Oriel M1 chase Balliol M1, Eights 2008

It is my pleasure to report on the recent success of the Oxford University Boat Club squad on 29 March 2009. For the second year in a row, both the Blue Boat and Isis successfully defeated our Cambridge counterparts by wide margins. Although the races played out differently — Isis taking it to Goldie early on with a blistering start, and the Blue Boat taking a decisive push in the middle of the race to break clear — both boats came around the final bend with their rivals four lengths adrift.


The large winning margins concealed the huge pressures that the OUBC overcame during the season. Early defeats to Cambridge in the Fours Head and a series of injuries and illnesses that plagued the team through the winter meant that developed was slow until Christmas. Even when the crews were selected it was clear that the vast strength and experience of the Blue Boat was contrasted with a shortage of those qualities in Isis. Yet both OUBC crews overcame their respective challenges in the run up to the race – the Blue Boat came together as a formidable unit, contrary to the expectations of Cambridge; and Isis performed far in excess of their strength and experience to defeat a Goldie crew full of seasoned internationals.

Since achieving the double victory on the Tideway, Oxford crews have raced overseas, in Poland, Italy, and Croatia, maintaining their unbeaten record against Cambridge. It is a great testament to the success of the club under chief coach Sean Bowden and his team that OUBC continues to perform successfully regardless of the mix of the crews, and despite high turnover of athletes in recent years.

It was particularly pleasing that three members of this year's Isis boat were developed through their college programs. There is no doubt that the standard of the Blue Boat and Isis crews has risen dramatically over the last decade, and it is a great credit to the colleges that they are able to keep coaching and preparing high quality rowers. We hope that colleges continue to provide their rowers with the skills needed to trial and compete for OUBC, and hope that the colleges find their participation in OUBC equally inspiring.

I want to take this opportunity to wish all Summer Eights participants the best of luck in racing this year. Summer Eights is a peculiar and wonderful event that is truly unique, and I have always been amazed by the level of commitment put in by the rowers and coaches. I'm looking forward to my fourth experience of this famous event very much.

OUBC President's Report

It has been yet another eventful year for OUWBC. Andy Green has made a great start in his first year as head coach and is set to build on it in the years to come. Despite a relatively inexperienced squad the season got off to a good beginning with wins at Pairs Head and Wallingford Head, along with some close racing at Fours Head. The cold winter however caught us out. It quickly became apparent on training camp, when temperatures hit minus 14°C, that we had picked the coldest week of the year to go to Belgium. The lake completely froze and despite calls for ice-skating as a substitute for cross training we were forced to return to Oxford earlier than planned.

Yet most managed to tough out both the weather and the seat racing, and crews for the 2009 Boat Race were selected in February. The Blue Boat turned out to be one of the lightest in history at a crew average of 69.2kg, just over 6kg per athlete lighter than their Cambridge counterparts. This did not stop a strong performance at the Women's Eights Head where they placed ninth, winning the University Pennant in a time thirty seconds faster than the Cambridge Blue Boat. Osiris also had a good row, beating Blondie by nine seconds, and so boosting the club's confidence as final boat race preparations got underway.

It was race day before we knew it, and for once the weather gave us some good conditions. In the reserves' race Osiris lead Blondie off the start, however Blondie rowed through to a 1½ length victory, absolutely gutting for all the Oxford supporters watching. However, the Blue Boat produced yet another brilliant race, leading Cambridge from the start to win by 1¼ lengths.

I would like to thank many on behalf of OUWBC; the club could not carry on without your help. Firstly thank you to the coaches, Andy Green, Megan Patrick, and Chris Reid. To Nicole Zitzmann: thank you for your support this year, and to Rachel Quarrell for your advice. To Andy Thomas, for looking after our boats at Radley. Also to Ryan Demiane and Headington School Oxford, for the use of your ergs. Thanks to Monica Franke for the core stability, and to Briony for the psychology sessions. Thank you to OURCs for your donations, and to all the college boat clubs and captains for your continued support. Thanks to all those at OUBC, to the trust fund, to the HBR committee, to Ben Reed, to Steve Gaisford, and to UTRC. Thank you to this year's committee and to the old girls for your help. Lastly, thank you to the athletes. I am extraordinarily proud of you all.





Eights 2008

The 2008-09 season has been a period of transition for the club, only two members of last year's squad returned for a second go, and the start of the year saw a disappointingly low number of budding oarsmen and coxes turn up to trial. The challenge facing our new coach Pedro Figueira was enormous, especially considering the strength of the Cambridge squad.

The quality of our opposition was apparent in the results of the Fours Head with the Granta crew posting and impressive time to finish 100 paces higher than our top crew. However Michaelmas term saw the squad make great strides in fitness and technique, culminating in an intense week of sub zero seat racing on selection camp in Tilburg, Holland. These were amongst the toughest parts of the season, but these experiences helped forge a great sense of camaraderie in the squad that has continued ever since.

After the Christmas break the squad reconvened for a highly productive training camp in Avis, Portugal. The excellent facilities, equipment and water enabled the provisional crews to make rapid progress. On the penultimate day the crews' new found speed was put to the test in a six lane 4km race against some of the best crews in Portugal. Oxford A finished a canvas ahead of the Portuguese champions to take first, while Oxford B crossed the line in third. All the squad returned to Oxford as international medallists!

The crews were finalised at the end of January and our programme began to ramp up in intensity. Coach Charlie Simpson, took charge of preparing Nephthys for the HoRR while Pedro focused his attention on the Blue Boat. Match races came thick and fast and the BB saw away crews from London RC, UCD and Birmingham with relative ease. As the Henley Boat Races drew nearer both crews began to go their separate ways with Nephthys spending much of their time on the Tideway.

Boat race week was blessed with wonderful weather for a change and despite the mounting nerves the BB were rowing well and achieving good top end speed. Having recently beaten the Leander Lightweights CULRC were favourites and we knew that we had to row the race of our lives to win. Nephthys put in a strong performance to finish the top Oxford crew at the HoRR, but now the pressure was on us.

Cambridge went hard of the start, and we did well to cling onto their coat tails up until half way. However after making our push at Upper Thames we were still down and Cambridge took the opportunity to put the hammer down and shut the door, eventually finishing three lengths up. Loosing was a crushing experience for all concerned but the club is resolved to putting things right next year we are looking for talented trialist to help us reap revenge.



2009 has been a successful year for OUWLRC. We began the year with a large squad, who helped us go on to win the S3 pennant at Reading Small Boat's Head, and put in an excellent performance at Fours Head of the River.

Moving towards Christmas, we had two training camps at Wimbleball Lake in Somerset before and after Christmas. At these we honed our skills on water with three sessions a day, constantly achieving successful times.

Following our winter training camps, we went on to claim the Women's Senior 3 pennant at Reading University Head. Solid performances on the water were matched with achievements on the ergo; at the 2k test before the Boat Race, three athletes went sub 7:30, and the crew average was the fastest in recent years.

On the day of the Boat Race, the 2009 crew managed an easy victory of 2 ½ lengths ahead of Cambridge, in a time of 6 minutes 30 seconds. This time was fast enough to earn the crew discretionary Full Blues and is an achievement the club is proud of and demonstrates the direction we are aiming towards.

At the moment we have an active summer squad. Following the Boat Race, many of us have given sculling a try. We entered quads, doubles and singles in Wallingford Regatta and whilst no wins were to be had, the club gained a lot from the change in discipline. We have just returned from the Ghent International Regatta where we won a sliver medal in the Women's Open Eights. Following this result we are considering a return to sweep for entries into Henley Women's Regatta.

This will aim to enter Reading Regatta and Henley Women's Regatta and form the basis of next year's squad. This year, over half of the Blue Boat had come through the development squad system. A History of Oxford Bumps Racing

ADAPTED FROM ANU DUDHIA'S GUIDE TO OXFORD ROWING

Rowing appears to have become popular as a recreation within the University around the end of the 1700s, whilst 'Summer Eights', is reckoned to date from the summer of 1815, a few weeks prior to the battle of Waterloo. Crews from Brasenose and Jesus, probably at the end of a day's excursion downriver, decided to race the final leg home from Iffley Lock. Brasenose won that race and are thus credited with being the first 'Head of the River'. The Isis then looked very different. There was a lock at Folly Bridge, the remains of which can still be seen today in the narrower of the two channels around the island. There were no boathouses downstream, just 'King's Barge' moored alongside Christ Church meadow. This barge, owned by the boatbuilder Isaac King, served as the finishing post for bumping races and as changing rooms by the oarsmen. The opposite bank sloped gently down to the river. There were no boathouses and the towpath between Folly and Iffley Locks was blocked by a dozen gates at various fences and bridges.

Problems caused by high winds in 1839 meant bunglines and the present 'three gun' system for starting were introduced in 1840, and the start time fixed at 7.45 pm. By then, some 14 colleges were taking part, so it was also decreed that boats involved in a bump should draw to one side so as to allow the lower crews to continue racing. The bump itself was defined 'as the touching of any part, whether it be boat, oars, or rudder'.

The boats in the early days resembled those currently used for sea-rowing: fixed seats staggered either side of a central gang-board with pins mounted directly on the opposite gunwale. Outrigged boats came into general use in Oxford in 1845; this immediately meant that boat hulls could be made narrower and lower in the water, consequently faster but less stable. It is recorded that sliding seats were used for the first time in the 1873 Eights. These originated in the United States and had been used to good effect by crews at Henley the previous summer. Crude as they were, not to mention dirty and noisy, the improvement was so evident that several colleges converted their boats between the start and finish of Eights that year. It is recorded that 'owing to a fatal accident at Cambridge', a rule was passed in 1888 obliging all boats to have an indiarubber ball fitted on the end of their bows.

Initially, coaching had been performed by the professional watermen. However, this was banned in 1846 and the duty subsequently fell to the coxswains, the stated argument being 'A coxswain ought to be a thinking, reasoning being, in a higher degree than any waterman has yet shown himself to be'. However, as boats got lighter, coxes began to be selected for their lightness rather than their coaching ability, and coaching as an activity was transferred once again to the towpath, which was completed in its current raised shape in 1872. In 1882, the Oxford University Boathouse was added and in 1886 Folly Bridge lock was removed.

Returning coaching to the bank led to different problems; the Thames Conservancy only permitted one horse on the towpath (for the coach of the University crew), so the only option was having someone run alongside. As often as not, this led to the unsatisfactory situation of the College Eight being coached by people fit enough to keep up with the crew rather than


knowledgeable enough to make the crew move quicker. Mercifully, in 1889, the bicycle arrived on the towpath, followed shortly by the megaphone, and with these new inventions came a new breed of coaches whose status came by virtue of their knowledge rather than their running ability.


Christ Church built the first college boathouse, at the downstream end of the island, at the end of the 1930's and over the next couple of decades the island filled with new boathouses, usually shared by 2 or 3 colleges. The last boathouse was added only relatively recently, in 1989, filling the one remaining space at the upstream end of the island. With the move to boathouses, the barges became superfluous and were gradually sold off; the last, owned by St Catherine's, finally disappearing at the end of the 1970's. One of them can be found in the Oxford Four Pillars Hotel grounds these days.

Women's crews from Oxford and Cambridge first rowed against each other in 1927, the competition being in the form of a half-mile row along the Isis, judged on style as much as on speed. Clearly, there had been some concern over the undignified spectacle that might have arisen had these young ladies been asked to compete on the basis of speed alone. St Hilda's did raise a few eyebrows when their crew successfully 'Rowed On' for Eights in 1969 and competed with the men's crews in Division VIII. By 1976 women had their own division in Summer Eights with Lady Margaret Hall starting as the first women's Head Crew.

Divisions had to be shortened between 1961–62 to allow for the construction of Donnington Bridge, and the 1963 Torpids were cancelled altogether due to the river being frozen. In the 1980s the increased concern for safety also played a part; today it is extremely unusual to find a student who has experienced the dubious pleasure of being stuck against the piles above Iffley Lock, whereas it used to be a common enough occurrence for various methods of extraction to be tried and discussed.

Following the so-called 'Boat Race Mutiny' of 1987, there was a major overhaul of the organisation of Oxford rowing, largely prompted by the desire to limit the powers of the President of OUBC and to put the other University squads (OUWBC and the two lightweight squads) on a more equal footing. Since its formation in 1839, the OUBC Committee had nominally been responsible for running Oxford college rowing, but with the formation of 'Oxford University Rowing Clubs' in 1987 these functions were taken over by the OURCs Secretary and committee, with OUBC mostly left to concentrate on the University crew.





Beijing Games

Long had it been a dream of mine to attend Oxford University one day, yet, sitting on the start line before an Olympic final on the 16th of August 2008, it was the last thing on my mind. When I arrived in Beijing with the New Zealand Olympic Team, the city was teeming with life. I was in awe of the local people busying themselves getting ready for the biggest show in China's long history. Every blade of grass was cut, phenomenal structures — Olympic and other — greeted whenever I looked, trees situated 10 rows back after the 23rd kilometre along the highway to Shunyi were manicured perfectly and finally the Olympic regalia screamed out at you. Despite a significant amount of media attention surrounding some of the more controversial aspects of the Beijing Games, the local people (that we met) were so honoured that their country was holding arguably the biggest sporting event in the world. But we weren't interested in any of that. Representing my country at an Olympic Games is something I will never forget and the emotional roller coaster that comes with being a full-time athlete. Nobody has a good day, every day on the water and it was often the negative emotions after an unsuccessful outing that inspired me on to perform at the next level. I had always envisaged the way I wanted my races to pan out — and it usually never did go 100% the way I wanted. After a comfortable win in the Heat, we had a good battle in the Semi-finals which didn't position us so well for the finals.

A late gear change meant a tactical blunder and the loss a significant amount of our efficiency — we had to put everything on the line in the semi-final when normally we could cruise. When the final came around, we were hoping (and had convinced ourselves) that we were in the hunt for the gold medal. Unfortunately the two crews ahead of us hadn't factored this into their race plans and so it ended up that we won a Bronze medal. My feelings were mixed. If anyone went into an Olympic Cycle trying to win a Bronze, they wouldn't even make the final. I would expect that every crew in our final believed that they could win gold at some point in their build up. We were no exception so I was upset to have not come away with the gold. Picture the press are in your face, you're on the verge of exhaustion, it's a sweltering heat and you just want to go somewhere cold and quiet. But then it kicks in - the achievement we had been working toward for the past eight years had finally borne fruit. It was a day I will remember for the rest of my life.

How often do you find yourself chatting about who is going up or down in bumps this year. If you ever wanted to predict gains and losses in some pseudo-scientific fashion go to the above webpage and cast your vote on who is hot and who is not. At rowing that is.

Those interested in the complete statistical background of the predicting system are referred to the original page. At this point it suffices to say that any "pundit" can supply their estimates of a crews speed with 6.0 being an average Div 1 crew. The different estimates are then weighted by how competent your predictions proved in the past. Using the average scores and some randomly created "form on the day" component bumps racing is "simulated". An 0.3 point difference leads to a bump and you can see what came out of it.

Both current head crews are predicted to be looking less than happy at the end of the week. Teddy Hall women in particular will have had a miserable week if the "pundits" are proved right. In the men's division the word is Pembroke are finally going to get that elusive bump on Magdalen while the chances of the Christ Church "super-eight" aren't rated that highly. Get this programme out on the Saturday and revel in how you proved the doubters wrong or how that much fancied crew behind you dropped like a stone. Oh and get involved and have your own unsubstantiated predictions included.
