
It has not been easy for anyone at OUBC to swallow the loss of the Boat Race or the Isis/Goldie race this year. All season we were beset by adversity only to come through it stronger, faster and more cohesive as a team. We turned every disadvantage into an advantage. Between Christmas and the Boat Race we spent a total of three weeks rowing out of our Boathouse at Wallingford, the rest of the time we commuted around the country to London, Dorney or wherever there wasn't flooding. For many weeks we trained twice a day on the ergs and as a result we were best to have the best ergo average of any Blue Boat ever.

As the day drew near the whole squad walked with a bounce in our step, everyone believing that we could pull off one of the greatest upsets in recent history. We went on a training camp to the docks and clocked very fast times; in absolute terms, we were the fastest Oxford Blue Boat ever. The programme all year had been very scientific, gradually becoming tailored to people's individual needs and the improvement was a marked result. Our warm up on the day had been planned minutely with the help of a sports psychologist, and the result was our best ever warm up. Nerves were banished and it helped to ensure that our start was our best ever race start. In short, we were ready for anything, Olympians and World Champions in the Cambridge Boat not withstanding.

As it turned out we were ready for anything except for what actually resulted. In a cruel twist of fate, the same rains that had ruined our training all year, brought flood waters even to the broad Thames. The outside station was heavily disadvantaged, our real chance of winning was to get a good strong lead and get in front early enough so that we could tuck into the side. We accepted this, understood it and were in the process of doing it when the Umpire stopped the race and pulled us backed to start level. This removed our physical advantage and more importantly our psychological advantage of having exploded out of the blocks and settled into a long rhythm.


We started again a seat down and pointing the wrong way and the rest of the race we desperately held on with a gutsy row of which I will forever be proud. After the professionalism, belief and enthusiasm with which we approached this year, defeat was a bitter pill to swallow. You cannot be a good loser when you sacrifice everything for the one event. This year, only 20 people came through the door to begin training. Oxford can have the better programme, coaching and support. It is time for the colleges and the university to get behind the OUBC and for rowers turning up and giving it a go. It is an amazing experience — give yourself the chance to compete for glory.





After the debacle of the rained off Torpids, a number of crews were looking to prove what might have been. In the men's competition, **Pembroke**, **Oriel**, **Exeter** and **Christchurch** had all been denied the chance to battle it out. In the women's competition, **Osler-Green** were relieved to see the week go by without a stroke taken.

The various regattas in the calendar before Summer Eights: Bedford and MarchFirst in particular, had already given a clear indication of the form of the various crews in the men's 1st division. **Oriel** had already beaten **Christchurch** and **Exeter** in side-by-side races and also, indirectly, **Pembroke**. There was a lot more uncertainty at the top of women's division 1, with a weak **Osler-Green** being chased by strong crews from **Pembroke** and **New**, both with various **University** parswomen on board.


At the beginning of Eights week the river was once again on red flag, much to everyone's despair. However, conditions improved and the top divisions raced in half divisions on the first day and the lower divisions raced on the Friday and Saturday.

In the women's competition Osler-Green were bumped off head by Pembroke on the Wednesday and were bumped again by New on Thursday. They would in fact go down four places, ending their reign that had begun in 1994. Thus Pembroke and New were left to battle it out on the Friday and Saturday. New made a quick start on the Friday to close to within a canvas going into the gut, but Pembroke held their nerve and pulled away. The Saturday saw New close again, but again Pembroke controlled the situation to win their Headship. Other risers in women's division 1 were Merton (up 3 to 8th place) and Magdalen (4 bumps in 3 days to finish 9th). Further down Keble stormed into division 2 with 5 bumps. University and Brasenose were the main 1st division casualties, falling 4 and 5 places respectively.

By contrast, men's division one saw few changes, and most of these at the expense of **Brasenose** plummeting. **Lincoln**, with 3 Blues and an Isis oarsman on board rose four places to finish 11th. They failed to win blades however as they failed to bump on the Saturday when **Christchurch** hit the falling **Brasenose** crew ahead of them. **Balliol** bumped **New** on Friday as they went up two places to 5th. They might have done this on the Thursday but the division was halted due to a pile up lower down the division. By the time **Oriel, Pembroke** and **Exeter** had stopped and turned round, there was no time for a re-row. After a lot of arguing and shouting everyone was sent home, with **Exeter** having put **Pembroke** under a lot of pressure before the stop.


Oriel rowed over around 5-6 lengths clear of Pembroke each day until on the Saturday they easy-oared outside their boathouse, then inexplicably crashed into the bank 100 metres later. This contretemps forced an unscheduled stop before rowing off again to finish on their distance. Other movers and shakers in division 2 (apart from Lincoln) were Hertford and Wadham (both up 3). University and St. John's joined Brasenose in winning spoons.

A moment that those involved will not forget occurred in women's division 5. In a multiple boat pile up in the gut the stroke of **Christchurch III** got ejected from her boat and was left swimming around as more boats crashed into the back of the stationary crews. In a moment of tragic-comic genius the safety launch arrived swiftly, too swiftly in fact, as it sped straight into **Christchurch IV** causing severe damage to the bows. (Apologies if the unfortunate crews were not those named, a year on those people interviewed by the Aussie Chicken may not remember exactly).



Other movers in Men's Division One were NEW who fell two, being bumped by EXETER and CHRIST CHURCH, while ST. CATZ won blades, rising four places. MERTON fell a whole division and BALLIOL was another big dissapointment, dropping out of Men's Division Two.

ST.CATZ bumped to Head in the Women's Division, knocking NEW down one in the process. Merton were another big riser, winning blades to end third on the river. ORIEL women went some way to repeat the success of their men, rising seven places, while TRINITY plumeted, and will be keen to reverse this fall come Eights.





The ferry is under the control of the College Secretary of the OURC's who is responsible for all the organisation of Eights.


The use of the ferry is for college crews, those assisting college boat clubs and for OURC officers, with priority for the latter and for coaches. Those who wish to cross on the ferry should consult a steward or marshal who may decide priority for those crossing. The ferry rafts are out of bounds to those without permission to cross.

No alcohol may be carried on the ferry. College boat clubs are responsible for the proper use of the ferry by their members.

Leo John Blockley

4 January 1979 - 29 December 2000

Leo Blockley, 21, a popular and well-liked member of the Oxford men's lightweight squad, disappeared during a training outing on the River Ebro on December 29, when freak circumstances led to the swamping of two eights. This occurred during a training camp held in Amposta, near the east coast of Spain. His parents flew out from Manchester to be near the scene, but had to return to England. His body was found 5km downstream by a local fireman and rower, four weeks later.

Leo was someone who gave everything that he had to everything that he did; it was not in his nature to do anything half-heartedly. He leaves behind many happy and good memories of his life and his character.

Leo was a graduate of Downing College, Cambridge where he had studied Maths, and had come to Oxford in October to do a MSc in Statistics at Lincoln College, whose rector, Paul Langford, said, 'the college deeply regrets the loss of a young man with so much already achieved and so much yet to offer'. He had always shown himself a talented mathematician, but his talents did not end there, being a fanatical sportsman, both in competing and supporting.





Despite regular cancellations in the racing calendar, we did manage to race at Upper Thames Small Boats Head, Head of the Trent and the Women's Head of the River Race, where we were extremely pleased with the development of the squad, having missed such huge chunks of our water training.


Obviously the result against Cambridge in Nottingham was gutting, but we know we rowed the fastest 2km race we were able to produce that day. The race crew bonded very well early on, after a very tough selection process, which involved extensive seat racing on several occasions. Those who were in Staffordshire with us in January will remember the coaching team having to break the morning ice with a paddle on the third day of racing. I'm fairly sure most of us smile looking back on the collection of personalities in the crew and the squad as a whole – an interesting blend of control freaks, some cool and calm, a few sharp comedians and a space cadet or two...representative I am sure of Oxford rowers in general. Despite rigorous land training, we were out-powered by a fairly experienced crew this year so there's some extra motivation to drive next year's triallists and help bring back the shield, which has been ours for the previous 3 consecutive years.

Several members of the squad who are not buried in finals at the moment (and some of those that are...) are competing in fours, eights and pairs and producing some strong results, indicative of the dedication shown throughout this season by all. Many are of course also racing in summer eights.

For those of you who want to take rowing to University level, I cannot recommend summer development squad strongly enough. I joined it in my second year, expecting very little, had a lot of fun at various regattas and ended up in the race crew 2 years running. The majority of this year's crew (7 including our cox) took part at some stage — some, like me, for only one race. It is a great way to cash in further on the fitness you have built up during eights training and gives you a chance to see competitive rowing outside of Oxford, which is rare for the majority of college rowers.

Finally, best of luck to our successors — it is an experience that you will never forget and, in my opinion, teaches you things about yourself and your boundaries that your degree alone may not. Just go for it.
