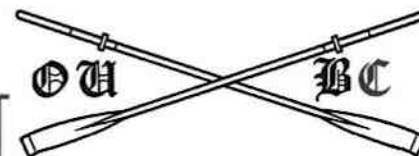

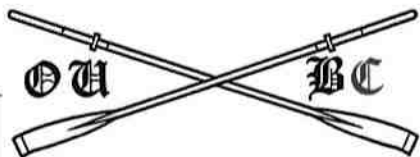

Training for the 1998 Boat Race began in October in the form of a two week camp based in Oxford prior to the Michaelmas term. Sean Bowden, as the new chief coach, and Chris Nilsson as his assistant soon got things under way in preparation for the first external event of the year – the IV's Head. The results from this race, our first clash with the opposition, was, with hindsight, a taster of things to come, with the top end of the Cambridge squad out-performing their Oxford counterparts, whilst at the lower end the situation was reversed.

With the squad already cut down to around twenty, training continued at Wallingford and in the Gym at Iffley Road. The National Ergo Championships – oh joy, oh joy! – was the next time for the two squads to meet and apart from an enormous 5:32 for 2000m by the Cambridge top German, they seemed to be level-pegging. As Christmas approached two events took place – Trial VIII's, and the national long-distance pairs trials. "Iceman" and "Maverick" lived up to their names, the eventual result being that having crashed and burned shortly after Hammersmith Bridge, and subsequently been restarted, "Maverick" got stuck in "Iceman's" jet-wash and lost by 3 lengths. The pairs trials were more successful, with our first four pairs coming in 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 7th overall.

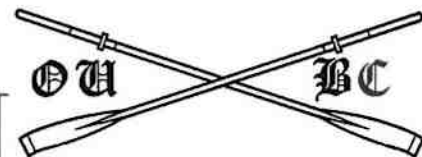
Ten days of training at home over Christmas was followed by a fortnight's training camp in Spain. Fine weather allowed us some useful training, and we returned to a flooded river in Wallingford to finalise our selection. The crews having been chosen, we began the run up to the Boat Race with some racing on the Tideway in order to familiarise ourselves with the course.

The final fortnight was spent half in Holland, and half in London. Both crews were picking up good speed in the penultimate week on the calm waters of the Bosbaan rowing lake in Amsterdam. On returning to London we got our first glimpse of the Cambridge boats, and found ourselves to be almost exactly a stone per man lighter than their Blue Boat!

The Isis-Goldie race was an epic, with Goldie leading by $\frac{3}{4}$ length until Barnes Bridge when Isis stormed through to win three lengths, the first time since 1989. The Blue Boat, hoping to emulate the Isis crew, were level with Cambridge until a bas clash shortly after the Mile-post which knocked them out of their rhythm, allowing Cambridge to gain an advantage which they could capitalise upon around the Surrey bend. With clear water Cambridge steered in front of Oxford, and the margin remained fairly small along Chiswick Eyot, and then extended itself to three lengths at the finish, with both crews well within the course record.

The rowing has not, however, stopped there, and three members of the squad have made it into the British Senior National Team, and a further four into the Under-23 Team for their respective World Championships in the summer. Two crews will be competing at Henley – a Visitor's Cup IV – and possibly a Temple Challenge Cup VIII – comprising largely of the winning Isis crew plus potential squad members for next year.

There will be a preliminary training camp for the two weeks prior to the beginning of the Michaelmas term to which everyone wishing to trial for the 1999 Boat Race squad is encouraged to attend. Any queries should be directed to the new President, Charlie Humphreys, Oriel.

After the much improved, though disappointing, results of the 1997 Henley Boat Races, OUWBC were on the right track for success in the 1998 races. With our chief coach, Ben Hunt-Davis, returning for another year, a strong squad and continued support from our sponsors, spirits were high for a good season.

Training began on the Radley stretch with a very profitable two week pre-term camp, resulting in rapid improvement in both technique and fitness. Ben Hunt-Davis included on his coaching team, amongst others: Sid Rand, Gordon Buxton, Matt Pinsent, Angus McChesney, David Nelson, John Lake, Garry Herbert, John Scottorn, Dot Blackie and Sean Bowden. Under their watchful eye we completed eight water sessions per week, plus 4 on land.

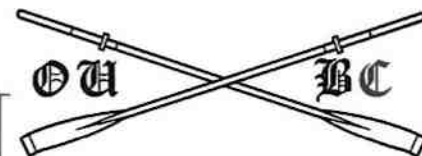
Our work was paying off when in November Helen Casey won the National Indoor Rowing Championships (lightweight category), and at the well attended Wallingford Head in December OUWBC won the Senior One, Two and Three categories. This reflected the depth that was being built into the squad. The term culminated in a Trial VIII's race at the end of a hard two week's camp in Henley.

Our residential post-Christmas camp was held on the flooded Henley stretch, where we were unable to get out onto the water as much as we would have liked owing to the adverse conditions. However, the two weeks were very profitable, with three land/water sessions per day.

During the Hilary term we spent most weekends racing various club crews, usually successfully, in Henley. By the final week we felt we knew our stretch back to front and the ultimate race preparation went extremely well for both crews, with confidence brimming for the result we wanted.

On race day Osiris rowed a gutsy race, being beaten by a very strong Blondie crew. The Oxford Blue Boat was always in contention, hanging on at three quarters of a length down for most of the race, but the final push was not enough to overhaul Cambridge.

Despite another year of disappointing results for OUWBC, the future looks bright for the club. Ben Hunt-Davis has turned Oxford women's rowing around and has left a healthy legacy for our new head coach, Rob Dauncey, whilst he chases his Olympic dream. I firmly believe that Rob is the man to take over from what Ben has started, to finish the job and take us to victory in 1999. Will you be a member of one of the winning Oxford crews? I'm looking for anyone willing to rise to the challenge... help to make 1999 our year.

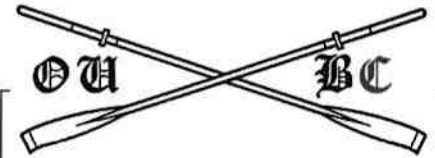

Eights Week 1997 saw some extremely exciting racing, particularly at the top of the men's first division, where **Magdalen** surpassed all expectations to push **Oriel** extremely hard on three out of the four days of racing. **Oriel**, though, remained Head, despite **Magdalen** closing to a third of a length at one stage. In the top two divisions, only one crew other than the Head crew won blades: **Queen's** came storming out of the third division to gain their bumps with clinical speed and efficiency. In so doing, they helped send **Oriel II** to the foot of the second division, where it is now just two places above **New College II**, the next highest second boat.

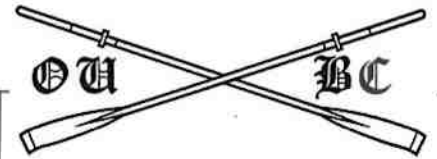
Keble and **Worcester** may well be crews to look out for this year, both having joined the first division last year. The year in general showed great fluidity, with no crew rowing over on all four days.

In the women's division, **Osler-Green** remained at Head with ease. **St. Catz**, their immediate pursuers, never threatened and themselves succumbed to **New College** on the Saturday. **Wadham** and **LMH** were the only other senior crews to win blades; again, these may well be crews to watch this Eights.

The rowers and spectators of Torpids this year were deprived of the final day's racing, providing something of an anti-climax to the exhilaration of the first three days. **Oriel** remained unbumped off Head for the twenty-seventh year in a row, with no threat coming from a very fast **Pembroke** crew, which in its turn rowed well clear of those chasing. **New College** moved up two places to third on the river; otherwise the top boats were relatively static. **Oriel II**, after last year's success, dropped four places and became sandwich boat in the process; their decline seemed almost minor beside that of **Exeter II**, who marked this year's biggest fall in going down eleven places.

In the women's divisions, **Osler-Green** dominated, rowing over very comfortably all three days.

There was some controversy over the awarding of blades after only three days of racing; among those who might have one them were **Trinity**, **Lincoln** and **St. John's**, all of whom moved up at the expense of **St. Hilda's**.

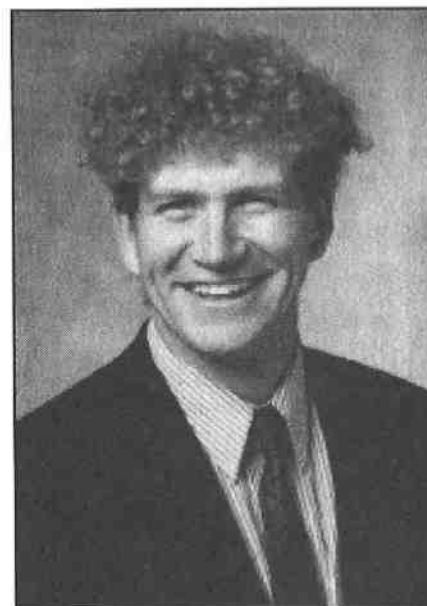

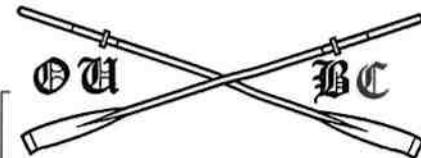

Between divisions, the OUBC will operate a ferry between the OUBC boat house and the lower end of the college boat houses, on each night of Eights from 12.00 noon until 20 minutes after the First Division has finished (or later if by agreement with the ferryman). For ferrying, a punted canoe to carry three and a punt to carry six, will be used. When the canoe is operating, please use it in preference to the punt. Passengers must follow any ferryman's instructions.

The use of the ferry is restricted to college crews, those assisting college boat clubs and those authorized by the OUBC officers with priority for the latter, and coaches. No alcohol may be carried on the ferry. Coxes should look out for the ferry and steer clear of it.

No one may operate the ferry except those authorized by the OUBC. College boat clubs are responsible for the proper use of the ferry by their members. Ferryman will decide priority for passengers if necessary. The OUBC thanks the ferrymen for their voluntary service.

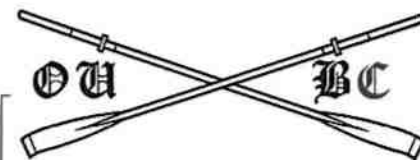

Sadly we had had a poor start and, despite our best efforts, we were unable to come back through an extremely determined Cambridge crew. Our congratulations to them on an excellent win.

In a field of top class heavyweight crews we managed to come 3rd in a gripping final, beating Cambridge by two seats in the process. Women's Lightweights 1998

Under the direction of new coach John Scottorn, this years lightweights couldn't have had a much more successful season. A strong squad began training in September and went on to record 3 category wins at Marlow and Wallingford Heads, racing in eights and fours.

After two 10-day training camps in Henley over the Christmas vacation, we returned to Radley and the crew and 4 reserves were selected.

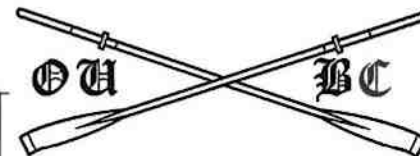
Wins at Henley and Reading Heads, where the crew recorded the fastest women's times of the day provided more valuable racing experience. Our reserves raced in a four at Henley and won their category, their time beaten only by an elite crew, reflecting the strength of the whole squad.

Private fixtures against City of Oxford (Town v. Gown races), Old Blues and training sessions with many local clubs were all successful and boosted the crew's morale.

Our only set-back came when one of the crew developed a stress-fracture in her rib a few weeks before the race. She continued to row, with our spares stepping in when necessary to ensure we continued to get on the water.

The final week before the race was calm and relaxed. On race day we took the lead off the start and extended this to 3/4 length by about half-way. In a race reminiscent of the previous two years, an impressive Cambridge crew pushed hard and slowly closed the gap over the final 750m. However Oxford held on to the lead and were awarded a canvas win, in a time of 6.36.

This was only the third ever Oxford victory in the 15 year history of the race, and much is owed to John Scottorn for his total commitment to the club. John will be returning next year so you can count on a strong 1999 crew. Women's Development Squad begins after Summer Eights and if you want to be part of next year's Henley Races, then get involved. Don't be put off by the misconception that you need anything other than dedication to trial – one of this year's crew had only ever rowed for her college 2nd VIII.

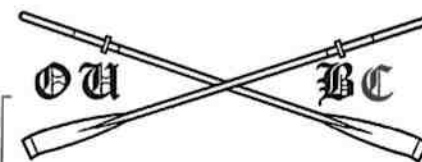

A true insight into the Isis-Goldie boat race can neither be had solely by watching the race of March 28th, nor by merely hearing of its' outcome. The initial events leading to this first Isis win since 1989 (and the first win on the Tideway since 1992) occurred in late September, when Andrew Lindsay took firm control of the reins of the OUBC. He helped create a professional and friendly atmosphere in which both coaches and athletes could get on with the job at hand whilst feeling as relaxed as possible. Over the many months of early morning weight circuits, ergs and afternoon rowing sessions, a positive bond was established between every person in the squad, whether coach, rower, physio or doctor. Furthermore, the squad enjoyed each others' company outside the rowing program, a relationship resulting in many memorable nights. Many a time has such Oxford landmarks as the dog races, Easy Listening and, of course, DTM's, found themselves invaded en masse by tall, Herculean rowers.

Throughout the season, from a coach's perspective, the selection of an Isis crew must have been extremely daunting. At the beginning of the year, the new coaching staff; head coach Sean Bowden and development coach Chris Nilsson, had to come to terms with the fact that less than thirty rowers in the whole of Oxford wished to trial for the OUBC. After the initial selection, an excellent first boat looked possible, as did a reasonable second boat. However, as the season progressed three of the better rowers dropped out due to the prospect of not making the Blue Boat. Coach Chris Nilsson with the assistance of Kevin McWilliams, endeavoured to look at what they had left. On the positive side, Toby Ayres, Simon Cottle and Alex Cooper were back from the previous year's Isis, and Rick Evelyn and Edward Foster seemed to be moving a pair along quite nicely. Unfortunately Alex Cooper was ill for several months and the rest of the squad was made up of novices including an OUABC boxer and an OUSC swimmer. Consequently, the Isis crew was not finally selected until just over a month to race day. One Blue Boat member remarked that "the Isis crew consists of nine thugs held together by a thin plastic shell". Nothing could have been closer to the truth.

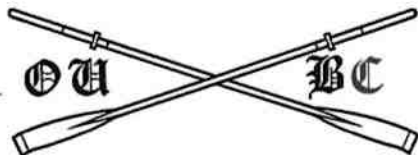
Henceforth, the Isis crew began to acquire a personality. A stringent set of mental toughness tests were developed by the crew and combined with the training. The tests, which monitored the time to distraction by an outside event, did at times lead to unacceptable failures. Some could not endure the bouncing of a football off the back of their head or having a megaphone yelled into their ear.

Isis Boat Race Report

On March 28th, the training paid off. An event of this size has many distractions, however the team remained firmly together in both focus and purpose. There was no way that the Tabs were going to get clear water off the start and we were going to be right beside them coming under Hammersmith Bridge. We were confident that at some point, one of their men would break before one of ours. As the race progressed, our vision became real. At the two minute point, where the tabs usually push away, their president at stroke yelled across at full voice "Goodbye Crisis, see you at the finish!". They were not to get away. Following this, a dramatic clash of blades commenced which could have finished the race. Isis kept focused and maintained their rhythm whilst Goldie faltered.

The fatigue of the race continued as Isis rowed three quarters of a length down and most of the Isis crew were blind to the fact that Goldie were even beside them. The bend turned in Isis's favour and finally after twelve minutes every member of Isis was able to clearly see Cambridge, in the distance. The Cambridge crew broke entirely as Isis strode through to the finish line in a record time for the contest of 16:02.

Isis had proved that the Oxford rowing system is effective, and that with continuing interest and dedication from Oxford athletes, a Blue Boat win is imminent.

1986-1998

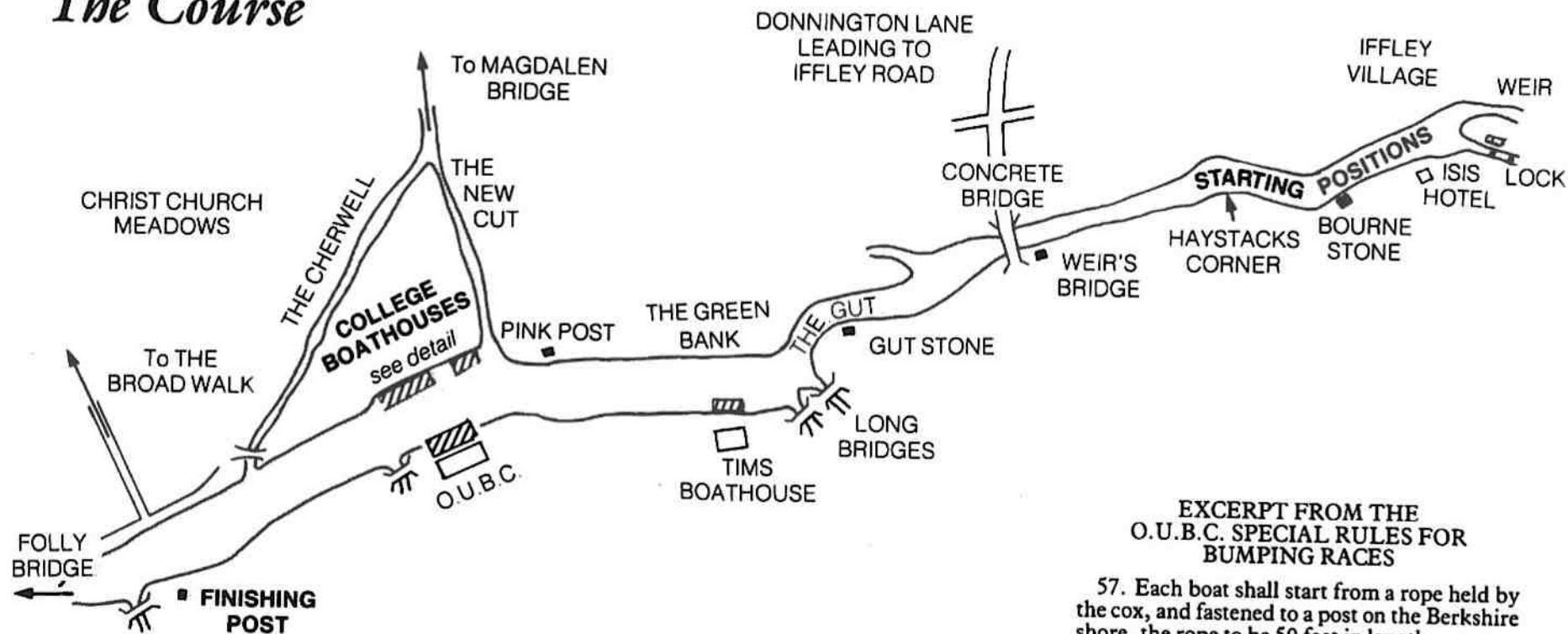

EXCERPT FROM THE O.U.B.C. SPECIAL RULES FOR BUMPING RACES

57. Each boat shall start from a rope held by the cox, and fastened to a post on the Berkshire shore, the rope to be 50 feet in length.
58. The last boat shall be stationed above the Starting Ring, and the distance between the posts shall be 130 feet for Eights.
65. The President shall provide a starter who shall fire a signal gun for the boats to take their places; after four minutes another gun; after the interval of one minute another gun for the start; after this third gun the Race shall always be held to have begun . . .
67. When a boat touches any part of the boat in front of it, or its oars or rudder, it shall be considered a bump, and also if a boat rows clean by another it shall be equivalent to a bump.
69. After every bump the boat bumping shall change places with the boat bumped whatever be their order before starting.
