The Trust is financed by donations from former members of college and university crews and from other friends of Oxford rowing.





On the back of the success enjoyed by the OUBC in 2002 and 2003, 2004 started with high expectations of things to come in the 150th Boat Race. The absences from 2003's crew were filled by a seemingly high calibre group of incoming graduates and freshers. The year was marked by highly competitive group of around 12 parsmen with legitimate chances of making the Blue Boat making selection difficult. Because of a lack of definitive results the final selection of the Blue Boat did not take place until late in the season, only six weeks before the race. Selection for Isis was also competitive with selection being finalized roughly three weeks before the race.

The weigh-in showed Cambridge to once again be heavier, taller and stronger but given Oxford's previous accomplishments this was not seen as too great an obstacle to overcome. Training continued smoothly until a few days before the race when Paul Holland was forced to withdraw from Isis because of pneumonia. Paul was replaced by 3 time Isis veteran Chris Reeve in the three seat of the boat. On the day of the race Isis overcame injury and illness to easily beat Goldie off the start and continued to widen the gap over the rest of the course, finishing in a time of 18 minutes 42 seconds.

The Blue Boat seemed ready to follow in Isis's footsteps gaining a substantial lead over Cambridge in the beginning of the race. Oxford's lead did not last long as a series of heavy clashes with Cambridge caused Oxford to stop rowing for several strokes. The Oxford Blue Boat were unable to recover from the clash and quickly lost contact with Cambridge who won by 6 lengths in a time of 18 minutes 47 seconds. Oxford officially appealed the result but the umpire, James Behrens, refused to rethink his decision. While it is an unfortunate way for the 150th race to end it does reflect the savage and unique qualities of the race. In the Boat Race there are no second chances and only one winner.


A third successive clean-sweep this March proved that Oxford Women's rowing is a real force to be reckoned with. The Blue Boat beat their Cambridge counterparts by four lengths – the biggest Dark Blue margin at Henley since records started in 1989. And Osiris' power and determination shone through in a close race in which they edged ahead in the last 250m to win by half a length.

In September, victory in the Boat Race seemed by no means a foregone conclusion and the new squad was aware that much work lay ahead in preparation for March 21st. The results from Pairs Head and Fours Head were not spectacular in absolute terms, or in comparison to Cambridge. But our ergo performances in November were very encouraging and excellent performances at Wallingford and Henley Heads proved that our fitness was translating into boat speed.

In the new-year we returned to Hazewinkel for an uninterrupted week of technical and physiological improvement, before returning home to the joys of seat racing, Once the two crews were selected we embarked on eight weeks of side-by-side outings, sprint work and fixtures, to hone in our racing skills. At the Women's Head the Blue Boat dominated as the fastest university and non international club crew with another impressive 6th place, and Osiris narrowly missing the Second Team Pennant. These results gave us confidence going into Henley week, which we capitalised on to great affect on Boat Race Day.

OUWBC is looking forward to a busy summer programme of racing at BUSA, Women's Henley and the National Championships where we hope to further cement our position as a top British university and club. We also look forward to welcoming a Summer Development Squad, the crucial foundation on which our future success rests. 






Oriel went into Eights 2003 looking to extend their reign at the top to an unprecedented eight years, however it was not to be, and a **Pembroke** crew containing one Blue Boat, two Isis and a lightweight oarsman bumped outside OUBC on the Wednesday and regained the headship that they had lost to **Oriel** in 1997. It was not all plain sailing for **Pembroke**, however, as **Oriel** closed to approximately ten feet on Thursday. That was as close as they were to get, and **Pembroke** went on to end the week Head of The River.

Elsewhere in the first division, a potentially strong **Magdalen** crew managed three bumps, to bring themselves up to forth. **Balliol** gained spoons having slumped from fifth to ninth, while **Wadham**, at head of the second division, made it 16 row-overs in the last eight days of summer eights, being unable to bump, and remaining unbumped in the last two years. **Trinity** ended the week two places behind them in third, having won blades.

The Women's 1st division saw **Pembroke** remain at the top for the fourth year, giving them both Eights headships. **New** bumped up to second, displacing **Merton** on the Friday, while **Keble** ended the week up four in 11th place, bringing their total to up 15 in the last four years. **Queen's** managed to bump five times during the week, finishing in 15th. Both **Osler-Green** and **Univ** got spoons, falling four each to finish tenth and 12th respectively while **LMH** ended the week down six in 18th.






Continuing their dominance over college rowing, **Oriel** defended the Torpids Headship confidently and assuredly, rowing over three and a half lengths clear of **Exeter** past the boathouses on Saturday. In fact over the four days the only change to the top seven came from a rapidly rising **Queen's** eight (who ended the week up five) replacing the **Worcester** 1st eight in fifth on the river. There was more movement further down, however, with blades being awarded to **LMH**, who went up five in the four days bringing them into the first division, and **Hertford**, who went up four. The top division's big losers were **Brasenose** first eight, who plummeted 12 places from eighth to 20th on the river. **Worcester** ended the week in ninth having got spoons, and **Catz** returned to the second division for the first time since 1999, having gone down four in the last two days.

There was no change at the top of the Women's first division either, with Merton remaining at the top for a second year despite some close racing at times. Below them, New moved up from fourth to second on the river, Oriel moved to their highest position since the admission of women to the college, finishing third on the river, edging ever closer to the Torpids double headship. Christ Church followed Oriel, also moving up three to finish fourth. Blades were awarded to Wolfson and Osler-Green, both of which went up four to finish eighth and ninth respectively. Meanwhile, Magdalen and Teddy Hall both went up five, finishing the week in 12th and 16th. There was less good news for the Catz first eight that dropped eight places from second to tenth on the river, and Univ, that plummeted from tenth in the first division to bottom of the second, a drop of some 14 places. The other big faller in the second division was Balliol, who dropped 12 places to end up second in division three.

The OULRC capped off another successful campaign at Henley, winning the Lightweight Boat Race for an unprecedented third straight year. The reserve crew, Nephthys, were also successful. In each race, the Oxford crew established a solid lead of close to a length by the 500-metre mark and held on to win by length and a canvas respectively.

The Club entered three crews in the Fours Head, where close results with Cambridge forecast a tight race in the spring. The Club also raced well in the Wallingford Head before finishing the fall with Trial VIII's at Henley. We spent ten days in an intensive winter training camp outside Bergerac in the south of France, before returning to face the Tabs at the Bedford Head. Each boat rowed twice, with the Blue Boat beating Cambridge each time and winning the S1 event in a blistering 5:48. With these results in hand, we went into our private match-racing season with a sense of purpose and confidence. A match with Oxford Brookes as well as a very close row against Isis showed that we were moving quickly. Our final match, just two weeks before the Boat Race, confirmed these results, with open water wins in several pieces against Notts County, leaving the Blue Boat certain it was prepared for race day.

The Club will continue to train during the summer, sending a crew to the International Collegiate Invitational Regatta in Taiwan. LIGHTWEIGHT ROWING IS NOT ROWING FOR LITTLE PEOPLE!






Unfortunately, from that point onwards we were faced by a large number of problems resulting from multiple injuries and illnesses. This led to our withdrawal from all the head races we had entered in Hilary Term, and by the time we moved to Henley, the week before the boat race, we had just five outings as a complete crew under our belt. However, we were a crew who were not going to be beaten; the incredible determination showed by everyone was unlike anything I have experienced before.

The weather conditions on boat race day were not ideal. It was very blustery, but at least the gales of the day before had calmed down. Cambridge's lightweight crew proved to be the fastest of their women's crews on the day so our race was rather closer than in the past few years, although that made for a more exciting race. We took an early lead only for Cambridge to come back at us through the middle of the race. However, the last 500m was 'our stretch of the river', for which we were particularly well prepared. Slowly, but surely we started to pull away from them again, to eventually cross the line 3/4 length ahead. March 21st certainly was a 'Dark Blue' day with a clean-sweep of Oxford victories for the second time in three years.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who made our victory possible. In particular, our fantastic coaching team of lan Shore and Ben Reed. The latter deserves a special mention as he is now 'retiring' from the club after seven years of immense dedication, which has resulted in six recent OUWLRC victories. I would also like to thank our amazing spares, especially Sunniva, without whom we would have never made it to race day.



A visitor's guide to Eights

ROBERT RIVINGTON

The college bumping races originated from outings in hired boats down the river beyond Iffley Lock. On the return, racing back from Iffley began rather casually; the first record of it is in 1815. At first, there might be only two or three boats taking part. In 1825, there were too many boats to start from within the lock and the start was made from posts along the bank 50 ft apart.

The earliest recorded rules date from 1840. Starting positions were 100 ft apart. Bumping boats drew aside from the line of rowing and changed position the next night, the first record of the word "night" being used in Eights for a day. The days of Eights are still called "nights". Eights used to be raced for six nights but are now raced for four only. The lowest divisions row first and through in order so that the first Division rows last. The boat at the head of each division is called the "sandwich boat" and rows again immediately after at the bottom of the division above it, giving it the opportunity, by bumping, to move up into that division.

Eights is under the direction of the Oxford University Rowing Clubs or OURC's. In the 1980's, the Amateur Rowing Association (founded 1882) decided to require a substantial individual subscription from every ARA member; this allowed members to participate in ARA regattas. Some colleges, those that enter ARA regattas, are members, their crews paying individual membership; others are not and do not pay the ARA subscription. The OUBC is completely independent and distinct from the ARA, though a member of it, paying its subscriptions. Of course, it is considerably older with its own rules and memberships. The OUBC council consists of the captains of every college boat club and elects the President and other officers. The OURC's is also comprised of all college boat clubs, with its own officers, but is not a member of ARA and pays no subscription to it.

Eights is organized by OURC's *College Secretary* with assistance, but with final responsibility for all of it. During Eights, operation is from the Secretary's desk positioned at Tims Boathouse. Discipline is maintained by *fines*. The College Secretary can impose fines up to £100 immediately and with no appeal and refuse, if he so decides, to let a college's boats race until a fine has been paid. Occasionally fines were frivolously imposed; but today they are usually reserved for dangerous rowing or breaking OUBC rules.


At the start of a division, each boat is accompanied by an umpire on the towpath on a bicycle to watch it. If a bump takes place, therefore, there are two umpires to observe it. At the end of the race, all umpires have to report to the Secretary's desk. All colleges contribute to the pool of umpires who umpire any boats except their own. When a division is being rowed, the centre of the towpath must be kept clear for umpires' bicycles.

Since more crews wish to enter for Eights than there is room for, places in the lowest divisions are competed for by "rowing on". In the week before Eights, these crews are timed over a course and placed in the Rowing On divisions in the order of best performance.

In the Hilary term, at the end of February, a similar event to Eights, Torpids, takes place with slightly changed rules, smaller and of less importance, partly because university crews in training are absent from college boats. The word "torpid" was first used for a non-racing boat carrying supporters and spare crew members when there was only one racing boat. Eventually these non-racing boats became college second boats and when a new event was introduced for the Hilary Term, it was named Torpids.

To avoid the main stream of the river, the customary line of rowing at the start follows the towpath bank, crosses the river at the Gut to the side of the Green bank, then returns to the towpath side between the Cherwell mouth and the OUBC rafts (see diagram of the course). Because of the breadth of the river above the OUBC, a clever steerer can steer away to avoid a faster following boat which is slowed by having to make heavy use of the rudder.

At one time, all crews used to train on the Isis between Folly Bridge and Iffley Lock in the afternoons. Now with the increase in numbers of entries and with the addition of women's divisions, the Isis is too crowded for the senior crews to train on. Many of these hire boat racks at St Edward's School at Godstow or train at Radley or Wallingford. Because of crowded work schedules throughout the day, most training now takes place between 6.00 – 8.00 am. There are perhaps fewer "rugger" boats for winter games players or "schools" boats for examination candidates; but one can still see some crews in lower divisions rowing in fancy dress.
