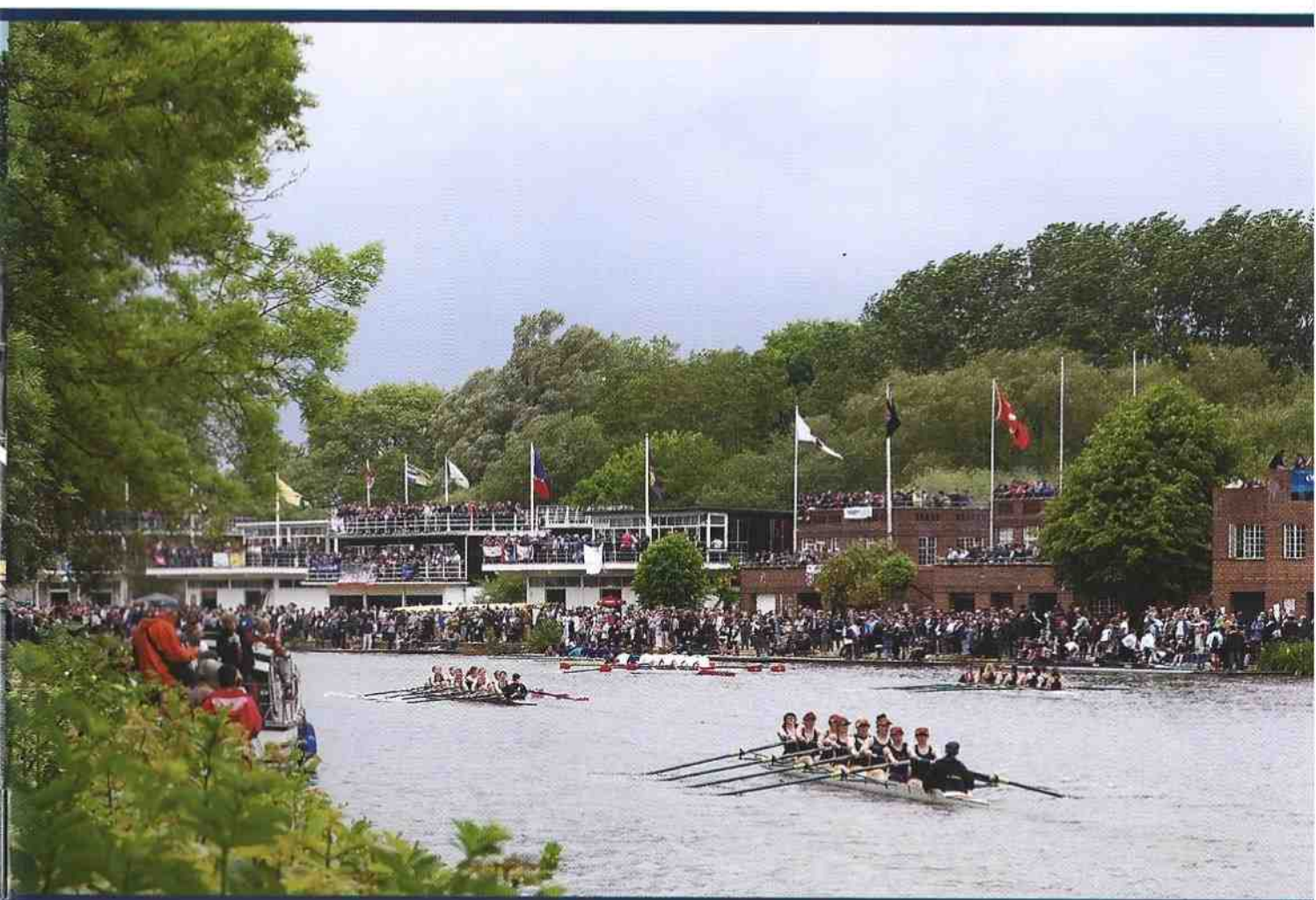
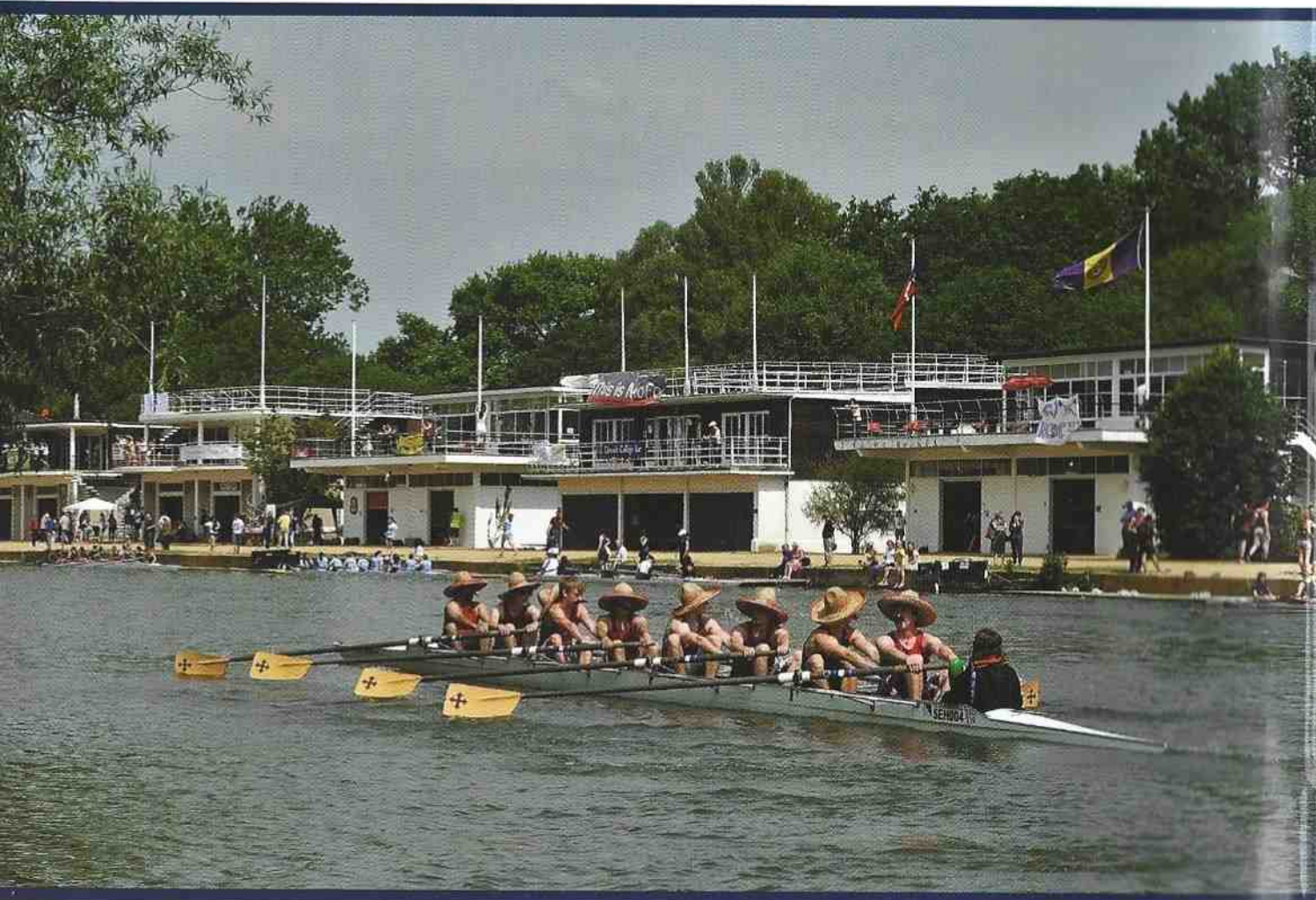

A brief history of bumps racing in Oxford

The details of collegiate rowing's origins in Oxford are lost in the mists of time, but the sport seems to have become popular by the end of the eighteenth century as a form of friendly recreation.

The first Summer Eights racing is thought to have occurred in 1815, a few months before the battle of Waterloo, when crews from Brasenose and Jesus decided to race home from Iffley Lock. Brasenose won, making them the first official 'Head of the River' crew. The competition became annual, racing from Iffley Lock to a finish line on Christ Church Meadow, marked by a flagpole on Isaac King's barge moored at the meadows bank.

By 1826 four colleges were involved and had devised bumping rules, the order of flags on the King's Barge flagpole indicating which crews had swapped places between race days. More colleges joined, and it was normal practice, in those days before academic league tables, for the crews to row down to Sandford in the afternoon. They would spend a while playing skittles or doing gymnastics, before rowing upstream again, with practice bursts in the stretch between Sandford and Iffley locks, to race one division. All racing stopped behind any crews which bumped, only those ahead continuing to try and achieve their own bump. Race days were interspersed with rest days, so the whole event spread out over a week.

In 1840, after high winds the previous year had disrupted racing, the current three-cannon starting system was put in place, and the 14 colleges then involved began the practice of 'bumping out' to the opposite bank, so that boats behind could carry on racing past them. By this time a parallel event, 'Torpids', had already started for second crews, initially on the days between 'Eights' racing, though in 1852 it moved to the spring term.

Meanwhile 'Eights' was becoming longer and longer, on the principle that enough racing days should occur for every boat, even that starting bottom, to be able to reach the Headship. Eventually a maximum of 8 days racing was decreed, and over time this has dropped to four. During the 1870s the 20 or so colleges competing

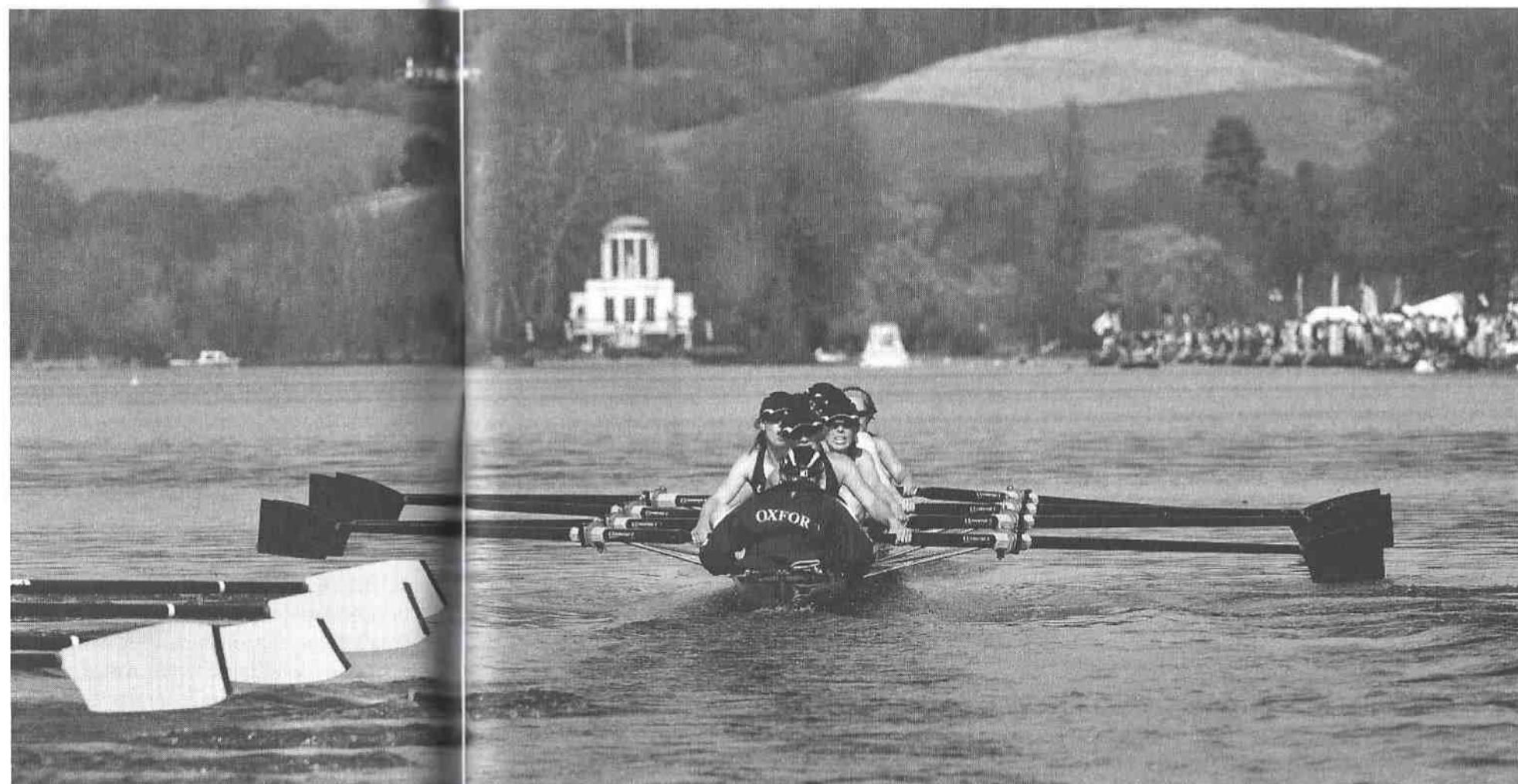
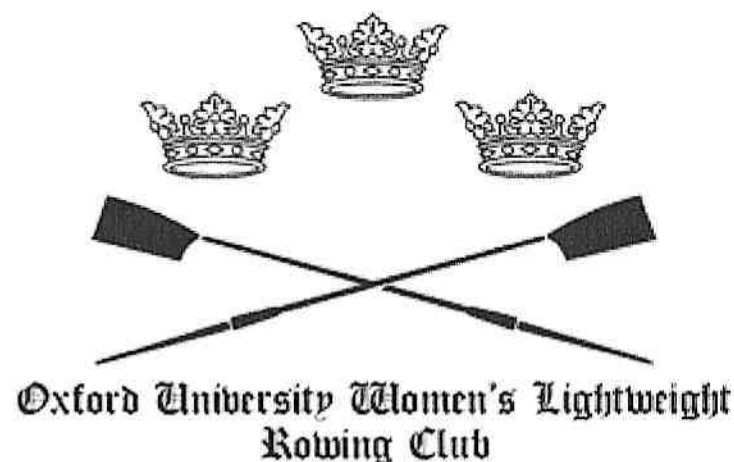
became split into two divisions, each crew starting 130 feet from the one behind it.

By 1908 the entry was expanded to allow second crews into Eights, and after a gap of six years for the first world war (1914-1919) racing resumed in 1920 with increasing popularity. More divisions were added, and in the early 1930s the 'Getting On Races' (now 'Rowing On') were devised to determine which crews should occupy the final slots. The formal event was again suspended for war (1939-1945), although informal bumps-style races were held, and in 1946 the event was revived using the 1939 starting order.

Although women's rowing had existed at the university since the 1920s, and some women rowed in men's crews, there were no solely women's crews in Summer Eights until St Hilda's women entered the 1969 event by successfully rowing on and competing against the men. After the all-male undergraduate colleges started admitting women during the mid-1970s, a women's division was created in 1976, with Wadham ending the first year as Head of the River. The balance of divisions between the sexes has now almost evened out, and women have been coxing men's crews, and *vice-versa*, for many years.

That isn't the only change in the last century. We now use carbon fibre boats and oars instead of wooden ones, wear cotton lycra 'all-in-ones' instead of shorts and shirts (or bloomers for the women), and in this electronic age, racing is photographed, timed, videoed, commented on and tweeted to the world. The format, however, still has much in common with those early-nineteenth century races, even if the equipment looks very different.

No time was taken, but the light blue composite 4+ won their race in the first ever lightweight spares race. We are hoping this race will become a regular event from now on to reflect on the growing squad for the lightweights.

In May, some of 2012 squad travelled to Nottingham to race at BUCS. It was a very successful weekend with strong performances from the IM 2- and IM Lwt 1x in heats and repechages and Bronze medals for our Lwt 4- and Lwt 2-.

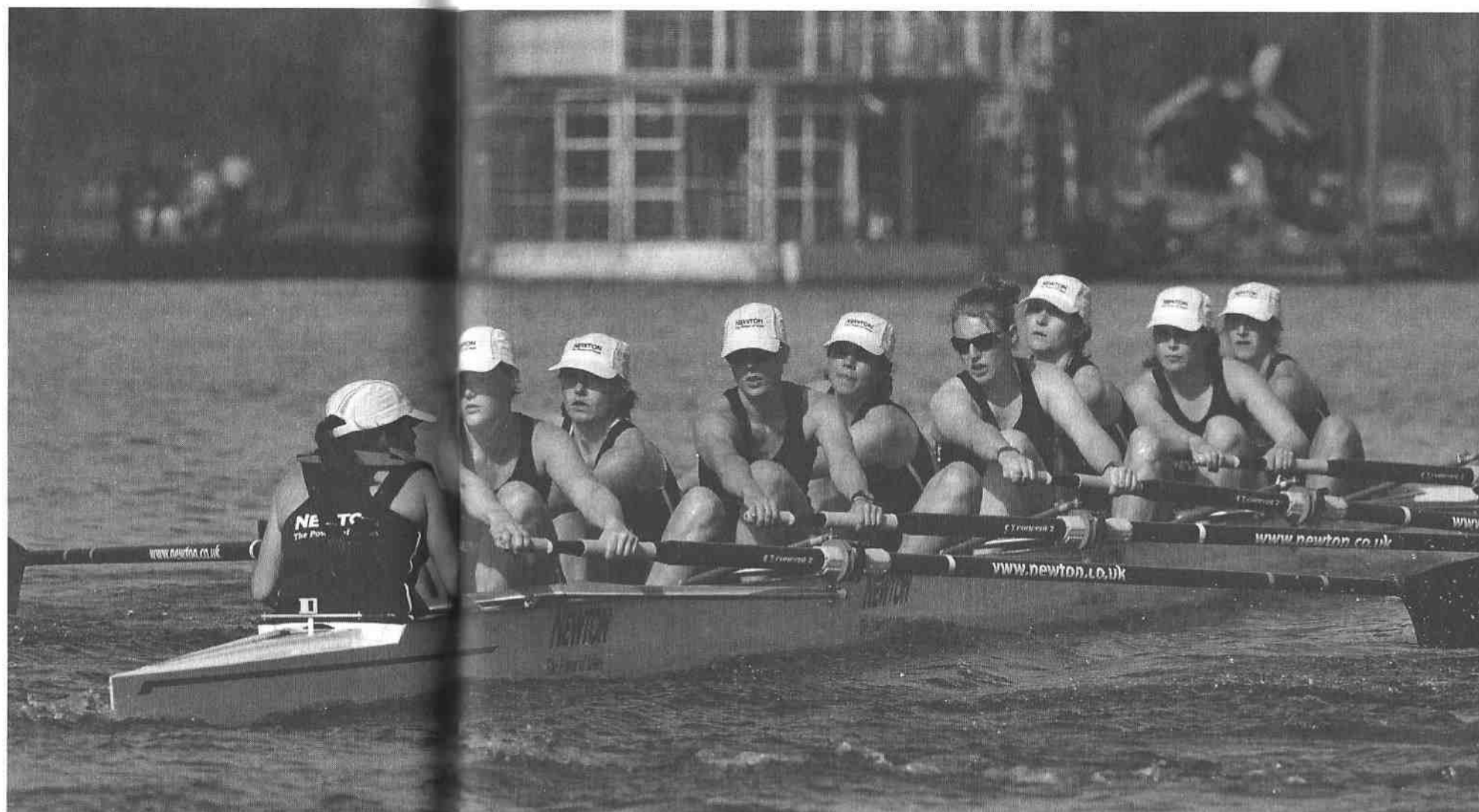

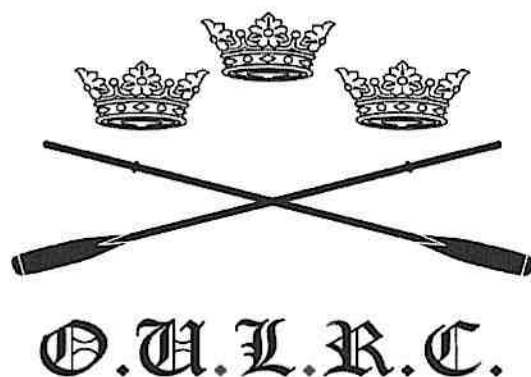

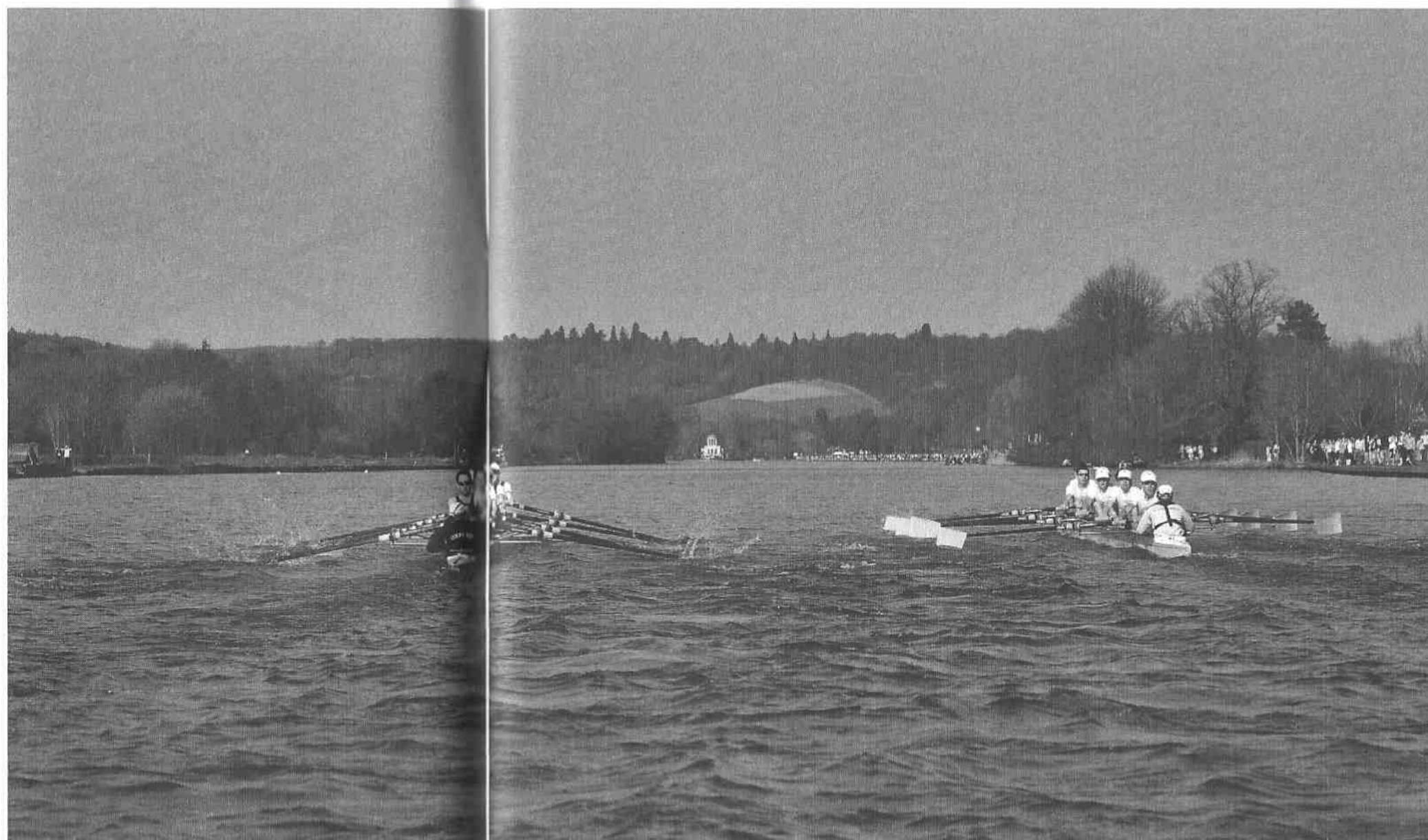

My clearest memory of the 25th March is of our pre-race talk. In the relative quiet and cool of the warm-up room at Upper Thames, Coach Ben reminded us in quite simple terms of how far we'd come. Seven months previously, we'd assembled as a fairly small and inexperienced squad, noticeably lacking the kind of names that have graced past boats. But in our seven months together, we'd come some way, and now the boat was going pretty fast. We'd known all season that Cambridge had several guys returning from losing last year's race, and several placing well at GB trials, and, yes, that we were meant to be the underdogs. But after a fantastic last week in Henley, we were quite incredibly confident. "If you go out and row the race you can," Ben told us, "you will win."

Much of the rest of the day is quite blurry. I remember the eager anticipation of the morning and the excitement from the crowds on the bank, then the reassuring familiarity and focus during the warm-up. After just a few deep breaths at the start, the race was on. Not our best start, and we were 6 seats down early on, but into a good rhythm, and set to work our way back in. Cambridge would give nothing back, however, absorbing move after move until all too soon it was over – the pain of racing quickly displaced by the sinking feeling of having lost.

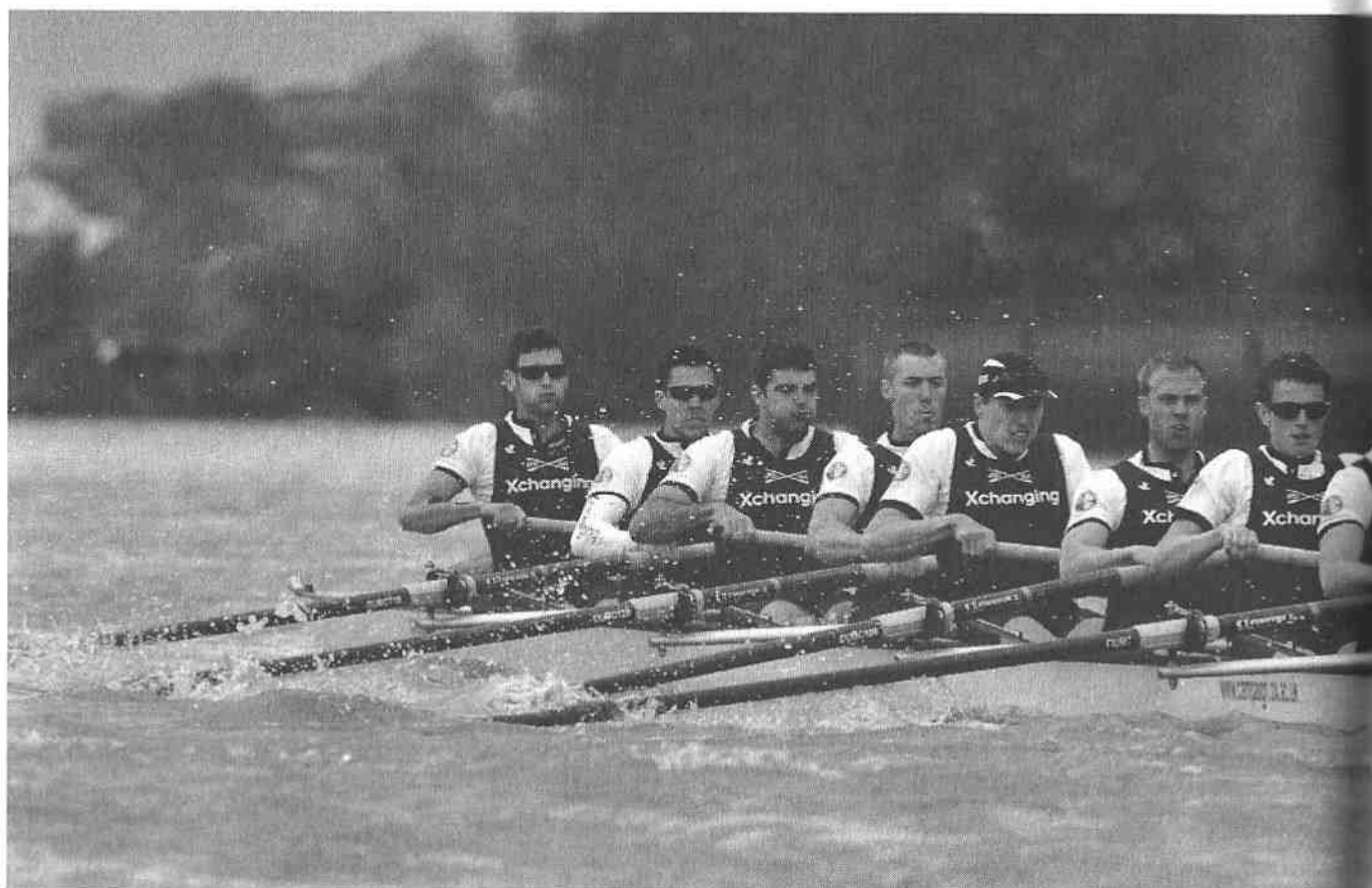
So many times we'd visualised winning that race, that I'd never really considered how I'd feel about losing. On crossing the line, however, it was immediately clear there was only one thing for it. Even losing, it was the most incredible seven months, and so I can't even

imagine what it's like to win this race. My only regrets this year, in fact, are for the guys who won't have the opportunity to do so.

On behalf of the crew, I'd like to thank our coach Ben Reed, our resident big-dog Bodo Schulenberg, and all the rest of this year's squad. Also thanks go to KPMG for their sponsorship. Finally, I'd like to congratulate CULRC on a great race. Needless to say, I look forward to our next encounter.

The 158th boat race was a most dramatic unfolding of events in the history of the race. When the day arrived we were confident in our ability to produce a good performance, despite learning at the official crew announcement and weigh-in that we were up against the second greatest weight deficit in the history of the Boat Race, with Oxford weighing in more than a stone a man lighter than Cambridge. Nevertheless the season had been going well, with strong performances in our fixtures against the German U23 national team, Molesey and Leander.

The race got off to a good start. Around the sharpest part of Cambridge's bend we only lost two seats which we reclaimed as we rowed past Chiswick Eyot, retaking the lead at that point, with the tail wind and the final bend still to come in our favour. At that point the race was stopped by the umpire due to a swimmer being in the path of our blades.

Both crews were told to prepare for a restart, and as the race took off again we were again the faster crew and took about a half a length lead before the blade clash just over forty seconds in, in which one of our blades unfortunately snapped. As we were being warned at the time it was deemed to be our

own fault so the race was not stopped again as we had to abide by our accidents. Cambridge quickly moved clear, rowing against seven oarsmen, and went on to win by four lengths.

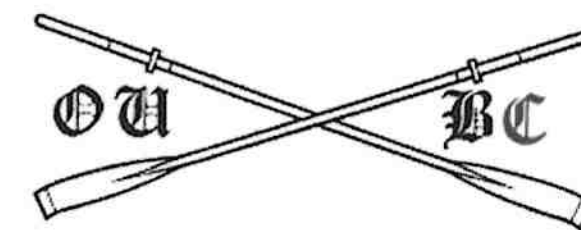
At the finish we appealed the decision but it was not upheld. It was only after this that we realised our bowman, Alex Woods, had collapsed from his exertions at the end of the race. He was taken to Charing Cross Hospital where he was deemed to be in a stable condition and was discharged the next day. He is now fully recovered. It seems that he had simply pushed his body to a point where there was so much lactic acid that it had begun to shut down.

The good news in all this is that Isis won their race by four lengths. Not only that, but helped by a particularly high tide, they set a new record for the reserve race, as well as the third fastest time in the history of the boat race of 16:41. We are very proud of them, and it was a consolation for me and the rest of the Blue Boat to know that this year has not been entirely wasted by any means. We also won the spare pairs race.

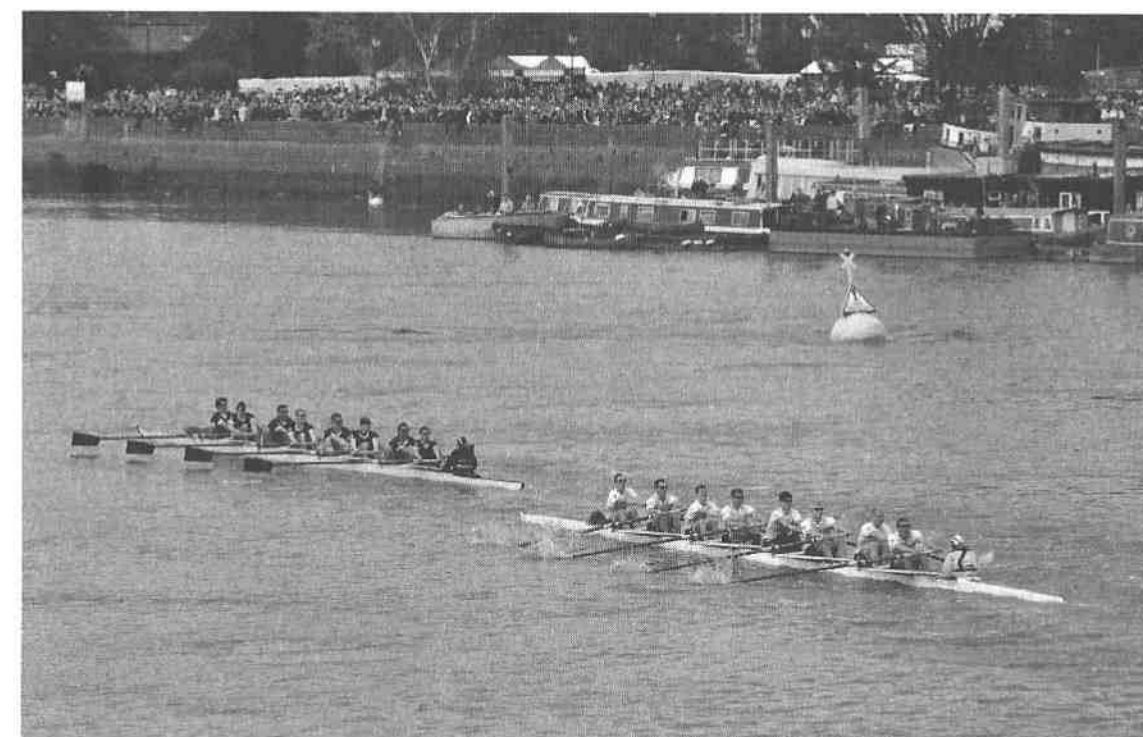

Summer Eights Rules

Bumps racing can be very confusing when you are new to it, so here is a little summary of the main rules to explain how it all works. For more information visit <http://www.ourcs.org.uk/ourcs/rules/chapter4>.

Eights shall consist of 7 men's divisions and 6 women's divisions, with the top 5 men's divisions and the top 4 women's divisions designated "Fixed Divisions", and the remainder "Rowing On Divisions".

The starting order shall be the finishing order of the previous year's Fixed Divisions.

Divisions shall consist of 13 boats, plus the "Sandwich Boat", except for the bottom division, which shall consist of 14 boats.

The boat that finishes first in each division may row as "Sandwich Boat" at the bottom of the division above in the same day's racing.

Each boat shall be started from a rope 50 feet in length, held by the coxswain, with the other end of the rope fastened to a post on the tow path. The distance between each starting post shall be 130 feet.

Not less than 5 minutes before the start of the division, the Senior Umpire shall order the firing of the 'Five Minute Gun'. 4 minutes later, or later if safety dictates, the Senior Umpire shall order the firing of the 'One Minute Gun'. 1 minute later, another gun shall be fired to signal the start.

On achieving a bump, a boat ceases to be part of a race, and the boat bumped also ceases to be part of the race.

A boat shall be liable to be bumped until every part of it has crossed the finishing line.

Note: important rule changes since last year

Each division will now have 13 boats plus the sandwich boat. This is one more boat per division than last year.

When dealing with appeals, no evidence shall be accepted more than 20 minutes after the announcement of the appeal.

Glossary

Bump - when a boat catches the one in front and makes contact with it, or the coxswain of the boat in front concedes in order to avoid damage to people and equipment. Alternatively, a bump is awarded if a crew fully overtakes the crew in front. Two crews involved in a bump switch places in the start order for the next day's racing.

Headship - being the highest placed crew on the river (i.e. Bungline 1, Division 1), with no one ahead to bump.

Blades - a crew wins blades by bumping the crew ahead on each of the 4 days.

Spoons - a crew is assigned 'spoons' if they are bumped on each of the 4 days.

Overbump - when a crew bumps the crew that started three boats ahead of them, when the two crews in between bumped out.

Sandwich boat - the boat between two divisions that rows twice; once at the top of the lower division, then again at the bottom of the next division up.

Klaxon - the sound of the marshals stopping the race because it has become unsafe.

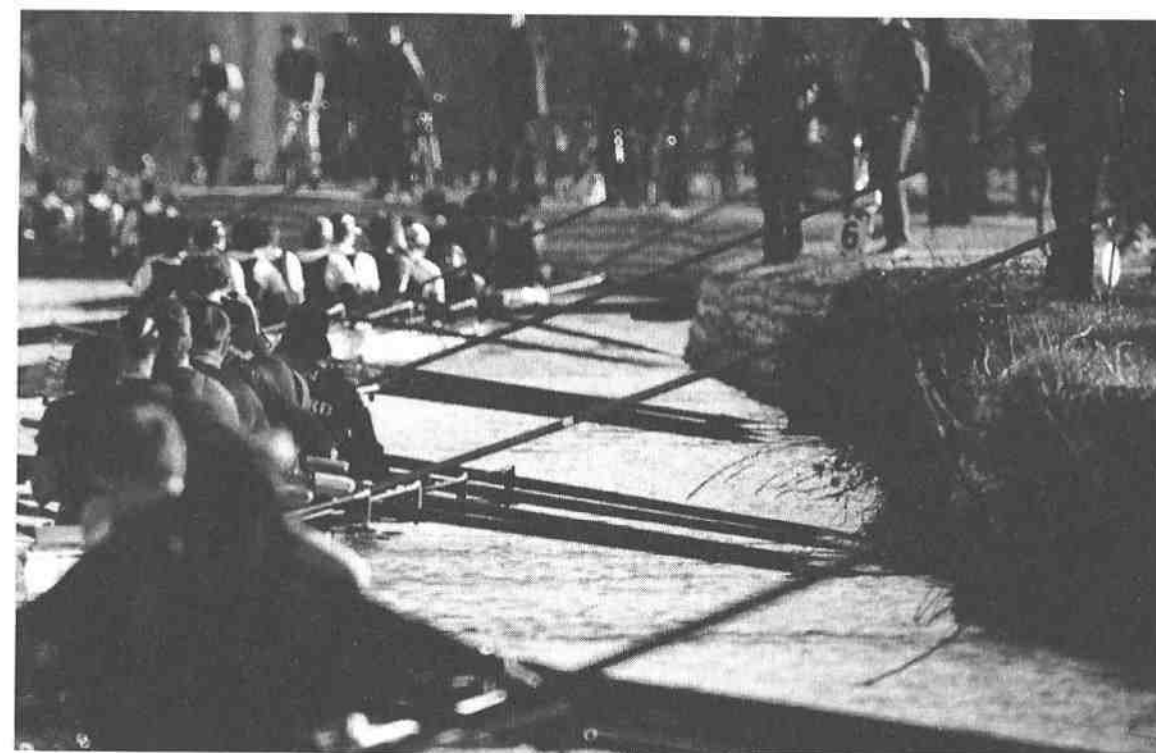
Five minute, one minute and start guns - an actual cannon fires blanks which can be heard by all of the crews.

Bungline - a rope tethered to the bank that must be held by the cox until the start gun fires. They are spaced 2 1/2 lengths apart on the bank, so that the gap to be caught up on the water is 1 1/2 lengths.

Poleman - the person with a long wooden pole who helps to get the boat in the right position for when the start gun is fired.

Cox - the only person facing forwards at the back of the boat who is in charge of steering and tactics. The cox has a microphone so that the whole crew can hear their instructions.

Umpires - the people on the bank who judge whether a bump has taken place.

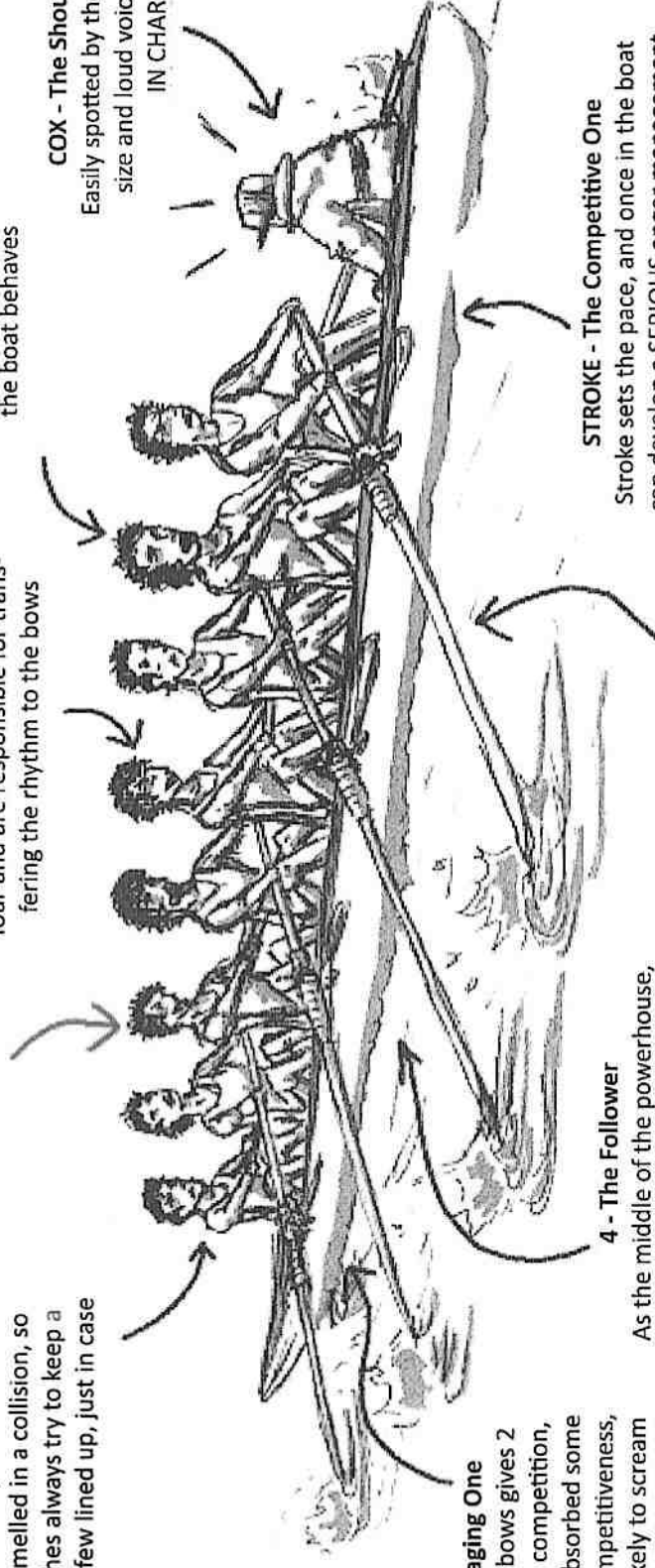
3 - The Obscure One
The last of the powerhouse.
3 is very like 4 - they do as they're told and push like there's no tomorrow

BOW - The Expendable One
Bow is always the first to be pummelled in a collision, so coaches always try to keep a spare few lined up, just in case

5 - The One In The Middle
Everything pivots around the 5 seat. They are the last of stern four and are responsible for transferring the rhythm to the bows

7 - The Lieutenant
7 backs up stroke's rhythm and makes sure everyone in the boat behaves

COX - The Shouting One
Easily spotted by their diminutive size and loud voices, they are IN CHARGE



2 - The Raging One
Being in the bows gives 2 a view of the competition, and, having absorbed some of stroke's competitiveness, is the most likely to scream (encouragement) at the rest of the crew

4 - The Follower
As the middle of the powerhouse, 4 gets on with the job of tanking it, sometimes to the point of being too distracted to hear the cox call 'wind down'

6 - The Loyal One
Stern pair's lackey, they do as they're told and transfer the rhythm to the rest of the boat. They are at the 'front' of the powerhouse.

STROKE - The Competitive One
Stroke sets the pace, and once in the boat can develop a SERIOUS anger management problem if there are other crews pulling ahead
